

EXPLANATION

If approved, these funds will enable the Hillsborough County New Hope Program team to replicate Hawaii's successful HOPE Project model, which includes intensive supervision of offenders on probation utilizing swift and certain sanctions for probation violations as well as graduated incentives for compliance.

The HOPE Project was founded by Judge Steven Alm in Hawaii. This program will be replicating that model and a team will oversee the process. The team will be directed by a superior court judge and will include a prosecutor, a public defender, a licensed drug and alcohol counselor, the program coordinator, jail staff, law enforcement, and the probation/parole officer assigned to the docket.

Each participant in the program will be assessed for risk of recidivating and/or substance abuse and will be accepted into the program based on the assessment and team input. This program is designed for probationers who are at risk of violating the terms of probation and has been proven successful in many jurisdictions.


The Department of Corrections will utilize the funds to provide increased probation/parole supervision, to include conducting drug testing and home visits on evenings and weekends.

Keystone Hall will be employing the program coordinator and part time case manager, and will offer substance abuse screening and treatment, mental health treatment, housing and employment assistance, parenting and family counseling, education assistance, pro-social services, case management and data collection.
