

Voters Needing Assistance to Mark a Ballot



Notifying the Moderator that a voter needs assistance

If any voter needs assistance to mark the ballot, that voter has a right to be assisted by a person of their choice, provided that the person chosen is not that voter's employer or union official.

The Moderator will assign an inspector of elections (ballot clerk) to assist the voter in marking the ballot if the voter requests such assistance.



In either instance, the Moderator shall inform the voter of the accessible voting options that are available at the polling place prior to providing assistance.

The person assisting the voter may not instruct the voter regarding the candidate or issue to be voted. The person assisting the voter must mark the ballot as directed by the voter and give no information to any other person as to how the ballot was marked!
