#### **REQUESTED ACTION**

Pursuant to MOP 1102 (L), authorize the New Hampshire Fish & Game Department's, Nongame and Endangered Wildlife Program, to allow Melissa Doperalski and Joshua Megyesy, Wildlife Biologists, to travel over 300 miles round trip in a non-state vehicle to Berkeley Springs, West Virginia to attend the Spotted, Blanding's, and Wood Turtle Conservation Symposium from November 3 to November 6, 2019 upon Governor and Executive Council approval. 50% Federal Funds 50% Other Funds (Nongame).

#### **EXPLANATION**

New Hampshire Fish and Game is requesting permission for Melissa Doperalski and Joshua Megyesy, Wildlife Biologists with the Nongame and Endangered Wildlife Program, to travel to Berkeley Springs, West Virginia via carpool to attend the Spotted, Blanding's, and Wood Turtle Conservation Symposium. Ms. Doperalski and Mr. Megyesy serve as members on regional working groups and steering committees funded through Competitive State Wildlife Grants (CSWG), Regional Conservation Needs Grants (RCN), and other federal grants that have made this symposium possible. They will be presenting at the symposium on the status of state and federal collaboration to conserve rare turtles in New Hampshire.

We are requesting that Melissa Doperalski and Joshua Megyesy be allowed to carpool with our Maine Inland Fisheries and Wildlife State partner instead of flying, 549 miles each way. The total cost for flying would be \$3,409.40 versus \$2,169.40 for driving, resulting in a savings of \$1,240.00. Please see attached Form A-24, cost comparison spreadsheet, and symposium agenda.

#### Spotted, Blanding's & Wood Turtle Conservation Symposium

#### **Purpose of Travel**

The Fish and Game Department (F&G) requests a waiver from MOP Section 1102 (L), which requires travel outside a 300 mile radius by tourist class air passage and authorization for Melissa Doperalski and Josh Megyesy, Wildlife Biologists, to travel via car from F&G Headquarters in Concord, NH to Berkeley Springs, WV in the amount of \$2,169.40 (including staff hour time). West Virginia is hosting the 2019 Spotted, Blanding's, and Wood Turtle Symposium. F&G has worked under Competitive State Wildlife Grant (CSWG) awards for all 3 species, is currently leading a Blanding's turtles CSWG and is participating in a spotted turtle CSWG as well as working on a grant project with the Natural Resources Conservation Service on a Northeast Turtles Project initiative. Mr. Megyesy has been scheduled to present at the conference. Ms. Doperalski and Mr. Megyesy are proposing to carpool with other colleagues from ME, NJ and VT to save on travel costs.
