

The experts will explain landmark research on the federal and New York models and provide useful tips on how to avoid the pitfalls of such reforms while also reducing unnecessary pretrial incarceration.

340B is the second largest prescription drug program administered by the federal government and one of the least understood. Created in 1992 to help vulnerable patients gain better access to medicines at hospitals and clinics, the program has seen monumental growth in recent years. This workshop will discuss the basics of the program, why federal program reform is needed, and recent state actions on the issue, hospital transparency, and legislative proposals states have pursued to address prescription drug affordability and access.

Politically motivated investing strategies, such as Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) investing, put political crusades ahead of investment returns. These strategies threaten retirement fund solvency as millions of dollars in foregone investment returns are left on the table and taxpayers are expected to make up the difference. With this, the Chinese Communist Party is taking advantage of the ESG movement to harm affordable, reliable American energy while building their capability, making it imperative that states consider how their investments affect U.S. national security interests. This workshop will educate on how states can protect national security while keeping the promises made to retirees and taxpayers by identifying and avoiding politically motivated investing strategies.






