#### The DLCC Code of Conduct

The DLCC does not require attendees to show proof of a negative COVID-19 test to gain entry to events. Harassing or offensive behavior will not be tolerated. The DLCC reserves the right to revoke the attendance and badge of any attendee not in compliance with this policy. Persons finding themselves in a situation where they feel their safety is at risk or who become aware of an attendee not in compliance with this policy should immediately find a member of DLCC staff so that the matter can be addressed.
