REQUESTED ACTION

- Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, Bureau of Infectious Disease Control, to accept and expend federal funds in the amount of \$22,495,752 from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to fund the Immunization Program as mandated by the American Rescue Plan effective upon approval by the Fiscal Committee and Governor and Executive Council through June 30, 2023, and further authorize the funds to be allocated as follows. 100% Federal Funds.
- 2. Contingent upon approval of Requested Action #1, pursuant to RSA 124:15, authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services to create twelve (12) new positions for Immunization purposes effective upon approval by the Fiscal Committee and Governor and Executive Council through June 30, 2023. 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

This request is being made to accept additional grant funds available for SFY 2022 and SFY 2023 to administer and support programmatic needs to focus on the work of implementing and expanding New Hampshire's COVID-19 vaccination program under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. The funding will be instrumental in the continuation of statewide plans with key partners for the distribution and administration of the SARS-CoV-2 vaccine(s), as well as providing additional resources to support the on-going Immunization Information System (IIS) implementation, instrumental in overall vaccine accountability for the receipt, distribution and administration of the SARS-Co-V2 vaccine(s).

The NH Immunization Section received notification of three (3) additional COVID-19 supplemental awards, totaling \$31,686,231. The amount of \$26,403,187 is coming to the state via the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARP), P.L. 117-2. The purpose of the award is to support programmatic needs to focus on the work of implementing and expanding New Hampshire's COVID-19 vaccination program.

The funds are to be budgeted as follows:

Class 018 The funds will be used to pay overtime expenses for staff engaged in COVID-19 vaccination response efforts including operations and call center.

Class 020

The funds will be used to pay for current expense item such as vaccine shipping supplies (containers, dry ice, postage), office supplies for staff, printing and copying.

Class 037	The funds will be used to pay for computer hardware for new staff hired to perform COVID-19 vaccination response activities and to replace 10 old computers of existing staff.
Class 038	The funds will be used to pay for computer software required to read/edit NHIIS HL7 messages during onboarding of COVID-19 Vaccine providers and develop/edit e-learning training modules.
Class 041	The funds will be used to pay for audit fund set aside.
Class 042	The funds will be used to pay for post-retirement expense.
Class 059	The funds will be used to pay for 12 new full time temporary positions which include:

Program Specialist III: This Health Communication Specialist position is responsible for supporting COVID-19 vaccine communication, education and outreach, as well as health equity efforts. This position will collaborate with internal and external partners to increase vaccine confidence and ensure messaging targets individuals with different levels of health/digital/science literacy.

System Development Specialist III: Five (5) NH JIS Data Quality Specialists positions are responsible for facilitating onboarding of over 400 NH vaccine providers who are establishing an interface with NHIIS for purposes of electronic reporting of vaccine administration and inventory. These positions will be responsible for assisting providers with data entry into the IIS, manually reviewing data reported via electronic interface for quality and responding to Help Desk requests.

Program Specialist IV: This Grant Coordinator positon is responsible for supporting the coordination of NH Immunization Section public health response grants and cooperative agreements as the section has grown from managing 1 core award at approximately \$2.5 million to now having oversight of multiple COVID Supplemental awards totaling over \$50 million. This position will assist in the development of budgets and preparation of periodic statistical and narrative reports on programs for Federal reporting.

System Development Specialist IV: Five (5) NH IIS Onboarding Specialists positions are responsible for facilitating onboarding of over 400 NH vaccine providers who are establishing an interface with NHIIS for purposes of electronic reporting of vaccine administration and inventory. Currently vaccine providers have to double document vaccine information in order to share it with NH and other providers. Once these interfaces are created, that burden will no longer be required. These positions will support provider implementation of this interface (HL7 two-way messaging) and provide technical assistance during iterative cycles of testing the interoperability of connections between provider and the NH IIS.

Class 060 The funds will be used to pay for benefits associated with the 12 positions above.

Class 070 The funds will be used to pay for in-state travel to perform sub-recipient monitoring, required site visits of vaccine providers and in-person technical assistance.

The funds will be used to pay for contracts with multiple vendors for the purpose of implementing data system enhancements required to support COVID-19 vaccination response effort, utilizing technology to onboard and support COVID-19 Vaccine Providers, increasing vaccine access and uptake, developing/disseminating vaccine education/communications campaigns and providing temporary staffing.

In response to the anticipated two-part question, "Can these funds be used to offset General Funds?" and "What is the compelling reason for not offsetting General Funds?" the Division offers the following information: These funds may not be used to offset General Funds as they are specifically granted to the State for the purpose of providing the services described above.

The following information is provided in accordance with the comptroller's instructional memorandum dated September 21, 1981:

- 1. List of personnel involved: 12 new positions will be created utilizing this funding including; Grant Coordinator, Health Communications Specialist, 5 NH IIS Data Quality Analyst and 5 NH IIS Onboarding Specialist
- 2. Nature, Need, and Duration: Creation of these positions will support the COVID-19 response by increasing the state's capacity to implement effective immunization programs to prevent the occurrence of deadly infectious diseases, including COVID-19. These positons support critical immunization program functions related to ensuring: program oversight, quality assurance, communication with stakeholders, sub-recipient monitoring, compliance with Federal requirements and reporting, onboarding and technical assistance of information and data systems for COVID health care providers, increasing vaccination rates especially among populations disproportionately affected by COVID-19 and promoting campaigns to address vaccine hesitancy and promote vaccine confidence. The need for these positions to be filled is urgent, especially in light of COVID response team demobilization. The duration for these positions will be 36 months, with the exception of three NH IIS Data Quality Analysts and three NH IIS Onboarding Specialists who will have a duration of 30 months.
- 3. Relationship to existing agency programs: This new funding will support the evolving needs of the pandemic response.
- 4. Has a similar program been requested of the legislature and denied? No
- 5. Why wasn't funding included in the agency's budget request? At the time of budget submission it was not known that this ARPA COVID-19 funding would be available.
- 6. Can portions of the grant funds be utilized? All grant dollars are being used for this request.
- 7. Estimate the funds required to continue this position(s): The positions necessary for this work will not be permanent.

These funds will not change the program eligibility levels. No new program will be established with the acceptance of these funds.

Area served: Statewide

Source of Funds: 100% Federal Funds from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The notice of three supplemental funds awarded were received March 29, 2021, March 31, 2021 and May 5, 2021. They were not added to the operating budget because these are new funds recently granted to the State to assist in the public health Coronavirus response and were not anticipated at the time the budget was developed.

If Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support the program expenditures.
