Concurrent Session A – Roosevelt Room: The Rising Cost of Energy & Solutions for the Granite State

Concurrent Session C – Coolidge Room: Permanent Reauthorization of Expanded Medicaid: Why Employers Care

The New Hampshire Legislature enacted expanded Medicaid a decade ago, opening up healthcare to tens of thousands of residents. Employers supported the initiative, understanding the benefits of a healthy workforce and the reality that costs to provide services to the uninsured often cause higher health insurance costs. The time has come to reauthorize the state's participation in this program, and it's expected to be a top issue in the 2023 legislative session.
