Requested Action


Pursuant to RSA 106-B:18, authorize the Department of Safety, Division of State Police, to restore 54 hours of sick leave to Trooper Amanda L. Johnson, who suffered a line of duty injury and was unable to perform her normal or routine duties from January 28, 2014 through February 3, 2014.

Explanation

Trooper Johnson answered a call for assistance from the Plymouth Police Department for a brawl in progress. Trooper Johnson was forced to place a combative subject under arrest and in the process injured her right wrist. Following the arrest, Trooper Johnson was transported to Spear Memorial Hospital where she was treated and placed on sick leave to recover from her injury. As a result, the Trooper was unable to work her normal shifts.

I have determined that Trooper Amanda Johnson suffered a line of duty injury and was unable to perform her duties for the period of January 28, 2014 through February 3, 2014, resulting in the use of her sick leave. Trooper Amanda L. Johnson's convalescent time required the use of 54 hours of sick leave that we are seeking authorization to restore to her.

TITLE VII SHERIFFS, CONSTABLES, AND POLICE OFFICERS

CHAPTER 106-B THE STATE POLICE

Section 106-B:18

106-B:18 Line of Duty Injury. – Any injury, which is due to a hostile or overt act or an act caused by another during the performance of duties which are considered dangerous in nature, received by any state police employee while on assignment, patrol, or duty that requires that the employee be hospitalized or to the extent that the employee is unable to perform normal or routine duties shall not be charged against earned sick leave or annual leave, and during such time the employee shall remain on the payroll. The commissioner of safety shall make the final determination as to whether the injury received is in line of duty and due to a hostile or overt act or an act caused by another during the performance of duties which are considered dangerous in nature, and the commissioner's decision is final, subject to approval of governor and council.
