REQUESTED ACTION

1. Pursuant to the provisions of RSA 14:30-a, VI, Additional Revenues, authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, Bureau of Population Health and Community Services, Maternal and Child Health Section to accept and expend federal funds in the amount of \$8,113 from the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) to fund the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program, effective date of approval by the Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council, through June 30, 2017 and further authorize the funds to be allocated as follows. 100% Federal Funds.

2. Pursuant to the provisions of NH RSA 124:15, Positions Restricted, and subject to the approval of item 1 above, authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, to establish one Full Time position at the following level: Systems Development Specialist III utilizing funds from the Health Resources and Services Administration Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting grant effective upon date of approval by the Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council, through June 30, 2017. The attached letter from Division of Personnel approved the establishment of this position.

EXPLANATION

The Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program is a federally-funded initiative that uses evidence-based, voluntary home visiting services that are proven to be effective, in communities across New Hampshire. The purpose of the grant is to promote healthy childhood growth and development, strong parent-child relationships and safe, secure family environments amongst New Hampshire's most vulnerable families. These are protective factors which have been shown to increase health outcomes for parents and children, school readiness and achievement, family economic self-sufficiency, and coordination of community resources and supports. Home visits have also been shown to reduce child abuse and neglect, as well as domestic violence. Eligibility is determined by factors such as low income, a history of child abuse or neglect, a history of substance abuse, first time parenthood and young (<21) parents.

A previous Fiscal item (FIS17-002) was presented to the Fiscal committee on February 17, 2017. At that time Fiscal Committee requested the Division seek input from the Department of Information Technology whether or not this particular position should be located in the Information Technology (IT) organization. The Division submitted the positions supplemental job description to the

Commissioner of the Department of Information Technology for review. The Commissioner of the Department of Information Technology has concluded, at this time, prior to a planned transition process for DHHS IT resources, that he saw no reason to locate this new position in DoIT. Therefore, the Division of Public Health requests to move forward with the creation of this Full-time System Development Specialist in the Home Visiting program. A copy of the letter from the Commissioner of the Department of Information Technology is attached.

This Fiscal action accepts funds into the Home Visiting Formula grant (AU 5896000) and will allow for continuous quality improvement activities, data management and professional development, which will enable home visitors to show improvement in all of MIECHV's priority areas. It will also enable certification in *Healthy Families America*, the evidence based home visiting curriculum which MIECHV funded agencies utilize. Currently funded agencies will also be enabled by this fiscal to increase their capacity to serve families. And lastly, this fiscal will allow for the DPHS Home Visiting program and the web based data reporting/collection system contractor to improve customer service to home visiting agencies in the community and revise the software to align with new federal reporting requirements.

When the MIECHV program was initially funded through the Federal Health Resources and Services Administration, DPHS anticipated 12 month award. However, MIECHV functions on multiple year awards that coincide and overlap with one another. Because the grant years overlap dates of services, the oldest grant year is spent first. The slower than expected start up combined with a multi-year overlapping award led to challenges with determining the accurate appropriation within each state fiscal year. With the acceptance of this latest fiscal item, the MIECHV program will have all the funds needed to maintain the program and contract out based on the plan determined with the Health Resources and Services Administration.

Funds are budgeted for Temp full time (class 059) if approved in item 2, to create a Systems Development Specialist III (Home Visiting Data Specialist). This staff member will develop expertise in the home visiting data system, *Efforts to Outcomes*, managing its system configuration and reporting specifications of the home visiting program. The position will also support the end users (home visiting agencies, evaluation contractors and other MIECHV staff) in training, malfunction resolution, configuration, data analysis and interpretation and data reporting activities required by the HRSA grant.

Funds are budgeted for Benefits (Class 060) to fund required benefits for the position being created in Class 059.

The following information is provided in accordance with the Comptroller's instructional memorandum dated September 21, 1981:

- 2) Nature, need and duration:

The Systems Development Specialist III will be responsible for oversight and the implementation of the data component of the MIECHV program. The activities will improve the quality of the current and future home visiting related endeavors within the Division of Public Health Services and the Department of Health and Human Services as a whole.

Without these funds and the ensuing activities, the state will not be able to administer the data collection responsibilities of the HRSA grant.

3) Relationship to existing agency programs:

The Systems Development Specialist III will be part of the Maternal, Infant, Early Childhood Home Visiting Program in the Maternal and Child Health Section, Bureau of Population Health and Community Services, part of the Division of Public Health Services in the Department of Health and Human Services.

4) Has similar program been requested of the Legislature and denied?

5) Why wasn't funding included in the agency's budget request?

These funds were awarded April 29, 2016. It was not known that these funds would be available at the time the agency established its SFY 2016-2017 biennial budget.

6) Can portions of the grant funds be utilized for other purposes?

Federal funds allocated to the state cannot be used for other purposes.

7) Estimate the funds required to continue this position:

In response to the anticipated two-part question, "Can these funds be used to offset General Funds?" and "What is the compelling reason for not offsetting General Funds?" the Division offers the following information: These funds may not be used to offset General Funds as they are specifically granted to the State for the purpose of providing the services described above.

These funds will not change the program eligibility levels.

Area served: Statewide

Source of funds: These are 100% Federal funds from the Health Resources and Services Administration., Attached are the Division of Personnel authorization, Department of Information Technology letter, the Notice of Grant Award and Award History. Notice of these funds was received on April 29, 2016. They were not added to the current operating budget because it was not known when and if HRSA would award additional funds. When they did, the new grant period overlapped the existing grant period resulting in new funds that were not anticipated at the time the budget was developed.
