REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Governor's Office for Emergency Relief and Recovery (GOFERR) to enter into a sole source amendment to an existing sub award (or grant) agreement with New Hampshire Housing Finance Authority (Vender Code 174411), 32 Constitution Drive, Bedford, NH. 03110, to provide emergency rental assistance and housing stability services to eligible New Hampshire households that have lost income or experienced other financial hardship because of the COVID-19 pandemic by increasing the price limitation by \$40,000,000 from \$80,000,000 to \$120,000,000 and extending the completion date from March 31, 2022 to December 31, 2022 effective upon Governor and Council approval through December 31, 2022. This is an allowable use under the Emergency Rental Assistance fund established by Title V, Subtitle A, Section 501(a) Division N of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, Pub. L. No. 116-260 (Dec. 27, 2020) (ERA1). 100% Federal Funds.

Funds are available in Fiscal Years 2022 and 2023 as follows, with the authority to adjust encumbrances between fiscal years within the price limitation through the Budget Office, if needed and justified:

EXPLANATION

On March 11, 2021, the Governor authorized allocation of \$80,300,000 from the federal funds made available pursuant to ERA1. Since March 15, 2021, the New Hampshire Emergency Rental Assistance Program has been providing financial assistance and housing stability services to eligible that have lost income or experienced other financial hardship because of COVID-19, including the payment of (i) rent; (ii) rental arrears; (iii) utilities and home energy costs; (iv) utilities and home energy cost arrears; and (v)

other expenses related to housing incurred due, directly or indirectly, to COVID-19, as defined by United States Department of Treasury.

Pursuant to a sole source subaward agreement, New Hampshire Housing Finance Authority is responsible for administration of the New Hampshire Emergency Rental Assistance Program (NHERAP), in collaboration with the GOFERR.

On March 11, 2021, Section 3201(h) of the H.R. 1319 extended the availability of Emergency Rental Assistance Funds under Section 501(e) of subtitle A of the Title V of Division N of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (ERA1) from December 31, 2021 to September 30, 2022. This amendment will allow NH Housing to continue to use ERA1 funds to provide financial assistance to New Hampshire households throughout the life of the federal program.

The overall budget includes a cap on indirect administrative costs of 7.5% for the service agencies and 1% for New Hampshire Housing Finance Authority (NHHFA) and the agreement will have a termination date of December 31, 2022.

In the event that Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program.

NEW HAMPSHIRE EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Grant Agreement Amendment #1

The State of New Hampshire Governor's Office for Emergency Relief and Recovery (GOFERR) and the New Hampshire Housing Finance Authority (NHHFA or Grantee) hereby mutually agree to amend the Grant Agreement previously entered into to increase the Price Limitation and extend the Completion Date to use grant funds from the Emergency Rental Assistance fund established by Title V, Subtitle A, Section 501(a) Division N of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, Pub. L. No. 116-260 (Dec. 27, 2020) (hereinafter referred to as "Section 501") provided by and subject to the terms of the award from the United States Department of Treasury, CFDA number 21.023, FAIN Nos. ERA0012 and ERA0435, for which Grantee has not received payment or reimbursement from any other source, as defined in the original Grant Agreement.

Wherefore the Grant Agreement is amended as follows:

- 1. Amend Paragraph 1.7 of the Grant Agreement (Page 1) by extending the Completion Date from March 31, 2022 to December 31, 2022.
- 2. Amend Section 1.8 of the Grant Agreement (Page 1) by increasing the Price Limitation by \$40,000,000.00 from \$80,000,000.00 to \$120,000,000.00.
- 3. Amend all references to "March 31, 2022" in the Grant Agreement, striking that date and inserting "December 31, 2022."
- 4. Amend Paragraph 7 of the Grant Agreement (Page 8) by striking "December 31, 2021" and inserting "September 30, 2022."
- 5. Amend Paragraph 27 of the Grant Agreement (Page 12) by striking "January 31, 2022" and inserting "January 31, 2023" and striking "December 31, 2021" and inserting "December 31, 2022."
- 6. All other provisions of the Grant Agreement, executed on March 9, 2021 shall remain in full force and effect.

EXPLANATION

The Governor has authorized the allocation of \$80,300,000.00 from federal funds made available pursuant to Section 501(a) of Division N of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, Pub. L. No. 116-260 (Dec. 27, 2020) Emergency Rental Assistance Fund. The New Hampshire Rental Assistance Program will provide financial assistance and housing stability services to eligible households that have lost income or experienced other financial hardship because of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) outbreak, including the payment of (i) rent; (ii) rental arrears; (iii) utilities and home energy costs; (iv) utilities and home energy costs arrears; and (v) other expenses related to housing incurred due, directly or indirectly, to COVID-19, as defined by United States Department of Treasury. The grant funds must be used for allowable expenses incurred by eligible households between April 1, 2020 and December 31, 2021 unless an extension is allowed and granted by GOFERR in writing.

The New Hampshire Emergency Rental Assistance Program (NHERAP) will be administered by New Hampshire Housing Finance Authority (NHHFA), in collaboration with GOFERR. NHHFA will work with the five regional Community Action Partnerships (CAPs) that will accept and process applications and payments for the program.

NHERAP funds can cover current and past due rent, as well as utility and home energy costs and other allowable expenses for eligible households. This assistance is available retroactive to April 1, 2020 through the date of application, and the applicant may also receive assistance for these same expenses going forward. Households may receive assistance for a total of 12 months, or a total of 15 months as deemed necessary for housing stability.

The sub-grantees selected by NHHFA shall use the funding only to address New Hampshire Emergency Rental Assistance Program allowable costs incurred between April 1, 2020 and December 31, 2021, as allowed under the grant agreement.

2. SCOPE OF ALLOWABLE USE OF FUNDS: In exchange for grant funds from the State under the Emergency Rental Assistance fund established by Title V, Subtitle A, Section 501(a) Division N of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, Pub. L. No. 116-260 (Dec. 27, 2020) (hereinafter referred to as "Section 501") provided by and subject to the terms of the award from the United States Department of Treasury, CFDA number 21.023, FAIN Nos. ERA0012 and ERA0435, to the State of New Hampshire, acting through the Agency identified in Paragraph 1.1 (hereinafter referred to as "GOFERR"), the Grantee identified in Paragraph 1.3 (hereinafter referred to as "the Grantee"), agrees and covenants that the funds we be used solely for an allowable purpose as defined in H.R. 133, Section 501(c) Division N, more specifical defined as NH Emergency Rental Assistance Program, to New Hampshire residents to provide financial

assistance and housing stability services to eligible households that have lost income or experienced other financial hardship because of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) outbreak, including the payment of (i) rent; (ii) rental arrears; (iii) utilities and home energy costs; (iv) utilities and home energy costs arrears;

and (v) other expenses related to housing incurred due, directly or indirectly, to COVID-19, as defined by

United States Department of Treasury. The grant funds must be used for allowable expenses incurred by eligible households between March 13, 2020 and December 31, 2021 unless an extension is allowed and granted by GOFERR in writing.

The allowable purposes and use of funds are more specifically described in EXHIBIT A.

3. EFFECTIVE DATE: COMPLETION OF GRANT.

This Agreement, is entered into and authorized by Governor Sununu under his emergency authority pursuant to RSA 4:45 and RSA 21-P and all obligations of the parties hereunder, shall become effective on the date of approval of this Agreement by the GOFERR in paragraph 1.12 ("the effective date"). Except as otherwise specifically provided herein, this Grant, including all activities and reports required by this Agreement, shall be completed in their entirety prior to March 31, 2022.

4. GRANT AMOUNT: LIMITATION ON AMOUNT: VOUCHERS: PAYMENT.

The Grant Amount is identified in paragraph 1.8 and is more particularly described in EXHIBIT B, attached hereto. The manner of, and schedule of payment shall be as set forth in EXHIBIT B.

In accordance with the provisions set forth in EXHIBIT B, and in consideration of the satisfactory performance of the Grant, as determined by the GOFERR, the GOFERR shall pay the Grantee the Grant Amount.

The payment by the GOFERR of the Grant amount shall be the only, and the complete payment to the Grantee for all expenses, of whatever nature, incurred by the Grantee and claimed as allowable expenses under this Agreement. To the extent that the Grant amount does not cover all of the Grantee's allowable expenses, nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to limit the Grantee's ability to pursue other COVID-19 relief that may be available. Under this Agreement, however, the GOFERR shall have no liabilities to the Grantee other than the Grant Amount.

Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, and notwithstanding unexpected circumstances, in no event shall the total of all payments authorized, or actually made, hereunder exceed the Grant limitation set forth in Paragraph 1.8 of these general provisions.

5. COMPLIANCE BY GRANTEE WITH LAWS AND REGULATIONS. In connection with the performance of the Grant, the Grantee shall comply with all statutes, laws, regulations, and orders of federal, State, county, or municipal authorities which shall impose any obligations or duty upon the Grantee, including the acquisition of any and all necessary permits.

6. RECORDS AND ACCOUNTS.

Between the Effective Date and the date five (5) years after the Completion Date the Grantee shall keep detailed accounts of all expenses incurred in connection with the Grant, including, but not limited to, costs of administration, transportation, insurance, telephone calls, and clerical materials and services. Such accounts shall be supported by receipts, invoices, bills and other similar documents.

Between the Effective Date and the date five (5) years after the Completion Date, at any time during the

initial Date 1/2/ Page 2 of 24 Grantee's normal business hours, and as often as the GOFERR, the U.S. Department of Treasury or OMB shall demand, the Grantee shall make available to the GOFERR, the U.S. Department of Treasury or OMB all records pertaining to matters covered by this Agreement. The Grantee shall permit the GOFERR, the U.S. Department of Treasury or OMB to audit, examine, and reproduce such records, and to make audits of all contracts, invoices, materials, payrolls, personnel records, data, and other information relating to all matters covered by this Agreement. As used in this paragraph, "Grantee" includes all persons, natural or fictional, affiliated with, controlled by, or under common ownership with, the entity identified as the Grantee in Paragraph 1.3 of these provisions

7. PERSONNEL.

The Grantee shall, at its own expense, provide all personnel necessary to perform the Grant. The Grantee warrants that all personnel engaged in the Grant shall be qualified to perform such Grant, and shall be properly licensed and authorized to perform such Grant under all applicable laws. Grantee shall comply with all state and federal personnel and labor laws applicable to its employees.

The Grant Officer shall be the representative of the State hereunder. In the event of any dispute hereunder, the interpretation of this Agreement by the Grant Officer, and his/her decision on any dispute, shall be final.

8. CONDITIONAL NATURE OF AGREEMENT. Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, all obligations of the GOFERR hereunder, including, without limitation, the continuance of payments hereunder, are contingent upon the availability or continued appropriation of funds, and in no event shall the GOFERR be liable for any payments hereunder in excess of such available or appropriated funds. In the event of a reduction or termination of those funds, the GOFERR shall have the right to withhold payment until such funds become available, if ever, and shall have the right to terminate this Agreement immediately upon giving the Grantee notice of such termination.

9. EVENT OF DEFAULT: REMEDIES.

Any one or more of the following acts or omissions of the Grantee shall constitute an event of default hereunder (hereinafter referred to as "Events of Default"):

Failure to perform the Grant satisfactorily or on schedule;

Failure to submit any report required hereunder;

Failure to maintain, or permit access to, the records required hereunder; or

Failure to perform any of the other covenants and conditions of this Agreement.

Upon the occurrence of any Event of Default, the GOFERR may take any one, or more, or all, of the following actions:

Give the Grantee a written notice specifying the Event of Default and requiring it to be remedied within, in the absence of a greater or lesser specification of time, thirty (30) days from the date of the notice; and if the Event of Default is not timely remedied, terminate this Agreement, effective two (2) days after giving the Grantee notice of termination; and

Give the Grantee a written notice specifying the Event of Default and suspending all payments to be made

under this Agreement and ordering that the portion of the Grant Amount which would otherwise accrue to the Grantee during the period from the date of such notice until such time as the GOFERR determines that the Grantee has cured the Event of Default shall never be paid to the Grantee;

Set off against any other obligation the GOFERR may owe to the Grantee any damages the GOFERR suffers by reason of any Event of Default;

Recoup from the Grantee, including by withholding any other payment of funds that becomes due to Grantee from the GOFERR, any payments under this Agreement that have been used in a manner contrary to the terms of this Agreement or the Emergency Rental Assistance fund established by Title V, Subtitle A, Section 501(a) Division N of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, Pub. L. No. 116-260 (Dec. 27, 2020); and/or

Treat the Agreement as breached and pursue any of its remedies at law or in equity, or both.

10. TERMINATION.

In the event of any early termination of this Agreement for any reason other than the completion of the Grant, the Grantee shall deliver to the Grant Officer, not later than fifteen (15) days after the date of termination, a report (hereinafter referred to as the "Termination Report") describing in detail all Grant expenses reimbursed, and the Grant Amount earned, to and including the date of termination.

In the event of Termination under paragraph 9 of these general provisions, the approval of such a Termination Report by the GOFERR shall entitle the Grantee to retain the portion of the Grant amount earned up to and including the date of termination.

The approval of such a Termination Report by the GOFERR shall in no event relieve the Grantee from any and all liability for damages sustained or incurred by the GOFERR as a result of the Grantee's breach of its obligations hereunder.

Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, either the GOFERR or, except where notice default has been given to the Grantee hereunder, the Grantee, may terminate this Agreement without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice.

- 11. CONFLICT OF INTEREST. No officer, member or employee of the Grantee, and no representative, officer or employee of the State of New Hampshire or of the governing body of the locality or localities in which the Grant is to be performed, who exercises any functions or responsibilities in the review or approval of the undertaking or carrying out of such Grant, shall participate in any decision relating to this Agreement which affects his or her personal interest or the interest of any corporation, partnership, or association in which he or she is directly or indirectly interested, nor shall he or she have any personal or pecuniary interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement or the proceeds thereof.
- 12. GRANTEE'S RELATION TO THE GOFERR. In the performance of this Agreement the Grantee, its employees, and any subcontractor or subgrantee of the Grantee are in all respects independent contractors.

Neither the Grantee nor any of its officers, employees, agents, members, subcontractors or subgrantees, shall have authority to bind the GOFERR nor are they entitled to any of the benefits, workers' compensation or emoluments provided by the GOFERR to its employees.

- 13. ASSIGNMENT AND SUBCONTRACTS. The Grantee shall not assign, or otherwise transfer any interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the GOFERR.
- 14. INDEMNIFICATION. The Grantee shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the GOFERR, its officers and employees, from and against any and all losses suffered by the GOFERR, its officers and employees, and any and all claims, liabilities or penalties asserted against the GOFERR, its officers and employees, by or on behalf of any person, on account of, based on, resulting from, arising out of (or which may be claimed to arise out of) the acts or omissions of the Grantee or subcontractor, or subgrantee or other agent of the Grantee. Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing herein contained shall be deemed to constitute a waiver of the sovereign immunity of the State or the GOFERR, which immunity is hereby reserved to the GOFERR. This covenant shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

15. INSURANCE AND BOND.

The Grantee shall, at its own expense, obtain and maintain in force, the following insurance: Statutory workers' compensation and employees liability insurance for all employees engaged in the performance of the Grant, and

Comprehensive public liability insurance against all claims of bodily injuries, death or property damage, in amounts not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate for bodily injury or death in any one incident, and \$500,000 for property damage in any one incident; and

The policies shall be the standard form employed in the State of New Hampshire, issued by underwriters acceptable to the GOFERR, and authorized to do business in the State of New Hampshire.

- 16. WAIVER OF BREACH. No failure by the GOFERR to enforce any provisions hereof after any Event of Default shall be deemed a waiver of its rights with regard to that Event, or any subsequent Event. No express waiver of any Event of Default shall be deemed a waiver of any provisions hereof. No such failure of waiver shall be deemed a waiver of the right of the GOFERR to enforce each and all of the provisions hereof upon any further or other default on the part of the Grantee.
- 17. NOTICE. Any notice by a party hereto to the other party shall be deemed to have been duly delivered or given at the time of mailing by certified mail, postage prepaid, by United States Mail, addressed to the parties at the addresses first above given.

18. AMENDMENT.

This Agreement may be amended, waived or discharged only by an instrument in writing signed by the parties hereto and only after approval of such amendment, waiver or discharge by the Governor under his emergency authority pursuant to RSA 4:45 and RSA 21-P if required, or the Governor and Council of the

State of New Hampshire if required, or by the signing State Agency.

- 19. CONSTRUCTION OF AGREEMENT AND TERMS. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the law of the State of New Hampshire, and is binding upon and inures to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assignees. The captions are used only as a matter of convenience, and are not to be considered a part of this Agreement or to be used in determining the intent of the parties hereto.
- 20. THIRD PARTIES. The parties hereto do not intend to benefit any third parties and this Agreement shall not be construed to confer any such benefit.
- 21. ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement, which may be executed in a number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the parties, and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings relating hereto.
- 22. SPECIAL PROVISIONS. The additional provisions set forth in EXHIBIT C hereto are incorporated as part of this Agreement.

Scope of Allowable Uses of New Hampshire Emergency Rental Assistance Program Grant

- 1. The New Hampshire Housing Finance Authority, Grantee, will administer the NH Emergency Rental Assistance (NHERA) Program established by the Governor's Office for Emergency Relief and funded through the Emergency Rental Assistance Fund, Section 501. Grantee agrees and covenants that the funds will be used solely for an allowable purpose as defined in in the Emergency Rental Assistance fund established by Title V, Subtitle A, Section 501(a) Division N of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, Pub. L. No. 116-260 (Dec. 27, 2020), for which Grantee has not received payment or reimbursement from any other source.
- 2. It is understood that the GOFERR will make sufficient funds available for emergency rental relief and utility relief from the federal allocation for the program. The administrative costs for the Grantee, not to exceed 8.5%, is included in the total for the program. This cap on administrative costs is a total administrative cost cap that includes 1% reserved for Grantee and 7.5% reserved for Grantee's subawardees. This administrative cost maximum rate will be reviewed after three months to determine if it remains appropriate.
- 3. Services to Be Provided: In coordination with GOFERR, Grantee will be responsible for the planning and design of the emergency housing assistance program to provide financial assistance and housing stability services to eligible New Hampshire residents in rental property that have lost income or experienced other financial hardship because of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) outbreak, including assistance for the payment of (i) rent; (ii) rental arrears; (iii) utilities and home energy costs; (iv) utilities and home energy costs arrears; and (v) other expenses related to housing incurred due, directly or indirectly, to COVID-19, as defined by United States Department of Treasury that have not been, and are not anticipated to be, reimbursed from other federal, state or local rental assistance or COVID-19 relief from any other source.
- 3.1 Grantee understands that the GOFERR will make the final decision on approval of the program design.
- 3.2 Grantee understands that the program design must be in compliance with all federal requirements, and may be subject to change as the Department of the Treasury revises and updates guidance.
- 3.3 In coordination with GOFERR, Grantee will be responsible for state-wide administration of the NHERA Program including but not limited to coordinating, contracting with and monitoring the work of sub-grantees, agencies and/or service providers to efficiently and effectively accomplish the following; 1) Design and implementation of an outreach, application, and intake process; 2) Determination and documentation of eligibility for program assistance; 3) Determination and documentation of the amount and types of assistance to be provided per tenant household; 4) Determination and documentation of the payee and any related requirements; 5) Avoiding duplication of assistance from all sources of state and federal rental assistance; 6) Recordkeeping, reporting and establishing data privacy and security requirements; and 7) Other activities as needed to fully and fairly administer the program.
- 4. To the extent that Grantee is making sub-awards from this award, Grantee shall develop and use a

template for sub-awards that will be subject to review and approval by GOFERR before use to ensure that sub-awards contain adequate provisions that the funds can only be used for allowable costs under Section 501 and compliance with 2 C.F.R. 200.331 – 200.333 requirements. All sub-awards must be reviewed and approved by GOFERR.

5. Reporting:

- 5.1 Grantee will work with the GOFERR to support a comprehensive reporting platform and dashboard on the GOFERR website.
- 5.2 Grantee shall submit bi-weekly reports to the GOFERR grant officer by email or other electronic means subsequently designated by GOFERR to ensure timely program administration and assistance. The bi-weekly reports, the specific elements to be designated by the GOFERR, shall track assistance provided by town and administrative budget expenditures for the prior two-week period.
- 5.3 Grantee shall provide quarterly reports electronically to the GOFERR grant officer by email or other electronic means subsequently designated by GOFERR detailing the uses of grant funds to date as necessary to comply with federal laws, regulations and guidance. Grantee shall include in such reports expenses and costs related to NHERA for which the grant funds have been used, and shall break down the reporting by residential unit location at the town level for assistance provided.
- 6. Record Retention: Between the Effective Date and the date five (5) years after the Completion Date the Grantee shall keep, or require to be kept by sub-recipients, detailed records of all services performed in connection with the Grant including all applications for assistance, supporting documents for recommendations and notices of awards. At any time during the Grantee's normal business hours, and as often as the GOFERR, the U.S. Department of Treasury or OMB shall demand, the Grantee shall make available to the GOFERR, the U.S. Department of Treasury or OMB all records pertaining to matters covered by this Contract. The Grantee shall permit the GOFERR, the U.S. Department of Treasury or OMB to audit, examine, and reproduce such records, and to make audits of all contracts, invoices, materials, payrolls, records of personnel, data, and other information relating to all matters covered by this Grant. As used in this paragraph, "Grantee" includes all persons, natural or fictional, affiliated with, controlled by, or under common ownership with, the entity identified as the Grantee.
- 7. Estimated Timeline: This is an estimate for the majority of the grant distribution. The starting point is March 15, 2021 and assistance may be retroactively applied to arrears accruing on or after April 1, 2020 through the date of application. Except as specifically provided by GOFERR in writing, in no event can assistance distribution extend beyond December 31, 2021.
- 8. Administrative Expenses: Grantee shall provide a proposed budget for administrative expenses, which may include direct costs as allowed by 2 CFR 200, Subpart E, Cost Principles. Grantee may not charge or cover indirect costs not allowed under federal law or applicable rules or federal guidance or the award terms accepted by the State upon receiving payment of these funds from the U.S. Department of Treasury.
- 9. Unique entity identifier and System for Award Management (SAM)—Required. Grantee must (i) Be registered in SAM; (ii) provide a valid unique entity identifier; and (iii) continue to maintain an active SAM registration with current information at all times during which it has an active Federal award or an

application or plan under consideration by a Federal awarding agency. EXHIBIT I and I should be returned completed with the executed Grant Agreement, and must be received completed before any disbursement can be made. This requirement must be passed through to sub-recipients.

- 10. The U.S. Treasury may issue subsequent or further guidance on allowable uses of Emergency Rental Assistance Funds. All such changes shall be considered as incorporated into this Agreement.
- 11. Grantee agrees to establish data privacy and security requirements as required by Section 501(g)(4).
- 12. Statutes and regulations prohibiting discrimination applicable to this Agreement, include, without limitation, the following:
 - i. Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. §§ 2000d et seq.) and Treasury's implementing regulations at 31 C.F.R. Part 22, which prohibit discrimination on the grounds of race, color, or national origin under programs or activities receiving federal financial assistance;
 - ii. The Fair Housing Act, Title VIII-IX of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. § 3601 et seq.), which prohibits discrimination in housing on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, familial status, or disability;
 - iii. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. § 794), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of handicap under any program or activity receiving or benefitting from federal assistance;
 - iv. The Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended (42 U.S.C. §§ 6101 et seq.) and Treasury's implementing regulations at 31 C.F.R. Part 23, which prohibit discrimination on the basis of age in programs or activities receiving federal financial assistance; and

Methods and Conditions of Payment

- 1. Grantee must be registered with the Department of Administrative Services for a State of New Hampshire vendor number (see page 1, para 1.6) in order for a payment to be issued.  Payment will be by check or ACH, depending on the vendor registration.
- 2. Upon execution of this Agreement, GOFERR will advance to Grantee the sum of \$40,000,000.00, which will be used for initial distributions to community action agencies to cover assistance payments and community action agencies' direct costs and for Grantee's direct costs. At any future time during the term of this Agreement, when at least 75% of an advance payment by GOFERR has been allocated, Grantee will notify GOFERR, which will advance an additional \$40,000,000.00 to Grantee or such other amount as GOFERR deems appropriate, subject to available funds.
- 3. Grantee will bill for direct costs related to program marketing and oversight, reporting to GOFERR, additional temporary staff to answer questions of potential program recipients, and community action agencies' initial technology upgrades to support program operations. Grantee reimbursement for these costs will not exceed 1% of program expenditures.
- 4. New Hampshire housing will contract with the state's five community action agencies to provide direct services to NHERAP applicants. This will include receiving and processing applications, making direct payments to landlords and utilities on behalf of clients, related case management services, and required program reporting. The community action agencies will bill to Grantee for their direct costs associated with this work. These costs will be capped at 7.5% of total program expenditures, both individually and in aggregate. This administrative cost maximum rate will be reviewed after three months to determine if it remains appropriate.
- 5. For the purposes of this Grant Agreement, GOFERR has identified the Grantee as a subrecipient in accordance with 2 C.F.R. 200.331. Additionally, this Grant Agreement has been identified as non-R&D, in accordance with 2 C.F.R. 200.87.
- 6. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, Grantee agrees that funding under this agreement may be withheld, in whole or in part, in the event of non-compliance with any Federal or State law, rule or regulation applicable to the services provided, or if the said services or products have not been satisfactorily completed in accordance with the terms and conditions of this agreement.

Special Provisions

1. Paragraph 11 is amended by adding to the end of the paragraph the following: "Notwithstanding the foregoing, Grantee, sub-awardees, or contractors of Grantee may provide assistance to households for which the Grantee, sub-awardees, or contractors of the Grantee, the State or local government is the landlord provided that the Grantee, sub-awardees, and contractors comply with all provisions of the Section 501, the award terms, and guidance issued by Treasury and that no preferences beyond those outlined in Section 501(a) are given to households that reside in such properties owned by the Grantee, sub-awardees, or contractors of Grantee, State or local government."

Paragraphs 12, 14 and 15 are deleted in their entirety because the Grantee is a public instrumentality of the State entity organized as a body corporate and politic under RSA 204-C:2.

Paragraph 20 is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

"20. THIRD PARTIES. The parties hereto do not intend to create contractual benefits to any third parties and this Agreement shall not be construed to confer any such benefit."

- 2. 2 CFR 200 as amended (Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards), other than such provisions as Treasury may determine are inapplicable to Emergency Rental Assistance Fund and subject to such exceptions as may be otherwise provided by Treasury, are considered legally binding and enforceable documents under this contract. The GOFERR reserves the right to use any legal remedy at its disposal including, but not limited to, disallowance of costs or withholding of funds.
- 3. To the extent required to comply with 2 CFR 200, Subpart F Audit Requirements, Grantee shall complete an audit at the end of the Grantee's fiscal year ending after December 31, 2021.

The audit report shall include a schedule of prior year's questioned costs along with a response to the current status of the prior year's questioned costs. Copies of all management letters written as a result of the audit along with the audit report shall be forwarded to GOFERR within one month of the time of receipt by the Grantee accompanied by an action plan, if applicable, for each finding or questioned cost.

- 4. The direct costs charged under this contract shall be determined as allowable under the cost principles detailed in 2 CFR 200 Subpart E Cost Principles.
- 5. Program and financial records pertaining to this contract shall be retained by the Grantee for 5 (five) years from the date of submission of the final expenditure report as stated in 2 CFR 200.333 Retention Requirements for Records.
- 6. The following paragraphs shall be added to the general provisions:
 - "23. RESTRICTION ON ADDITIONAL FUNDING. It is understood and agreed between the parties that no portion of the "Grant" funds may be used for the purpose of obtaining additional Federal funds under any other law of the United States, except if authorized under that law."

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- "24. ASSURANCES/CERTIFICATIONS. The following are attached and signed: Certification Regarding Drug-Free Workplace Requirements; Certification Regarding Lobbying; Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension and Other Responsibility Matters; Certification Regarding the Americans With Disabilities Act Compliance; Certification Regarding Environmental Tobacco Smoke; Assurance of Compliance Nondiscrimination in Federally Assisted Programs; and Certification Regarding the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Compliance."
- "25. COPELAND ANTI-KICKBACK ACT. All contracts in excess of \$2,000.00 for construction or repair using funds under this grant shall include a provision for compliance with Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (18 USC 874) as supplemented in Department of Labor Regulations (29 CFR, Part 3).
