Requested Action

Authorize the Department of Safety, Division of Motor Vehicles to amend Item #90, approved by G&C on August 23, 2017, in the amount of \$33,065.00, increasing the total amount from \$310,577.00 to \$343,642.00, to pay a one-time fee for additional on-line services and per transaction fees to the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators (AAMVA) (VC# 175767-P001) Arlington, Virginia, for the on-line United States Passport Verification Services (USPVS) to interface the Division of Motor Vehicles' VISION system to AAMVANet. Effective upon Governor and Council approval through September 30, 2019. Funding source: 100% Agency Income.

Funds are available in the SFY18/19 operating budget and contingent upon availability and continued appropriations in SFY2020 with the authority to adjust between fiscal years through the Budget Office if needed and justified.

Explanation

This request amends requested action #2 of Item #90 (attached) for an additional one-time fee and transactions to include passport verification services. AAMVA is the only organization that provides motor vehicle related services and on-line services for the US states and jurisdictions. The USPVS Program ensures that U.S. citizens, who apply for a New Hampshire driver license or non-driver identification card and present a US passport as a proof of identification, have a valid and authentic US passport. This request provides the necessary one-time USPVS Program setup fee of \$8,440.00. It also accounts for a per-transaction fee of \$0.09 for each passport verified through the USPVS program, estimated to be 210,000 annually.

The Division of Motor Vehicles has authorization to pay for other on-line services provided by AAMVA, approved as item #90 on August 23, 2017.

Requested Action

- Pursuant to MOP 1200, Membership, Dues and Licenses and RSA 263:91 Commercial Driver License, authorize the Department of Safety, Division of Motor Vehicles to pay annual membership dues for two years to the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators (AAMVA) (VC#-175767-P001) Arlington, Virginia, in an amount not to exceed \$14,000.00. Effective upon Governor and Council approval for the period of October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2019. Funding source: 100% Agency Income.
- Authorize the Department of Safety, Division of Motor Vehicles, to pay fees for two years to the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators (AAMVA) (VC# 175767-P001) Arlington, Virginia, in an amount not to exceed \$296,577.00 for Commercial Driver License Information System (CDLIS) transactions, including Programs & Technology and Network Services, and for National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS) annual service and support. Effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval for the period of October 1, 2017, through September 30, 2019. Funding source: 100% Agency Income (Cost of Collections).

Funds are available in the SFY18/19 operating budget and contingent upon availability and continued appropriations in SFY 2020 with the authority to adjust encumbrances between fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

Explanation

AAMVA is the only association in North America dedicated to providing motor vehicle services, support, communication, access to motor vehicle networks and databases, and guidance to motor vehicle agencies and departments for United States and Canadian jurisdictions. Membership in AAMVA allows motor vehicle agencies to network and interact with each other and key personnel regarding pertinent policies, legal issues, and other topics that are critical to decisions pertaining to legislation and other vital issues. For example, one of AAMVA's vice presidents interfaces with all member jurisdictions on a regular basis to ensure that uniformity and consistency are maintained among jurisdictions dealing with motor vehicle issues, which is

beneficial for the implementation of a new project or process, preventing jurisdictions from duplicating efforts, and for providing members with advance notice of the impacts of potential legislation.

AAMVA provides the State of New Hampshire electronic access to several databases including Social Security On-Line Verification (SSOLV), Problem Driver Pointer System (PDPS), National Driver Register (NDR), National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS), and Commercial Driver License Information System (CDLIS), which is part of the Motor Carrier Safety Improvement Act (MCSIA). The NMVTIS database tracks branded vehicles and is designed to protect consumers from fraud and unsafe vehicles in addition to preventing stolen vehicles from being resold. NMVTIS is also a tool that assists states and law enforcement in deterring and preventing title fraud and other crimes. Fees for NMVTIS are based on the number of currently titled motor vehicles in each member state. The CDLIS database checks on commercial drivers' national records in all jurisdictions and is mandated by federal law. These charges are based on the estimated number of annual New Hampshire commercial driver transactions and inquiries of all types to the CDLIS National Database. Fees for the Programs & Technology and Network Services portion are based on an estimated number of annual transactions, maintenance, and Social Security On-Line Verification (SSOLV) inquiries. The CDLIS fees were originally approved as a perpetual agreement by the Governor and Executive Council on February 28, 1990 as item #146.

In the 75-year history of AAMVA, no jurisdiction member has formally dropped its membership. Should that happen, the matter would go before the AAMVA Board of Directors to establish a new policy on how a non-member jurisdiction should be treated with regard to access to association networks and the jurisdictional and federal databases throughout the United States and Canada that the jurisdiction previously had access to through its membership in AAMVA. The AAMVA Board would establish a new pricing policy for non-member access to networks and databases to offset the usage costs which had previously been covered by membership dues. It is possible that access to networks and databases would be withdrawn completely.

- 1. How long has this organization been in existence and how long has this agency been a member of this organization?*
AAMVA was founded 1933. NH has been a member for many years.
- 2. Is there any other organization which provides the same or similar benefits which your agency belongs to?*
No.
- 3. How many other states belong to this organization and is your agency the sole New Hampshire state agency that is a member?* The 50 US States and DC. The DMV is the only NH State agency belonging to AAMVA.
- 4. How is the dues structure established? (Standard fee for all states, based on population, based on other criteria, etc.)*
Based on population, network and database access.
- 5. What benefit does the state receive from participating in this membership?* AAMVA provides the State of New Hampshire electronic access to several databases including Social Security On-Line Verification (SSOLV), Problem Driver Pointer System (PDPS), National Driver Register, (NDR), National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS) and most important, Commercial Driver License Information System (CDLIS), which is part of the Motor Carrier Safety Improvement Act (MCSIA). The CDLIS database checks on commercial drivers' national records in all jurisdictions. This program is mandated by federal law and maintained through AAMVA. If AAMVA decides to withdraw access to CDLIS to non-members, federal funds to the State of New Hampshire would be at risk.
- 6. Are training or educational/ research materials included in the membership? If so, is the cost included? Explain in detail.* AAMVA allows all member motor vehicle agencies to network and communicate with each other on a variety of topics that are critical to decisions pertaining to legislation and other vital issues.
- 7. Is the membership required to receive any federal grants or required in order to receive or participate in licensing or certification exams? Explain.* Yes. See question 5.
- 8. Is there any travel included with this membership fee? Explain in detail any travel to include the number of employees involved, the number of trips, destination if known and purposes of membership supported trips.* AAMVA provides travel assistance grants for DMV employee(s) to attend the regional and international AAMVA conferences including rooms, meals, air fares as applicable, and registration fees.

DUES

Dues are calculated using a tiered system based on the latest published number of registered vehicles in each jurisdiction. Tiers are as follows:

1.00 - 1.99 Million	\$5,581

The Jurisdiction Dues increase 5% each year in FY2019, 2020 & 2021, resulting in a total 15% increase at the end of 3 years. The base year for the computation of the increase will be FY2018 and we are using the FY2018 vehicle registration counts published by the Department of Transportation in January, 2017.

AAMVA is the secretariat for the joint Driver License Compact Commission (DLCC) and the Nonresident Violator's Compact (NRVC) Executive Board. AAMVA collects Dues from the Jurisdictions in order to fund the Secretariat duties. The annual Dues amounts are DLCC= \$600 and NRVC= \$350. If a Member belongs to both Compacts, they incur \$750 in annual Dues.
