

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EXPLANATION

The purpose of this request is to budget penalties previously collected and carried forward from FY19. Civil Money Penalties (CMP) are fines nursing homes must pay The Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) by law when they are noncompliant with certain regulations and there are serious concerns about the safety and quality of care they provide. CMP funds collected by a state must be applied to the protection of the health or property of residents of nursing facilities. This includes, but is not limited to, costs associated with the relocation of residents to other facilities in the event of a facility closure, maintenance of operation of a facility pending correction of deficiencies or closure, and reimbursement of residents for personal funds or property lost at a facility as a result of actions by the facility or by individuals used by the facility to provide services to residents. The Civil Monetary Penalties fund for the State of NH has been used to improve residents' quality of life by equipping nursing home staff, administrators and stakeholders with technical tools and assistance to enhance resident care. Programs such as Music & Memory have been training long-term care providers to bring music into the lives of the elderly or infirm through digital music, vastly improving quality of life.

Funds will be used for:

Class 041 Audit fund set aside expense.

Class 102 These efforts will address New Hampshire's needs and opportunities in alignment

with Departmental goals. Funds will be used to administer various programs in Nursing Facilities throughout the state. The facilities will receive a toolkit that utilizes elements of the Quality Assurance Performance Improvement process to

fully integrate the programs into their operations, to aid in sustainability.

Area served: Statewide.

Source of Funds: 100% Federal from the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

In the event that federal funds become no longer available, general funds will not be requested to support the program expenditures.
