#### **Requested Action**

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the Department of Safety (DOS), Division of State Police, to accept and expend an additional \$167,906.00 in federal pass-through funds from the Department of Safety, Office of Highway Safety, entitled "Enforcement Patrols" for the purpose of motor vehicle enforcement on the State's interstate systems. Effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approvals through September 30, 2018. Funding Source: 100% Agency Income.

#### **Explanation**

In an effort to combat the problems being experienced with motor vehicle violations, the NH State Police will hire, on an offduty basis, currently employed State Police troopers to work one-person overtime enforcement patrols when the violations have been found to be most prevalent.

In 2017, a total of 8,297 vehicles were stopped resulting in 4,559 warnings, 4,140 summonses, and 91 arrests as a result of this grant. This year's funding is expected to produce similar results. The high visibility of the NH State Police patrol units will serve as a deterrent for motor vehicle violators. The additional patrols funded under this agreement, coupled with the existing NH State Police units, will demonstrate to the motoring public that efforts are being made to keep them safe while driving on the roadways in New Hampshire.

Additional funds are to be budgeted as follows:

Additional funds in Class 18, Overtime, are needed to pay the overtime for details as approved by the approving Federal Agency.

Additional funds in Class 40, Indirect Costs, are needed to pay the indirect cost on the remaining appropriations.

Additional funds in Class 60, Benefits, are needed to pay for benefits associated with the overtime for the details as approved by the approving Federal Agency.

This is a sub-award of federal funds awarded to the Office of Highway Safety from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). NHTSA has confirmed that the provisions of RSA 604-A:1-c are not allowable costs under the grant.

In the event that Agency Income funds become no longer available General and/or Highway funds will not be requested to support this program.

# CHAPTER 604-A ADEQUATE REPRESENTATION FOR INDIGENT DEFENDANTS IN CRIMINAL CASES

Section 604-A:1-c

604-A:1-c Additional Funding From State Departments and Agencies. – Every state department, board, institution, commission, or agency which receives general fund grants or supplemental appropriations outside of the state biennial operating budget for the purpose of conducting law enforcement activities that may result in increased costs for indigent defense as determined by the court, shall transfer 5 percent of such funds received to the judicial council to be used to pay for indigent defense costs resulting from such law enforcement activities. Payment for expenses of indigent representation under this section shall be made pursuant to RSA 604-A:8.
