EXPLANATION

The Department requests authorization to transfer budgeted account funds among the various accounts to pay for services incurred in meeting the State's transportation demands. This request is a result of the Continuing Resolution and the seasonality of the Department's maintenance program. Specific explanations relating to the Department's spending requests are as follows:

Highway Maintenance (3007) – 0.05% Intra Agency Transfers, 99.95% Highway Funds

- Class 018 Increase Overtime by \$100,000.00. This increase is necessary to obligate the first three months of overtime related to highway maintenance work. Highway maintenance is season and weather dependent. Work must occur in the summer months and is necessary to provide safe roadways. Some tasks required may be tree cleanup due to a storm, constructing drainage to prevent roadway washouts, guardrail maintenance to provide a safe roadway or a repair as a result of an accident. There are times that these tasks are necessary to be completed outside normal working hours to keep the roadways open and safe.
- Class 020 Increase Current Expenses by \$300,000.00. Highway maintenance is seasonal and weather dependent, meaning that most of the work is done in the warmer months (July into October) and then again in the spring (April through June). This increase will allow for the purchase of materials in the first three months of the fiscal year when most of the work is performed. Typical items used during this time are pavement, pipe, gravel, cones, signs and safety equipment.
- Class 022 Increase Rents-Leases Other Than State by \$500,000.00. Highway maintenance is seasonal and weather dependent, requiring that most of the work is done in the warmer months (July into September) and then again in the spring (April through June). It is necessary for the department to have the funds available to rent the equipment needed to complete maintenance activities done during this time frame. Activities include mowing to prevent brush from taking hold, constructing drainage pipes to maintain drainage and prevent roadway washouts, sweeping roads to provide safe conditions for motorcycles and bicycles and meet environmental requirements, guardrail maintenance to repair damages due to accidents or replace older materials, and cleaning catch basins to allow water to drain from roadways and keep the roadways safe. This increase will allow these activities to be done in the first months of the fiscal year while the weather is favorable.

Winter Maintenance (2928) - 100.0% Highway Funds

- Class 018 Decrease Overtime by \$100,000.00. Expenditures in this class will be managed to accommodate this transfer. If a continuing resolution is approved in the second quarter, it is anticipated that excess funds in Highway Maintenance (3007) would be transferred back to replace these funds.
- Class 020 Decrease Current Expenses by \$300,000.00. Expenditures in this class will be managed to accommodate this transfer. If a continuing resolution is approved in the second quarter, it is anticipated that excess funds in Highway Maintenance (3007) would be transferred back to replace these funds.
- Class 022 Decrease Rents-Leases Other Than State by \$500,000.00. Expenditures in this class will be managed to accommodate this transfer. If a continuing resolution is approved in the second quarter, it is anticipated that excess funds in Highway Maintenance (3007) would be transferred back to replace these funds.

- 6. Does this program include, either positions or consultants, and if so are the positions filled, vacant, or have offers pending? (Please provide details for each position and note whether consultant contracts have been awarded.)

This request does not include additional positions or consultants.

7. What would be the effect should this program be discontinued or not initiated as a result of this request being denied?

Seasonal highway maintenance would need to halt if emergency funds are not appropriated and could result in additional costs due to the accelerated deterioration of the roadways. Further, there could be public claims against the Department for incidents that may occur due to the condition of the roadways.
