Explanation

The Division of Fire Safety requires the transfer of funds to purchase and install hazardous materials response and reporting software as identified within the FFY 2018 Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) federal application submitted in June 2018. As the lead agency for Emergency Support Function (ESF) #10 Hazardous Materials, the Office of the State Fire

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Marshal provides State support to local, state, and federal agencies in response to and management of an actual or potential release of hazardous materials and oil spills from a natural, manmade, technological disaster, or a terrorist event.

The mission of the hazardous materials response and reporting software for the State is to assist with emergency planning efforts and prepare for hazardous materials exercises, as well as how standard hazmat incidents are handled. The software will help with reviewing and updating Title III emergency response plans, test response plans by creating hazardous materials transportation exercises, determine new hazardous materials threats, assess response capabilities, and perform a partial commodity flow study using Tier II data.
