REQUESTED ACTION

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of RSA 124:15, Positions Restricted, and subject to the approval of Requested Action #2 below, authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, to retroactively amend Fiscal Item #19-034 approved on February 8, 2019 and Governor and Council Item #16 approved on February 20, 2019 to establish full-time temporary (Class 059) positions at the following levels: two Senior Management Analysts (LG 26), one Program Specialist IV (LG 25), one Administrator I (LG 27), one Programs Information Officer (LG23), and one Business Systems Analyst I (LG28) utilizing funds from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to fund the Chronic Disease Programs by extending the position end dates from June 30, 2019 to September 30, 2019 effective upon date of approval by the Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council, 100% Federal Funds.
- 2. Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, to **retroactively** accept and expend federal funds in the amount of \$88,619 from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to fund the Combined Chronic Disease Program effective upon date of approval by Governor and Council for the period July 1, 2019 through September 30, 2019, and further authorize the funds to be allocated as follows. 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

Retroactive approval is requested to fund full-time temporary positions as of July 1, 2019. The funding and authority for these positions expired on June 30, 2019. This funding was not appropriated under the Continuing Resolution because this grant was awarded subsequent to the agency budget request.

Improving the Health of Americans through Prevention of Diabetes and Heart Disease and Stroke is a federal grant awarded by Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). These additional funds were not added to the SFY19 operating budget because the award was not announced at the time the budget was developed, and it provides greater funding than anticipated. An increase in funds carries an increase in workload and greater responsibility to evaluate progress and demonstrate outcomes, thus the request for additional staff. Where the federal funders allow, positions are shared across multiple grants, in order to increase efficiency and coordination within the Section.

1. Is the action required of this request a result of the Continuing Resolution for FY 2020?

Yes, while this program is included in the SFY 18-19 budget, there were additional funds awarded during SFY 2019, which was subsequent to the agency budget request. As a result of the additional funding, several positions were created through an accept and expend request

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approved by Fiscal Committee and Governor & Council on February 8, 2019 and February 20, 2019. As such this additional funding is not part of the 3/12th base that the Continuing Resolution is calculated from. This action represents 3/12th of one year of the additional grant funding.

2. If this request is retroactive what is the significance and importance of the action being effective from an earlier date?

This retroactive request is necessary to support the cost of staff salary and benefits.

3. Is this a previously funded and ongoing program established through Fiscal Committee and Governor and Executive Council action? (If so, include as an attachment the original documents as approved and cite the specific dates of authorization and end dates for each action as part of your answer to this question.)

Yes, this was previously approved by the Fiscal Committee on February 8, 2019 (FIS 19-034) and the Governor and Executive Council on February 20, 2019 (Item #16), both effective through June 30, 2019.

4. Was funding for this program included in the FY 2018-2019 enacted Budget or requested and denied?

It was included in the FY2018-2019 budget and this item is seeking an increase in the approved amount.

5. Is this program in total or in part, included in the vetoed FY 2020-2021 Operating Budget proposal currently pending for your department, or was it requested and denied?

Yes, the Combined Chronic Disease Program was in total included in the vetoed FY 2020-2021 Operating Budget proposal currently pending for the department.

6. Does this program include, either positions or consultants, and if so are the positions filled, vacant, or have offers pending? (Please provide details for each position and note whether consultant contracts have been awarded.)

The Chronic Disease Prevention and Screening Section (CDPSS) established and filled the following full-time temporary positions: Programs Information Officer, labor grade 23, Senior Management Analyst, labor grade 26, and Business Systems Analyst, labor grade 28. The CDPSS also established and filled a clinical consultant through the approval of the Governor and Executive Council on April 17, 2019 (Item #22). Lastly, the CDPSS established and are in the recruitment process for the following full-time temporary positions: Senior Management Analyst, labor grade 26, Program Specialist IV, labor grade 25, and Administrator I, labor grade 27

7. What would be the effect should this program be discontinued or not initiated as a result of this request being denied?

If this program should be discontinued or not initiated, then the CDPSS would not be able to focus on the prevention and management of diabetes, heart disease, obesity, cancer and alternatives to pain management strategies to improve appropriate prescribing/reduction of over-prescribing of opioids, which is vital work given the opioid crisis in the State. As a result, NH health care providers would not be trained on the benefits and ways to refer patients to available programs and resources to improve the prevention and management of chronic diseases through self-management programs and referrals to available programs and community resources. Also as a result, the CDPSS would not be able to provide ongoing programmatic expertise to reduce the burden of chronic diseases on public health and

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healthcare systems. Furthermore, if the program was not approved, staff would be laid off and consultants would be let go; all of whom are currently working and anticipating being paid.

The Chronic Disease Prevention and Screening Section in the Division of Public Health Services focuses on prevention and management of diabetes, heart disease, obesity, cancer, and oral disease. New to the section is a focus on pain management strategies such as alternatives to pain medication and appropriate prescribing/reduction of over-prescribing of opioids, vital work given the opioid crisis in the State. The Section also provides ongoing programmatic expertise and epidemiological support related to cancer cluster investigations in the State.

Goals in the Section include improved management of chronic diseases through increased participation in self-management programs and integrating pharmacists and community health workers into healthcare teams. Healthcare providers will be trained on the benefits and ways to refer patients to available programs and community resources. The Section partners with Agency and Department Programs to reach the populations in most need of these services with the goal of reducing the burden on the public health and healthcare systems. One example is the Section's partnership with the Medicaid Program to reduce the cost of diabetes to the State. Another goal of the section is to increase its capacity to analyze and report on chronic disease data as well as evaluate the effectiveness of its interventions, and continuously make improvements to better support the needs of NH citizens.

Funds will be budgeted as follows:

- Funds are budgeted for Current Expenses (Class 020) for purchase of: office supplies, copying, and printing; promotional costs to exhibit at conferences and professional meetings; and distribution of surveys and reports.
- Funds are budgeted for Technology Hardware (Class 037) for the purchase of 2 laptops for new staff.
- o Funds are budgeted for Technology Software (Class 038) for the purchase of software needed to use new computers, such as Adobe Pro and Microsoft Office Suite.
- o Funds are budgeted for Audit Cost Set Aside (Class 041) per state requirements.
- Funds are budgeted for Additional Fringe Benefits (Class 042) per state requirements.
- Funds are budgeted for Temp Full Time (Class 059) for new, temporary positions listed below.
- o Funds are budgeted for Benefits (Class 060) for six new employees listed below.
- Funds are budgeted for Employee Training (Class 066) for training on chronic disease prevention and management related topics.
- Funds are budgeted for In-State Travel (Class 070) to cover travel expenses staff incurs
 while performing their duties, new staff will increase required travel.
- Funds are budgeted for Out-of-State Travel (Class 080) to cover travel expenses for meetings mandated by the funder, and for professional development.
- o Funds are budgeted in Contracts for Program Services (Class 102) to fund contracts for data analysis, community health worker capacity building, continuing professional (clinicians and public health professionals) education to increase referrals to diabetes and heart disease programs, quality improvement in health systems, and a clinical consultant to provide expertise to state staff.

- 2) Nature, need and duration:
 - a. The Senior Management Analyst (9T2956) is responsible for evaluating the impact, including cost effectiveness, of diabetes and heart disease interventions in New Hampshire. They serve as a liaison with the evaluation team from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). CDC recommends at least 10% of the award be dedicated to evaluation. Filling this position will help the program fulfill this recommendation. Funds for this position have been added to the state FY 2020-21 budget and is needed for at least the five years of grant funding (through June 2023) and beyond, should CDC provide a continuation of the awards.
 - b. The Program Specialist IV (9T2955) is responsible for planning and implementing heart disease and diabetes interventions. On the technical review of the grant application, CDC indicated there could be insufficient staffing to carry out the required activities, thus, the request to establish this position. Funds for this position have been added to the state FY 2020-21 budget and is needed for at least the five years of grant funding (through June 2023) and beyond, should CDC provide a continuation of the awards.
 - c. The Senior Management Analyst (9T2958) is an Evaluator for Oral Health and Cancer programs, responsible for evaluating the impact, including cost effectiveness, of oral health and cancer interventions in New Hampshire. CDC recommends at least 10% of the awards be dedicated to evaluation. Filling this position will help the program fulfill this recommendation. Funds for this position have been added to the state FY 2020-21 budget and is needed for at least the five years of grant funding (through June 2023) and beyond, should CDC provide a continuation of the awards.
 - d. The Administrator I (9T2960) is a Cancer Director for the Section: This position will oversee the three different components of the state's cancer grant which include the Comprehensive Cancer Control Program, Breast and Cervical Cancer Program and the Cancer Registry Program. They will be a resource on projects related to exposure environmental health hazards and planning community response to potential concerns about cancer clusters. This position is essential to lessen the burden on the Chronic Disease Section Administrator to allow them to support all of the Chronic Disease Program areas, ensure federal grant requirements are met, and lead strategic initiatives on behalf of the Division. Funds for this position have been added to the state FY 2020-21 budget and is needed for at least the five

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years of grant funding (through June 2023) and beyond, should CDC provide a continuation of the awards.

- e. The Programs Information Officer (9T2959) is a Health Communications expert for the Chronic Disease Screening Section. This position will lead chronic disease communication efforts, reaching internal and external stakeholders as well as the general public; development of materials, planning of professional education events; press releases, social media, evaluation of communication interventions. The position is needed for at least the five years of grant funding (through June 2023) and beyond, should CDC provide a continuation of the awards.
- f. The Business Systems Analyst is a Senior Epidemiologist (9T2961) for the Chronic Disease Screening Section. This will be an experienced Epidemiologist that will oversee collection, analysis, interpretation and dissemination of chronic disease data and available to analyze complex data sets. They serve as a liaison with CDC and Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) experts and collaborate with health information technology and data analysts and a mentor for junior level Epidemiologists in the Division. The position is needed for at least the five years of grant funding (through June 2023) and beyond, should CDC provide a continuation of the awards.
- 3) Relationship to existing agency programs: These positions will be a part of the Chronic Disease Prevention and Screening Section and will work collaboratively across the Section and with other Division and Department programs to expand the reach and impact of interventions to improve the health of adults with and at risk for Chronic Disease.

 These funds were requested in DHHS's budget for the FY20-FY21 biennium.

 - a. The Senior Management Analyst (9T2956) is responsible for evaluating the impact, including cost effectiveness, of diabetes and heart disease interventions in New Hampshire. They serve as a liaison with the evaluation team from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). CDC recommends at least 10% of the award be dedicated to evaluation. Filling this position will help the program fulfill this recommendation. Funds for this position have been added to the state FY 2020-21 budget and is needed for at least the five years of grant funding (through June 2023) and beyond, should CDC provide a continuation of the awards.
 - b. The Program Specialist IV (9T2955) is responsible for planning and implementing heart disease and diabetes interventions. On the technical review of the grant application, CDC indicated there could be insufficient staffing to carry out the required activities, thus, the request to establish this position. Funds for this position have been added to the state FY 2020-21 budget and is needed for at least the five years of grant funding (through June 2023) and beyond, should CDC provide a continuation of the awards.
 - c. The Senior Management Analyst (9T2958) is an Evaluator for Oral Health and Cancer programs, responsible for evaluating the impact, including cost effectiveness, of oral health and cancer interventions in New Hampshire. CDC recommends at least 10% of the awards-be-dedicated to evaluation. Filling this position will help the program fulfill this recommendation. Funds for this position have been added to the state-FY 2020-21 budget and is needed for at least the five years of grant funding (through June 2023) and beyond, should CDC provide a continuation of the awards.
 - d. The Administrator I (9T2960) is a Cancer Director for the Section. This position will oversee the three different components of the state's cancer grant which include the Comprehensive Cancer Control Program, Breast and Cervical Cancer Program and the Cancer Registry Program. They will be a resource on projects related to exposure environmental health hazards and planning community response to potential concerns about cancer clusters. This position is essential to lessen the burden on the Chronic Disease Section Administrator to allow them to support all of the Chronic Disease Program areas, ensure federal grant requirements are met, and lead strategic initiatives on behalf of the Division. Funds for this position have been added to the state FY 2020-21 budget and is needed for at least the five years of grant funding (through June 2023) and beyond, should CDC provide a continuation of the awards.
 - e. The Programs Information Officer (9T2959) is a Health Communications expert for the Chronic Disease Screening Section. This position will lead chronic disease communication efforts, reaching internal and external stakeholders as well as the general public; development of materials, planning of professional education events; press releases,

social media, evaluation of communication interventions. The position is needed for at least the five years of grant funding (through June 2023) and beyond, should CDC provide a continuation of the awards:

- f. The Business Systems Analyst is a Senior Epidemiologist (9T2961) for the Chronic Disease Screening Section. This will be an experienced Epidemiologist that will oversee collection, analysis, interpretation and dissemination of chronic disease data and available to analyze complex data sets. They serve as a liaison with CDC and Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) experts and collaborate with health information technology and data analysts and a mentor for junior level Epidemiologists in the Division. The position is needed for at least the five years of grant funding (through June 2023) and beyond, should CDC provide a continuation of the awards.
- 3) Relationship to existing agency programs: These positions will be a part of the Chronic Disease Prevention and Screening Section and will work collaboratively across the Section and with other Division and Department programs to expand the reach and impact of interventions to improve the health of adults with and at risk for Chronic Disease.
