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### EXPLANATION

The Department of Health and Human Services manages the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) program, which is funded annually by \$38,394,141 of federal TANF block grant funds. The TANF block grant has a maintenance of effort (MOE) requirement of \$32,115,100. The current budget anticipates State MOE at the minimum level necessary to retain the federal funds and avoid the penalties that are imposed for failure to meet the MOE. Since the recession of 2008, caseloads had steadily declined as has been reported on the Department's monthly dashboard. However, with the passage of the SFY 2018-2019 budget how the TANF cash assistance grant was calculated was changed such that the maximum monthly cash benefit shall be equal to 60 percent of the federal poverty guidelines, based upon the applicable household size and composition, as determined annually by the United States Department of Health and Human Services. The Department had anticipated that the average monthly caseload would become 2,301 however the average monthly caseload is 2,708 as of December 31, 2017 or 15% higher than was budgeted. The Point In Time caseload for the month of December 2017 is 3,008 so it is likely that the average monthly caseload will continue to increase. The average monthly grant amount was anticipated to be \$509.00 but is actually \$729.65 or 31% higher than budgeted. The Point In Time montly grant has fluctuated month to month so it is difficult to know if the average will increase This accounts for \$5,000,000 of the \$10,000,000 request in the 045-61460000 Payments to Clients (Class 501). The balance of the \$10,000,000 being requested or \$5,000,000 is because the Department took advantage of being able to use Community Spending to meet the TANF grant MOE requirement and was able to transfer \$5,000,000 of general funds to other accounting units. \$1,400,000 was transferred to cover other cash assistance needs within the Division of Family Assistance and the balance or \$3,600,000 was transferred to the Division of Children, Youth and Families to help offset the anticipated deficit in 042-29580000 the Child and Family Services account where all services and placements for youth are incurred and will be matched with federal Foster Care and Medicaid funding.

This request is also being made to accept additional TANF funds available for SFY 2018 to cover the increased caseloads around placements provided to abuse and neglect clients, to keep children safe in their own homes whenever possible and assist families in the protection, development, permanency, and well-being of their children. Children and families involved with DCYF due to abuse and neglect concerns need both core and intensive supportive services. Both are essential in order to assure child safety and increase positive outcomes for children and families in their homes and communities. Funds are being budgeted in 042-29580000 IV- A TANF Placements (Class 639) to cover the 23% increase in placements. The Department has increased claiming TANF Funds for dual eligible children.

This request is being made to accept additional TANF funds available for SFY 2018 to cover the increased caseloads around services provided to delinquents which is to promote community safety and positive youth development via Juvenile Probation and Parole Supervision. Juvenile Probation and Parole Officers work to assure offender accountability through restoration of individuals and communities harmed by misconduct and by treating youth as assets to be developed within families and communities. Funds are being budgeted in 042-29580000 IV- A TANF Services (Class 640) to cover the increase in services. The Department has increased claiming TANF Funds for dual eligible delinquents.

Funds are being budgeted in Audit Fund Set Aside (Class 041) as required in both accounting units.

In response to the anticipated two-part question, "Can these funds be used to offset General Funds?" and "What is the compelling reason for not offsetting General Funds?" the Division offers the following information: These funds may not be used to offset General Funds. General funds are required to meet the annual maintenance of effort for the TANF program.

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Area served: statewide

Source of funds: These funds are 100% Federal from the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families program.

In the event that these Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program
