REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Education, Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation to enter into a sole source contract with the University of New Hampshire, Durham, New Hampshire (Vendor Code 315187), in an amount not to exceed \$15,000, to provide assistive technology workshops to independent living service recipients, effective upon Governor and Council approval for the period through September 30, 2021. 100% Federal Funds.

Funds to support this request are available in FY2021 and anticipated to be available in FY2022, upon the availability and continued appropriation of funds in the future operating budget, with the ability to adjust encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

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EXPLANATION

This request is sole source because the Institute on Disability, within the University of NH is the lead agency for New Hampshire's statewide Assistive Technology Act Program to develop and provide comprehensive access technology and computer-based skills instruction to qualified residents of the state, to facilitate independence and efficiency in both the work and home environments. Assistive Technology in New Hampshire (ATinNH) will provide half-day assistive technology workshops. All training providers are Nationally Certified Assistive Technology Providers.

Technology is utilized in nearly all aspects of life and is critical for individuals to know and be able to utilize in order to access bank records, apply for employment, shop for needed items and to maintain independence and stay in their homes and communities.

COOPERATIVE PROJECT AGREEMENT

between the

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE, Department of Education

and the

University of New Hampshire of the UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

- A. This Cooperative Project Agreement (hereinafter "Project Agreement") is entered into by the State of New Hampshire, **Department of Education**, (hereinafter "State"), and the University System of New Hampshire, acting through University of New Hampshire, (hereinafter "Campus"), for the purpose of undertaking a project of mutual interest. This Cooperative Project shall be carried out under the terms and conditions of the Master Agreement for Cooperative Projects between the State of New Hampshire and the University System of New Hampshire dated November 13, 2002, except as may be modified herein.
- B. This Project Agreement and all obligations of the parties hereunder shall become effective on the date the Governor and Executive Council of the State of New Hampshire approve this Project Agreement ("Effective date") and shall end on 9/30/21. If the provision of services by Campus precedes the Effective date, all services performed by Campus shall be performed at the sole risk of Campus and in the event that this Project Agreement does not become effective, State shall be under no obligation to pay Campus for costs incurred or services performed; however, if this Project Agreement becomes effective, all costs incurred prior to the Effective date that would otherwise be allowable shall be paid under the terms of this Project Agreement.
- C. The work to be performed under the terms of this Project Agreement is described in the proposal identified below and attached to this document as Exhibit A, the content of which is incorporated herein as a part of this Project Agreement.

- B. Project Period: Upon Governor & Council Approval through September 30, 2021
- C. Objectives: To provide comprehensive access technology instruction to qualified residents of the state, to facilitate independence and efficiency in both the work and home environments. Assistive Technology in New Hampshire (ATinNH) will provide half-day assistive technology workshops. All training providers are Nationally Certified Assistive Technology Providers.
- **D.** Scope of Work: University of New Hampshire (UNH) (vendor code 315187) shall provide a comprehensive set of workshops addressing various access technology and computer-based skills to qualified participants.

The following are the workshops to be provided statewide to assist in technology usage and access.

- 1. iPhone/iPad and Mac Computer for Low Vision-Stacy Drisoll
- 2. Mastering Voice Over for effective navigation of the iPAD and iPhone -Therese Willkomm
 3. Mastering Siri Commands and Shortcuts to increase productivity at home and in the workplace when using the iPhone/iPad Therese Willkomm
 - 4. Creative ways to RFID stickers and shortcuts on the iPhone Therese Willkomm
 - 5. Tactile Over lays for the iPAD, iPhone, and Books Therese Willkomm
 - 6. Creating hands-free iPad Holders and Magnifier Holders for Low Vision
 - -7. Learning and using MS Office Word and Excell with a Screen Reader John Mule -
 - 8. Learning and using MS Office Powerpoint and Outlook with a screen reader John Mule
 - 9. Learning and using Google Programs with a screen reader John Mule and Stacy Driscoll
 - 10. Amazon Echo for the Blind and Visually Impaired Stacy Driscoll

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E. Deliverables Schedule: Workshops from the menu, in the scope of services, will be provided, as needed, in all regions of the state. These workshops will enhance the independent living skills of individuals needing training on assistive technology.

F. Budget and Invoicing Instructions: The budget for this program will be up to \$15,000. Billing will occur when workshops are completed. Upon receipt of invoices for workshops provided, Services for Blind and Vision Impaired will pay to the University of New Hampshire as agreed in this cooperative agreement.


