#### **REQUESTED ACTION**

Pursuant to RSA 21-P:43, the Department of Safety, Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM), requests authorization to retroactively amend an existing grant agreement (PO#1077132) with the City of Dover (VC#1.77380-B005). Effective upon the Governor and Council approval, this amendment will extend the completion date only from December 26, 2021 to January 26, 2022. The grant was initially approved by the Governor during the State of Emergency on November 25, 2020 and presented to the Executive Council on December 18, 2020, 1tem #C. Funding source: 100% Federal Funds.

## EXPLANATION

This request is retroactive, and the extension is necessary due to delays caused by shipment delays and supply chain shortages that are affecting the nation. The grant provides \$66,376 in federal Emergency Management Performance. Grant COVID-19 Supplemental funding to the City of Dover to install teleconference equipment that will support and enhance communications for the community's Emergency Operations Center (EOC). It was agreed that an extension to January 26, 2022, approved by Governor and Council, would provide the City of Dover ample time to complete the aforementioned tasks. HSEM has reviewed this request with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and it was determined that the date extension will not affect Federal funding.

In the event that Federal Funds are no longer available, General Funds and/or Highway Funds will not be requested, to support this program,

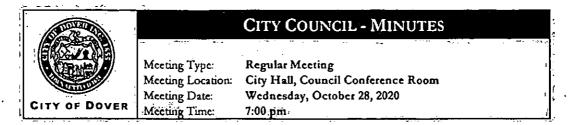
