#### **REQUESTED ACTION**

That approval be and hereby is given to the Attorney General to reappoint Gregory M. Albert, Position #9U581 (Appropriation #02-20-200510-3310-013-500132) as an Assistant Attorney General, at a salary level of \$75,000.00, effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval or May 22, 2020, whichever is the latter. Mr. Albert will be occupying a position that expires on April 29, 2025.

#### **EXPLANATION**

Mr. Albert, a resident of Bow, graduated magna cum laude from Bloomsburg University in 2000, with a bachelor's degree in Mass Communications. He earned his Juris Doctor, cum laude, from the University of New Hampshire, School of Law in 2010. He is admitted to practice law in New Hampshire and Massachusetts. From 2010 to 2018, he was a Staff Attorney with the New Hampshire Public Defender's Office in Manchester. Mr. Albert joined the Department of Justice in June 2018, and has served continuously since then in the Consumer Protection and Antitrust Bureau. He was appointed as an Assistant Attorney General in December 2018, to a term that ended April 29, 2020. He would be reappointed to serve until April 29, 2025. I plan to continue his current salary and assignment. A copy of his resume is attached.

RSA 94:1-a(I)(c)(3) provides that designation of positions, salary levels, and salary increases for attorneys at the Department of Justice shall be determined by the Attorney General, subject to approval of the Governor and Council, within appropriations made to the Department of Justice.
