## ACE-V, BIAS, AND YOU

### IS IT TIME TO RETIRE ACE-V?

The road to success is paved with construction. Improvement necessitates that outdated items be replaced, weak items be improved, and useless items be discarded. The Bertillon system of identification was replaced by fingerprints, the Henry fingerprint classification system replaced by computer databases, inked fingerprinting replaced by LiveScan computers, and film photography replaced with digital photography. Progress is inevitable; nevertheless, advancement is often filled with missteps along the way. The fireproof properties of asbestos were once thought to be beneficial. Radium once seemed like a valuable discovery. The 1985 introduction of New Coke was quickly recognized as a flop and discarded after only 79 days. The most efficient way to improve is to recognize when it is time to abandon ideas that are no longer valuable. This presentation will explore the usefulness of the ACE-V methodology to determine if it is as valuable as once thought.

### BIAS IS NOT A PROBLEM

Many practitioners have been told that forensic conclusions are susceptible to bias and that solutions need to be found to minimize biasing influences. Two common recommendations have been to limit information available to the analyst and to perform verification blindly. Is it possible that bias is not the problem, rather a consequence of a more rudimentary issue? If so, then perhaps solving the root cause would in turn minimize bias.
