

Mark Brnovich, Attorney General, State of Arizona

Mark Brnovich
Arizona Attorney General

Mark Brnovich was inaugurated as Arizona's Attorney General in January of 2015. He has also served as an Assistant U.S. Attorney for the District of Arizona and as the state's Assistant Attorney General. He is currently the co-chairman of the National Association of Attorney Generals' Gambling Committee the 2nd Vice Chair of the Conference of Western Attorneys General.

Prior to taking office, Brnovich served as Director of the Arizona Department of Gaming, a law enforcement agency that coordinates with tribal regulators to ensure the integrity of Indian gaming and investigates illegal gambling occurring off-reservation. During his tenure, the Department seized hundreds of illegal gambling devices and vigorously assisted in the prosecution of unlawful gambling operations.

As Attorney General, Brnovich is widely credited with restoring public confidence in the office of "Arizona's Top Cop" and is known for enforcing the rule of law, protecting the vulnerable and assembling some of the most talented public servants in the country for his administration. Most recently, he argued at the United States Supreme Court regarding voter redistricting, was featured on the CBS talk show 60 Minutes in defense of capital punishment, and appeared on Times Squares' largest billboards to combat human sex trafficking.
