Requested Action

Authorize the Department of Safety, Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM), to retroactively accept and expend grant funds from the Department of Safety, Office of the Commissioner, in an amount not to exceed \$70,000.00 for providing a hosted Web-based cellular phone notification system and associated services for HSEM to alert and warn the public of any impending dangers. Effective upon Governor and Council for approval the period of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2021. Funding source: 100% Agency Income.

Explanation

This request is retroactive because the emergency alert system remained operational while the applicable agency award acceptance mechanism and documentation was being developed. This request is to accept and expend a sub-grant from the Department of Safety, Office of the Commissioner, to provide a system that allows the Department of Safety to release emergency messages warning the public of impending danger to cell phone users within geographical areas specified by the Department. It integrates with emergency weather warnings from National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and enables the State to rebroadcast State Amber Alert messages in a timely manner to a large number of people within a targeted area.

Funds are to be budgeted as follows:

Funds in Class 38, Technology-Software, will be used to provide a hosted Web-based cellular phone notification system and associated services to alert and warn the public of any impending dangers.

There are no General funds required with this request. In the event that Federal funds are no longer available, General funds and/or Highway funds will not be requested to support this program.
