

The organizers for this conference (Hon. Tara Sad and Hon. Bob Haefner) packed a lot into this one-day conference. It was very helpful to hear what issues related to Agriculture and Rural Life, legislators in other states were dealing with and to hear from experts who can offer us assistance in the future. Fifteen legislators participated from seven states.

Rush Rumley, Senior Staff Attorney at the National Agricultural Law Center discussed many of the pros and pitfalls of Agritourism. His organization can be a valuable resource for NH legislators as their understanding of the word Agriculture is quite broad and their website has an abundance of materials on environmental issues, clean water, conservation and land use in addition to more farm related issues and definitely Agritourism. He discussed laws that have been passed in various states and the holes in these laws.

Amy Manzelli of Concord NH is well versed in "Right to Farm" and what steps states can take to protect their farms/farmland and farmers. She was able to answer many of the participants questions too.

A round table whose panelists included Rhode Island farmers who hold 'agritourism' type events (weddings, pumpkin festivals, corn mazes, concerts) on their properties and members of Planning boards of the towns where these farms are situated. Participants heard challenges and benefits.

Fran Boyd gave an update on the Farm Bill which just passed the US House of Representatives. He is a DC Lobbyist whose work in the public and private sectors for agriculture makes his information always pertinent.

We learned what other states are doing to with regards to Animal Cruelty statutes. Very important to NH legislators because of recent developments in Alexandria, Wolfeboro and other areas of the state.
