Authorize the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources, State Council on the Arts, to enter into a **Retroactive** amendment to an existing contract (Contract #1081731) with Ingrid Pichler (VC #153882), Swampscott, MA for creation of artwork for the Hampton Circuit Courthouse by extending the completion date from December 31, 2021 to June 30, 2022 with no change in the contract price effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval. The original contract was approved by Governor and Executive Council on June 2, 2021, Item #82. 100% Other Funds (Agency Income).

EXPLANATION

Pursuant to RSA 19-A:10, the Percent for Art Selection Committee commissioned Ingrid Pichler to create a large multicolored plexi-glass installation for the Hampton Courthouse. Due to supply chain issues causing delays in getting materials, Ms. Pichler needs an extension to complete the pieces and installation at the courthouse. The extension request is retroactive as the amendment needed to be corrected and resigned and was not received in time to make an earlier meeting.

The Attorney General's office has approved the contract amendment as to form, substance and execution.

EXPLANATION

The Percent for Art Program was enacted by the New Hampshire Legislature in 1979 to ensure that all forms of visual arts and crafts have an integral and important place in the public spaces of state buildings. The program, administered by the New Hampshire State Council on the Arts (NHSCA), takes a unique approach to the acquisition of artwork by creating a committee that engages in a process where architects, state employees, art professionals and private citizens collaborate in the selection, commissioning or purchasing of works of art by artists and craftspeople for state buildings.

The NHSCA releases a Request for Proposals (RFP) and is required to accept artist proposals from across the country pursuant to the Federal Interstate Commerce Clause. Of the thirty proposals received, 75% were from artists outside New Hampshire. All thirty proposals were reviewed by the committee and the recommendation for the 10th Circuit District Court is as follows:

Ingrid Pichler, consistent with the Request for Proposals dated July 22, 2019 and reflected in the artist's proposal received on March 4, 2021, will create and install a multicolored plexi-glass installation, sized 10' X 4'. The piece will incorporate shortened text of significant court cases onto individual thermoformed plexi-glass to create a slight movement that will echo the movement of paper. The smaller pieces will surround a graphic of "We The People" also on plexi-glass.

The Attorney General's office has approved the contract as to form, substance and execution.

3. In no event shall the State be liable for any payments hereunder in excess of such available appropriated funds. In the event of a reduction or termination of appropriated funds, the State shall have the right to withhold payment until such funds become available, if ever, and shall have the right to reduce or terminate the Services under this Agreement immediately upon giving the Contractor notice of such reduction or termination. The State shall not be required to transfer funds from any other account or source to the Account identified in block 1.6 in the event funds in that Account are reduced or unavailable.

5. CONTRACT PRICE/PRICE LIMITATION/ PAYMENT.

7. PERSONNEL.

7.1 The Contractor shall at its own expense provide all personnel necessary to perform the Services. The Contractor warrants that all personnel engaged in the Services shall be qualified to perform the Services, and shall be properly licensed and otherwise authorized to do so under all applicable laws.

7.2 Unless otherwise authorized in writing, during the term of this Agreement, and for a period of six (6) months after the Completion Date in block 1.7, the Contractor shall not hire, and shall not permit any subcontractor or other person, firm or conporation with whom it is engaged in a combined effort to perform the Services to hire, any person who is a State employee or official, who is materially involved in the procurement, administration or performance of this Agreement. 9. TERMINATION.

9.1 Notwithstanding paragraph 8, the State may, at its sole discretion, terminate the Agreement for any reason, in whole or in part, by thirty (30) days written notice to the Contractor that the State is exercising its option to terminate the Agreement.

9.2 In the event of an early termination of this Agreement for any season other than the completion of the Services, the Contractur shall, at the State's discretion, deliver to the Contracting Officer, not later than fifteen (15) days after the date of termination, a seport ("Termination Report") describing in detail all Services performed, and the contract price earned, to and including the date of termination. The form, subject matter, content, and number of copies of the Termination Report shall be identical to those of any Final Report described in the attached EXHIBIT B. In addition, at the State's discretion, the Contractor shall, within 15 days of notice of early termination, develop and

submit to the State a Transition Plan for services under the Agreement.

10. DATA/ACCESS/CONFIDENTIALITY/

PRESERVATION.

10.1 As used in this Agreement, the word "data" shall mean all information and things developed or obtained diring the performance of, or acquired or developed by reason of, this Agreement; including, but not limited to, all studies, reports, files, formulae, surveys, maps, charis, sound recordings, video recordings, pictorial reproductions, drawings, analyses, graphic representations, computer programs, computer printouts, notes, letters, memoranda, papers, and documents, all whether finished or unfinished.

10.2 All data and any property which has been received from the State or purchased with funds provided for that purpose under this Agreement, shall be the property of the State, and shall be returned to the State upon demand or upon termination of this Agreement for any reason.

10.3 Confidentiality of data shall be governed by N.H. RSA clupter 91-A or other existing law. Disclosure of data requires prior written approval of the State.

11. CONTRACTOR'S KELATION TO THE STATE. In the performance of this Agreement the Contractor is in all respects an independent contractor, and is neither an agent nor an employee of the State. Neither the Contractor nor any of its officers, employees, agents or members shall have authority to bind the State or receive any benefits, workers' compensation or other employees.

12. ASSIGNMENT/DELEGATION/SUBCONTRACTS, 12.1

The Contractor shall not assign, or otherwise transfer any interest in this Agreement without the prior written nutice, which shall be provided to the State at least fifteen (15) days prior to the assignment, and a written consent of the State. For purposes of this paragraph, a Cliange of Control shall constitute assignment. "Change of Control" means (a) merger, consolidation, or a transaction or series of related transactions in which a third party, together with its affiliates, becomes the direct or indirect owner of fifty percent (50%) or more of the voting shares or similar equity interests, or combined voting power of the Contractor, or (b) the sale of all or substantially all of the assets of the Contractor.

12.2 None of the Services shall be subcontracted by the Contractor without prior written notice and consent of the State. The State is entitled to copies of all subcontracts and assignment agreements and shall not be bound by any provisions contained in a subcontract or an assignment agreement to which it is not a party.

13. INDEMNIFICATION. The certificate(s) of insurance and any renewals thereof shall be attached and are incorporated herein by reference.

15. WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

15.1 By signing this agreement, the Contractor agrees, certifies and warrants that the Contractor is in compliance with or exempt from, the requirements of N.H. RSA chapter 281-A ("Workers' Compensation").

15.2 To the extent the Contractor is subject to the requirements of N.H. RSA chapter 281-A, Contractor shall maintain, and require any subcontractor or assignce to secure and maintain, payment of Workers' Compensation in connection, with activities which the person proposes to undertake pursuant to this

Agreement. The Contractor shall furnish the Contracting Officer identified in block 1.9, or his or her successor, proof of Workers' Compensation in the manner described in N.H. RSA chapter 281-A and any applicable renewal(s) thereof, which shall be attached and are incorporated herein by reference. The State shall not be responsible for payment of any Workers' Compensation premiums or for any other claim or benefit for Contractor, or any subcontractor or employee of Contractor, which might arise under applicable State of New Hampshire Workers' Compensation faws in connection with the performance of the Services under this Agreement. 16. NOTICE. Any notice by a party hereto to the other party shall be deemed to have been duly delivered or given at the time of mailing by certified mail, postage prepaid, in a United States Post Office addressed to the parties at the addresses given in blocks 1.2 and 1.4, herein.

17. AMENDMENT. This Agreement may be amended, waived or discharged only by an instaument in writing signed by the parties hereto and only after approval of such amendment, waiver or discharge by the Governor and Executive Council of the State of New Hampshire unless no such approval is required under the circumstances pursuant to State law, rule or policy.

18. CHOICE OF LAW AND FORUM. This Agreement shall be governed, interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New Hampshire, and is binding upon and inures to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assigns. The wording used in this Agreement is the wording chosen by the parties to express their mutual intent, and no rule of construction shall be applied against or in favor of any party. Any actions arising out of this Agreement shall be brought and maintained in New Hampshire Superior Court which shall have exclusive jurisdiction thereof.

19: CONFLICTING TERMS. In the event of a conflict between the terms of this P-37 form (as modified in EXHIBIT A) and/or attachments and amendment thereof; the terms of the P-37 (as modified in EXHIBIT A) shall control.

20. THIRD PARTIES. The parties hereto do not intend to benefit any third parties and this Agreement shall not be construed to confer any such benefit.

21. EXADINGS. The headings throughout the Agreement are for reference purposes only, and the words contained therein shall in no way be held to explain, modify, amplify or aid in the interpretation, construction or meaning of the provisions of this Agreement.

22. SPECIAL PROVISIONS. Additional or modifying provisions act forth in the attached EXHIBIT A are incorporated herein by reference.

23. SEVERABILITY. In the event any of the provisions of this Agreement are held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be contrary to any state or federal law, the remaining provisions of this Agreement will remain in full force and effect.

24. ENTURE AGREEMENT. This Agreement, which may be executed in a number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the parties, and supersectes all prior agreements and understandings with respect to the subject matter hereof.

USE:

Once the Artworks are completed and becomes the property of the State, the State will not permit any use of the Artist's name or misuse of the Artworks which, in the State's opinion, would reflect discredit on the Artist's reputation or violate the spirit of the Artworks.

All preliminary data and research leading up to the execution of the final Artworks purchased by the State remain the sole property of the Artist.

The imagery developed by the Artist for the Artworks may continue to be used as the Artist chooses for other original works of art.

INSURANCE:

The insurance limits that are contained in section 14.1.1 pertaining to general liability are reflected in the Certificate of Insurance dated April 6, 2021at General Liability \$1,000,000 each occurrence and \$2,000,000 in aggregate.

REPRODUCTION:

The Division of the Arts shall have the right to reproduce the image of the Artworks for purposes of supporting and promoting New Hampshire arts and for publicity purposes such as within booklets, press releases, Division of the Arts Website, e-news, etc., with credit given to the Artist In all cases.

ASSURANCE:

The materials of the artworks and installation hardware shall remain free from all defects for a period of 90 days from the date of installation. Any defect noted within 90 days of the Installation date shall be repaired by the Artist at his/her expense. The date and remedy of any repair shall be coordinated with and approved by the NHSCA staff. Any repair shall restore the artworks to a condition requiring minimal maintenance as originally stated in the Request for Proposals. Should the artist fall to remedy any defect within 60 days of notification of defect, the State may deem the artists in default and pursue legal remedies as provided in Section 8 of the P-37 Form.

SERVICES & INSTALLATION:

Consistent with the Request for Proposals dated July 22, 2019 and reflected in the artist's revised proposal received on March 4, 2021, Ingrid Pichler will create and Install at the Hampton Circuit Court a multicolored plexi-glass installation, with the main body mounted on backboard. This piece incorporates shortened text of significant court cases onto Individual thermoformed plexi-glass to create a slight movement that will echo the movement of paper. The smaller piece surround a graphic of "We The People" also on plexi-glass. When installed, the piece will measure 10 ft x 4ft.

Contract cost includes transportation and installation.

INSTALLATION:

An employee of the NHSCA will coordinate scheduling of transportation and installation of artworks and will be present onsite to assure contract compliance on the scheduled installation day. Installation shall take place during normal business hours and the artist agrees to take all reasonable precautions to avoid unsafe conditions for patrons and employees of the site.

The artist is required to arrive fully prepared for the installation of the artworks on the scheduled installation day.

A pre-installation site visit may be scheduled by NHSCA staff to help the artist assess installation requirements, as requested by the artist.

EXHIBIT C - Ingrid Pichler Payment

PAYMENT:

I he Artist shall be compensated by the State of New Hampshire (State) in the total amount of tho contract, which shall constitute full payment for all services, materials, travel, delivery, and installation (if specified under Exhibit A) to be furnished under the terms of this agreement. Such compensation shall be made in three installments, and processed upon receipt of invoices submitted by Artist:

Commissions:

- First payment: Thirty-five percent (35%) of the amount referenced above shall be paid upon the effective date of this contract.
- Second payment: Thirty-five percent (35%) of the amount referenced above shall be paid when the project is seventy percent (70%) completed.
- Third and final payment: Thirty percent (30%) shall be paid after final acceptance by the State, wherein the State signifies that the Artworks have been completed.

Upon receipt and approval of the final invoice by the State, completion of an "Artist Worksheet" by the Artist detailing final information and recommendations for maintenance on the Artworks, and in consideration of the satisfactory performance of the services as determined by the State, the State shall consider this acceptance of the Artworks and submit invoice for processing.

The payment by the State of the full contract price shall be the sole compensation to the Artist for services and reimbursement to the Artist for all expenses, of whatever nature, in the performance of this contract and shall be considered complete. The State shall have no llability to the Artist other than the contract price.
