#### Requested Action

Authorize the Department of Safety (DOS), Division of State Police, to accept and expend federal pass-through funds in the amount of \$73,298.00, entitled Enforcement Patrols, from the Department of Safety, Office of Highway Safety, for the purpose of funding motor vehicle enforcement on the State's interstate systems. Effective upon Governor and Council approval through September 30, 2020. Funding Source: 100% Agency Income.

#### Explanation

In an effort to increase safety on New Hampshire roads, the State Police will hire, on an off-duty basis, currently employed State Police troopers to work one-person overtime enforcement patrols when motor vehicle violations have been found to be most prevalent.

In 2019, a total of 6,982 vehicles were stopped resulting in 3,242 warnings, 3,965 summonses, and 79 arrests as a result of this grant. This year's funding is expected to produce similar results. The high visibility of the NH State Police patrol units will serve as a deterrent for motor vehicle violators. The additional patrols funded under this agreement, coupled with the existing NH State Police units, will demonstrate to the motoring public that efforts are being made to keep them safe while driving on the roadways in New Hampshire.

These funds are federal funds to the Department of Safety, Office of Highway Safety, and become pass-through (Agency Income) to the Department of Safety (DOS), Division of State Police.

Funds are to be budgeted as follows:

Funds in Class 18, Overtime, are needed to pay the overtime for details as approved by the approving Federal Agency.

Funds in Class 40, Indirect Costs, are needed to pay the indirect cost on the remaining appropriations.

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Funds in Class 60, Benefits, are needed to pay for benefits associated with the overtime for the details as approved by the approving Federal Agency.

In the event that Agency Income funds become no longer available General and/or Highway funds will not be requested to support this program.
