EXPLANATION

The NH Department of Education receives a CTE Vocational Education-PERKINS award authorized under the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act of 2006 as amended through P.L 116-6 (Perkins V). This is a formula grant for states to assist "states and localities to develop challenging academic and technical standards and to assist students in meeting such standards, including preparation for high-skill, high-wage or high-demand occupations in current or emerging professions". CTE plans to spend the above requested appropriation for State Leadership and Non-Traditional activities, including a mobile classroom, firefighter equipment specifically designed for female students, and training materials for high school faculty regarding non-traditional careers. This program was included in the FY 20-21 budget request, but not in these expense accounts. If the budget had been enacted, the Department would have been required to go to Fiscal Committee to request reallocation of funds in order to spend as currently being requested.

Yes, this program was included in the FY 20-21 budget request. However, these funds were not budgeted for these specific purposes. If the FY 20-21 proposed budget had been approved, the Department would have needed to go to Fiscal Committee to request reallocation of federal funds.
- 6. Does this program include, either positions or consultants, and if so are the positions filled, vacant, or have offers pending? (Please provide details for each position and note whether consultant contracts have been awarded.) N/A.
- 7. What would be the effect should this program be discontinued or not initiated as a result of this request being denied? If this request were denied, activities allowed under the CTE Program would not be instituted within the State; specifically State Leadership and Non-Traditional activities, including a mobile classroom, firefighter equipment specifically designed for female students, and training materials for high school faculty regarding non-traditional careers. Instead these funds would expire come September 30, 2019 and be returned to the federal government.

The following appropriation authorities are being requested:

Class 030 Equipment Additional appropriation needed to pay for CTE mobile classroom

Class 067 Training of Providers Additional appropriation needed to pay for high school faculty trainer

The Department has conducted a detailed review of these line items in the budget to ensure that available funds are maximized to the greatest degree possible.
