ORGANIZATION AND FUNCTION

The Board of Podiatry, established in 1919, is responsible for administering the Podiatric Practice Act, RSA 315. The Board licenses podiatrists. The Board protects the New Hampshire public by carefully reviewing license applications, investigating all consumer complaints, and undertaking disciplinary actions against licensee violations of the Podiatric Practice Act.

OPERATIONS

The Board of Podiatry licensed 5 new podiatrists in fiscal year 2012 and 2 new podiatrists in fiscal year 2013. There were approximately 97 podiatrists renewed in fiscal year 2012 and 102 renewed in fiscal year 2013. Six podiatrists lapsed their licenses in fiscal year 2012 and no podiatrist lapsed their license in

fiscal year 2013. Podiatrists' licenses are renewed every other year, in the even year.

The Board receives complaints against podiatrists from consumers and also receives malpractice suits filed in New Hampshire. In fiscal year 2012, the Board investigated four complaints, two insurance claims and four malpractice suits filed in New Hampshire. In fiscal year 2013, the Board investigated three complaints, one insurance claim and one malpractice suit filed in New Hampshire. The Board also issued one confidential letter of concern, which does not represent disciplinary action, but is intended as a formal warning to licensees. The average investigation took 3-6 months due to the fact that this Board meets quarterly. These investigations did not result in any formal disciplinary actions.
