#### **REQUESTED ACTION**

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, to amend an existing contract with JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc., d/b/a Community Health Institute (VC#161611-B001), Bow, NH to continue providing a broad range of support services across a number of public health programs, by increasing the price limitation by \$50,000 from \$6,390,250 to \$6,440,250 with no change to the contract completion date of December 31, 2021 effective upon Governor and Council approval. 100% Federal Only.

The original contract was approved by the Governor and Executive Council on June 21, 2017 (Item #51); as amended and approved by the Governor and Executive Council on February 21, 2018 (Item #8), as amended and approved by the Governor and Executive Council on April 17, 2019 (Item #19), as amended and approved by the Governor and Executive Council on October 2, 2019 (Item #14), as amended and approved by the Governor on May 29, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on June 24, 2020 (Informational Item #F); as amended with Governor approval on July 31, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on August 26, 2020 (Informational Item #N); and as amended and approved by the Governor on April 11, 2021, and presented to the Executive Council on June 16, 2021 (Informational Item #C), and as amended and approved by the Governor and Executive Council on June 16, 2021 (Item #40).

Funds are available in State Fiscal Year 2022, with the authority to adjust budget line items within the price limitation and encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office if needed and justified.

#### **EXPLANATION**

The purpose of this request is to-expand-capacity of the State's strategic response to COVID-19 by providing a broad range of public health professional support services that include, but are not limited to developing: training programs to educate vaccine providers and appropriate health care staff regarding the implementation of the newly launched New Hampshire Immunization Information System (NHIIS); developing educational materials and resources to educate the public, providers and staff about the use and benefits of NHIIS including how to

document and request COVID-19 immunization records. JSI will also assist with developing and implementing materials to promote immunizations and improve vaccination rates for NH's residents; planning large statewide conferences, as well as smaller meetings and conferences; offering technical assistance to local partners; and providing subject matter expertise on social media management, graphic design, expanding partnerships, and project management.

Approximately 400 individuals (medical professionals and immunization stakeholders) will be served, upon Governor and Executive Council approval, through December 31, 2021.

The Contractor shall continue providing technical assistance to the Department on strategies to establish an Immunization Coalition, with the goal of developing education and outreach tools for medical professionals and the public. The Contractor will continue collaborating with external stakeholders identified by the Department to assist with developing methods to improve communication. JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc., will generate education and outreach materials and resources targeted at stakeholders, which includes medical professionals, parents, guardians, seniors, other members of the public and other entities engaged in promoting immunizations.

The Department will monitor contracted services by ensuing that the Contractor provides logistical support.

Should the Governor and Council not authorize this request, medical professionals and the general public may not receive timely factual information related to immunizations. Additionally, valuable education and training may not be available to medical professionals, which could impact delivery of patient services.

# State of New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services Amendment #9

This Amendment to the Public Health Professional Support Services contract is by and between the State of New Hampshire, Department of Health and Human Services ("State" or "Department") and JSI Research & Training Institute, Inc. ("the Contractor").



# JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. and Affiliate NOTES TO CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

September 30, 2019

#### **NOTE A - ORGANIZATION AND NATURE OF ACTIVITIES**

JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. (the "Organization") was incorporated in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts on April 11, 1979. JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. provides education and research primarily to non-profit health and human service agencies both in the United States and abroad. Current funding is principally from the United States Agency for International Development and the United States Department of Health and Human Services.

JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. is the sole member of World Education, Inc. and The Partnership for Supply Chain Management, Inc. (Affiliates). JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. is accorded with such powers as are typical for a sole member including the power of appointment and removal of the Affiliates' board of trustees, the right to approve amendments to the bylaws and certificate of incorporation, and the right to approve any merger, consolidation, dissolution or transfer of substantial assets of Affiliates.

World Education, Inc. was founded in 1951 and incorporated in the state of New Jersey. Working in partnership with community, national, and international agencies in Asia, Africa, and the United States, it provides professional assistance in the design and implementation of non-formal adult education programs. These programs integrate functional education with relevant problem-solving aspects of individual growth and national development such as health, nutrition, family planning, childcare, refugee education, agricultural practices, literacy, and income generation. World Education, Inc's financial data is consolidated utilizing its fiscal year-end financial position at June 30, 2019.

The Partnership for Supply Chain Management (PfSCM) was incorporated on February 14, 2005 under the laws of Massachusetts. PfSCM began operations on October 1, 2005 as a non-profit organization established by JSI Research & Training Institute, Inc. and Management Sciences for Health, Inc. On October 11, 2018, Management Sciences for Health, Inc. discontinued their relationship with PfSCM and JSI Research & Training Institute, Inc. became the sole member of PfSCM. PfSCM's financial data is consolidated utilizing its fiscal year-end financial position at September 30, 2019.

JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. and its affiliates are tax exempt organizations under 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and file separate unconsolidated tax returns.

#### NOTE B CHANGE IN CONTROL

As previously referred to in Note A, the Organization achieved a controlling interest in the PfSCM during fiscal year 2019. This transaction was effected without the transfer of consideration, and as such, the net assets of PfSCM as of October 11, 2018, totaling \$2,778,482, were contributed to the Organization and were recognized in the accompanying consolidated statement of activities as an inherent contribution. #### NOTE C - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Principles of Consolidation**

The consolidated financial statements include the accounts of JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. as well as World Education, Inc. and PfSCM, its affiliates (collectively referred to as the Organization). Significant intra-entity accounts and transactions have been eliminated in consolidation.

#### Basis of Accounting

The consolidated financial statements of the Organization have been prepared utilizing the accrual basis of accounting and include the accounts of JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. and its affiliates in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP). Net assets, revenues, and expenses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, the net assets of the Organization and the changes thereof are classified and reported as follows:

Net assets without donor restrictions - Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed restrictions:

Net assets with donor restrictions - Contributions, grants, and income whose use by the Organization has been limited by donors or grantors to a specific time period or purpose.

#### Use of Estimates

The preparation of consolidated financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

#### Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Organization considers all monies in banks and highly liquid investments with maturity dates of three months or less to be cash equivalents. The carrying value of cash and cash equivalents approximates fair value because of the short maturities of those financial instruments. Total cash held in foreign accounts was \$3,483,206 at September 30, 2019.

#### Investments

Investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities (marketable investments) are measured at fair values based on quoted market prices in the consolidated statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the consolidated statement of activities.

#### Property and Equipment

Property and equipment owned by the organization are reported on the basis of cost less accumulated depreciation. Acquisitions of property and equipment in excess of \$5,000 are capitalized. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method calculated to extinguish the book value of the respective assets over their estimated useful lives (5 - 7 years) of the related assets. Property and equipment purchased with grant funds where ownership rests with the donor is expensed at the time of purchase and is returned to the donor or disposed of in accordance with the terms of the grant and/or donor permissions at the conclusion of the grant period.

#### NOTES TO CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS - CONTINUED

#### September 30, 2019

#### Revenue Recognition

The majority of the Organization's revenues are derived from contracts, cooperative agreements, and grants with U.S. government agencies, primarily the United States Agency for International Development and the United States Department of Health and Human Services, as well as other private foundations and non-governmental organizations. Revenues are recognized when the Organization incurs qualifying expenditures that are reimbursable under the terms of the contracts, agreements or grants, or in accordance with the grantor's restrictions.

Unrestricted and restricted contributions are recognized as revenue at the date the pledge is made or the gift is received, whichever is earlier.

Contributions received are recorded as revenue without donor restrictions, or with donor restrictions depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions. Contributions are reported as restricted support and are then released to without donor restrictions upon expiration of the time and/or purpose of the restriction. Restricted support, whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period, is shown as support without restrictions.

#### **Donated Materials and Services**

Donated materials and services are recorded as in-kind project contributions at their estimated fair market value as of the date of receipt and as an expense in the accompanying consolidated statement of activities. Donated services are recognized if the services received create or enhance non-financial assets or require specialized skills that are provided by individuals possessing those skills and would typically need to be purchased if not provided by donation.

#### Income Taxes

The Organization is exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and is not a private foundation as described in Section 509. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes is included in the accompanying consolidated financial statements.

The Organization has evaluated its tax positions and believes that there would be no material changes to the results of its operations or financial position as a result of an audit by the applicable taxing authorities, federal or state. The Organization has filed all of its known and required returns in a timely manner including as permitted allowed extensions. Following administrative practice of the taxing authorities, the tax years 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019 remain open years subject to examination and review.

JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc., World Education, Inc. and PfSCM file separate unconsolidated tax returns. JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. and PfSCM file tax returns are based on a September 30 year end and World Education, Inc. files its tax return based on a June 30 year end.

#### Functional Allocation of Expenses

The costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the consolidated statement of activities. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited. Each functional classification includes all expenses related to the underlying operations by natural classification. Natural expenses attributable to more than one functional expense category are allocated using a variety of cost allocation techniques.

#### NOTES TO CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS - CONTINUED

#### September 30, 2019

#### Foreign Currency Transactions

Expenses of international operations are measured generally using local currency. Expenses are translated to USD using the first in, first out method of exchange based on the bank rate assigned at transfer. As a result, foreign currency transaction gains and losses are negligible and are included as direct program expenses.

#### Receivables for Program Work

Receivables for program work are stated at the amount management expects to collect from outstanding balances. Management provides for probable uncollectable amounts through a provision for bad debt expense and an adjustment to a valuation allowance based on its assessment of the current status of individual accounts. Balances that are still outstanding after management has used reasonable collection efforts are written off through a charge to the valuation allowance and a credit to accounts receivable. The allowance for doubtful accounts at September 30, 2019 was \$0. Included in receivables for program work is \$38,093,960 of amounts billed and \$7,036,428 of amounts unbilled.

#### Implementation of New Accounting Standards

In August 2016, the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2016-14, *Presentation of Financial Statements for Not-for-Profit Entities*, which revises the not-for-profit financial reporting model. ASU 2016-14 provides for additional disclosure requirements and modifies net asset reporting. The Organization adopted ASU 2016-14 effective in the fiscal year ended September 30, 2019. As a result of the adoption of ASU 2016-14, the Organization was required to reclassify its net assets into two categories: net assets without donor restrictions and net assets with donor restrictions. In addition, the guidance requires enhanced disclosures about liquidity and expenses by both their natural and functional classification, among other changes.

In June 2018, the FASB issued ASU 2018-08, Clarifying the Scope and the Accounting Guidance for Contributions Received and Contributions Made. The amendments in this ASU assist entities in: (1) evaluating whether transactions should be accounted for as contributions (nonreciprocal transactions) within the scope of Topic 958, Not-for-Profit Entities, or as exchange (reciprocal) transactions subject to other guidance; and (2) determining whether a contribution is conditional. For contributions, an entity should follow the guidance in Subtopic 958-605, whereas for exchange transactions, an entity should follow other guidance (for example, Topic 606, Revenue from Contracts with Customers). Management has adopted this ASU in fiscal year 2019 and there was no impact upon adoption.

#### Recent Accounting Pronouncements

In May 2014, the FASB issued ASU 2014-09, Revenue from Contracts with Customers (Topic 606), which is a comprehensive new revenue recognition standard that will supersede existing revenue recognition guidance. The core principle of the guidance is that an entity should recognize revenue to depict the transfer of promised goods or services to customers in an amount that reflects the consideration to which the entity expects to be entitled in exchange for those goods or services. Management is currently evaluating the effect the provisions of this ASU will have on the consolidated financial statements.

In February 2016, the FASB issued ASU 2016-02, Leases (Topic 842). The guidance in this ASU supersedes the leasing guidance in Topic 840, Leases. Under the new guidance, lessees are required to recognize lease assets and lease liabilities on the statement of financial position for all leases with terms longer than 12 months. Leases will be classified as either finance or operating, with classification affecting the pattern of expense recognition in the statement of activities. Management is currently evaluating the impact of the pending adoption of the new standard on the financial statements.

#### NOTE D - CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The Organization maintains demand deposits and money market funds at financial institutions. At times, certain balances held in these accounts may not be fully guaranteed by the United States government. The uninsured portions of cash and money market accounts are backed solely by the assets of the financial institution. Therefore, the failure of a financial institution could result in a financial loss to the Organization. However, the Organization has not experienced losses on these accounts in the past and management believes the risk of loss, if any, to be minimal.

Advances for program work represent refundable advances of cash received from non-governmental organizations. They are reported as advances because there is typically a barrier placed by the granting organization, as well as a right of return if the funds are not used in accordance with the terms of the arrangement with the funding organization. Once the barriers are overcome and there is no longer a right of return, revenue is recognized.

#### **NOTE I - DEBT**

#### Citizens Bank

World Education, Inc. has a revolving line of credit with a bank with a borrowing limit of up to \$500,000. The revolving line of credit was renewed on September 10, 2018. The loan is payable on demand. Interest is charged by utilizing a fluctuating rate based on the LIBOR (Advantage) rate plus 2.50%. The line of credit remains in effect until May 31, 2020 and annually thereafter contingent upon performance. The loan is collateralized by a first priority interest in all the assets of World Education, Inc. No funds were borrowed during the year and as a result, as of June 30, 2019, the outstanding balance is \$0 and no interest was incurred on this loan during the year ended June 30, 2019.

#### John Snow, Inc.

World Education, Inc. has an unsecured revolving line of credit with John Snow, Inc. (a related party) with a borrowing limit of up to \$1,000,000. The loan was renewed on July 1, 2019. Interest is charged by utilizing a fluctuating rate based on the current prime rate plus 0.25%. The loan is payable on demand and, in any event, on or prior to June 30, 2022. The loan is not collateralized. No funds were borrowed during the year and as a result, as of June 30, 2019, the outstanding balance is \$0. No interest was incurred on this loan during the year ended June 30, 2019 (See Note Q):

#### **NOTE J - CONTINGENCIES**

In accordance with the terms of its federal and state grants and contracts, the records of the Organization are subject to audit. The Organization is, therefore, contingently liable for any disallowed costs. Management believes that any adjustment which might result from such an audit would be immaterial.

JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. is a co-borrower (with a related party) of a demand loan with no balance due at September 30, 2019. Management believes that the co-borrower is current on the loan and that its collateral exceeds the balance due (See Note Q).

Provisional indirect cost rates are negotiated with the United States Agency for International Development (AID) on an annual basis. As of September 30, 2019, actual indirect cost rates have been approved by AID for JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. through December 31, 2014 and World Education, Inc. through

June 30, 2018. Based on favorable past experience, management believes the effects of changes to the overhead rates, if any, would not be material to the consolidated financial statements.

#### NOTE K NET ASSETS WITH DONOR RESTRICTIONS

During the year ended June 30, 2019, the Organization received \$46,777 of restricted donations. The donations are restricted for use in specific programs and/or projects that are specified by the donor.

#### **NOTE L - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

#### John Snow, Inc.

JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. (an exempt organization) and John Snow, Inc. (a non-exempt corporation) purchase consulting services from each other. Mr. Joel Lamstein is President and Director of both organizations, and is the sole stockholder of John Snow, Inc. The two companies bill each other at the same rates that they bill the federal and state governments.

During the year ended September 30, 2019, John Snow, Inc. billed JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. \$28,335,233 for consulting services (technical support). This amount is reflected under program services - consulting totaling \$15,311,055 and program services - other costs totaling \$13,024,177 on the consolidated statement of functional expenses. In addition, JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. performed consulting services (technical support) for John Snow, Inc. totaling \$7,658,189.

The two companies also share facilities and pool various overhead expenses. For the year ended September 30, 2019, JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. incurred \$23,073,571 of overhead expenses (supporting services), of which \$9,292,686 was its share of John Snow, Inc. incurred costs.

JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. is a co-borrower with John Snow, Inc. on a commercial demand loan-revolving line of credit with an expiration date of May 31, 2020, which allows for borrowings up to \$6,500,000. The loan is collateralized by a security agreement with a first position lien on all corporate assets of JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. and John Snow, Inc. including assignment of promissory notes and security documents between the two companies. Interest is charged by utilizing a fluctuating rate based on LIBOR (Advantage) plus 2.00% payable monthly in arrears, which at September 30, 2019 was 3.826%. At September 30, 2019, a balance of \$0 was outstanding on the loan.

During the year, the Company had various accounts payable due from and to John Snow, Inc. At September 30, 2019, the accounts receivable balance is \$0 and the accounts payable balance is \$369,577.

World Education, Inc. has an agreement with John Snow, Inc. whereby John Snow, Inc. will provide administrative and technical support as requested from time to time by WEI, on arms-length terms as agreed by WEI and JSI. Transactions between World Education, Inc. and John Snow, Inc. for the year ended June 30, 2019 are summarized as follows:

#### **NOTE M - RETIREMENT PLANS**

JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. has a defined contribution profit sharing/401(k) plan covering substantially all its employees. Employee contributions are voluntary. The Company contributes an amount equal to 7% of the employee's monthly earnings, funded with each month's payroll. In addition, employees will receive a 100% match on the first 2% of contributions made to their retirement account. Employees who are contributing less than 2% of their pay to their retirement account will automatically be enrolled at 2% either at the time of hire, or annually in July. The Plan was effective April 11, 1979. Pension expense was \$2,458,753 for the year ended September 30, 2019.

World Education, Inc. provides retirement benefits to substantially all employees under a plan. World Education, Inc.'s contributions of 7% of employee salaries are used to purchase individual annuities. Additional voluntary contributions may be made by the employees. Participants of the plan are fully and immediately vested when contributions are made. Pension costs incurred by World Education, Inc. were \$360,907 for the year ended June 30, 2019.

#### **NOTE N - COMMITMENTS**

#### Operating Leases

The JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. leases space for general offices under operating leases expiring from 2019 through 2026. The leases contain renewal options for periods of up to five years.

#### **NOTE R - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

The Organization has evaluated subsequent events through August 5, 2020, the date on which the consolidated financial statements were available to be issued. The COVID-19 pandemic, whose effects first became known in March 2020, is having a broad and negative impact on commerce and financial markets around the world. The extent of the impact of COVID-19 on the Organization's operational and financial performance will depend on certain developments, including the duration and spread of the outbreak and its impact on the Organization's funding agencies, employees and vendors, all of which at present cannot be determined. Accordingly, the extent to which COVID-19 may impact the Organization's financial position and changes in net assets and cash flows is uncertain and the accompanying consolidated financial statements include no adjustments relating to the effects of this pandemic.

#### REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, to enter into a **Sole Source** amendment to an existing contract with JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc., d/b/a Community Health Institute (VC#161611-B001), Bow, NH, to continue providing a broad range of support services across a number of public health programs, by increasing the price limitation by \$457,745 from \$5,932,505 to \$6,390,250 and by extending the completion date from June 30, 2021 to December 31, 2021 effective upon Governor and Council approval. 72% Federal Funds. 5% General Funds. 23% Other Funds (Pharmaceutical Rebates and Public Health Protection).

The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on June 21, 2017, Item #51. It was subsequently amended with Governor and Council approval on February 21, 2018, Item #8; April 17, 2019, Item #19; October 2, 2019, Item #14; and June 24, 2020, Item #43. It was amended with Governor approval on May 29, 2020, as presented to the Executive Council on June 24, 2020, as Informational Item #F; as amended with Governor approval on July 31, 2020, as presented to the Executive Council on August 26, 2020, as Informational Item #N; and as amended with Governor and Council approval on November 18, 2020, Item #34.

The Governor approved \$415,000 of COVID-19 funding included in this amendment request on April 11, 2021 date, which is included as an informational item in this agenda, to support COVID-19 vaccination efforts.

Funds are anticipated to be available in State Fiscal Year 2022, upon the availability and continued appropriation of funds in the future operating budget, with the authority to adjust budget line items within the price limitation and encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

#### **EXPLANATION**

This request is Sole Source because the Department is extending contract beyond the completion date and there are no renewal options available. The need for the services provided under this agreement increased substantially to support the State's strategic response to COVID-19 and three sole source amendments were approved by the Governor for these critical services. Because of the uncertainties presented during the past year, the Department did not seek to reprocure services mid-pandemic to ensure consistency through an evolving situation. The Department intends to competitively reprocure services by December 31, 2021. It is in the best

interest of the State to continue to utilize the existing vendor to maintain continuity of support and efficient delivery of services.

The purpose of this request is to extend the current agreement for six (6) months while the Department competitively reprocures the services included in this agreement. The Contractor will continue to provide a broad range of public health professional support services that includes, but is not limited to: developing and implementing risk and needs assessments; training programs; developing educational materials; planning for large statewide conferences as well as smaller meetings and conferences; providing technical assistance to local partners; and providing subject matter expertise.

All NH residents may be reached through these efforts, specifically the education programs related to radon, lead poisoning, and immunization.

The Contractor will continue to provide support to the following programs:

- Public Health Preparedness This agreement provides the Department with public health nurses as well as other professionals trained in emergency preparedness and response, including disease investigations, contact tracing and training programs for public health responders.
- Radon Program This agreement supports the development and delivery of stakeholder engagement; public outreach and education; and an inventory of existing municipal policies and ordinances.
- Healthy Home's and Lead Poisoning Prevention Program This agreement supports
  the ongoing outreach and education to stakeholders that include medical providers,
  families living in pre-1978 properties with children 72 months and younger,
  contractors, and landlords
- Immunization program This agreement supports an Immunization Coalition with the goal of developing education and outreach tools for medical professionals and the general public.
- Climate Program This agreement supports interventions undertaken by Regional Public Health Networks and assesses how they are building community resilience to the health impacts from severe weather and climate change. Environmental public tracking was removed because of reduced federal funds.
- Home Visiting program This agreement supports access to on-line developmental screening for children to support access to appropriate services.

The Department will monitor contracted services using the following performance measures:

- 85% of conference participants rate the elements pertaining to conference logistics as not less than 'Very Good' in evaluation surveys.
- 85% of workgroup participants rate elements pertaining to workgroup logistics as not less than 'Very Good' in evaluation surveys.
- 85% of planning group members rate meeting logistics as not less than 'Very Good' in evaluation surveys.
- 90% of all requests for high-priority consultation services are responded to within twenty-four (24) hours.
- 90% of all requests for high-priority technical assistance are responded to within twenty-four (24) hours.

#### **Scope of Services**

#### 1. Provisions Applicable to All Services

- 1.1. The Contractor will submit a detailed description of the language assistance services they will provide to persons with limited English proficiency to ensure meaningful access to their programs and/or services within ten (10) days of the contract effective date.
- 1.2. The Contractor agrees that, to the extent future legislative action by the New Hampshire General Court or federal or state court orders may have an impact on the Services described herein, the State Agency has the right to modify Service priorities and expenditure requirements under this Agreement so as to achieve compliance therewith.
- 1.3. The Contractor shall provide a broad range of public health professional support services including, but not limited to:
  - 1.3.1. Conducting needs assessments.
  - 1.3.2. Develop and implement prevention-focused training programs.
  - 1.3.3. Providing logistical support for conferences and meetings.
  - 1.3.4. Providing technical assistance ensuring subject matter experts are available to Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Division of Public Health Services (DPHS) contractors.
  - 1.3.5. Developing educational materials.
  - 1.3.6. Developing and implementing evaluation plans.
  - 1.3.7. Assisting the Department with updating strategic plans.
  - 1.3.8. Maximizing the efficient use of resources.
  - 1.3.9. Overseeing programs as directed by the Department.
  - 1.3.10. Conducting HIV and Hepatitis Community Vulnerability Assessments.


#### 2. Scope of Work

#### 2.1. Develop and Implement Needs Assessments

- 2.1.1. Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program (MIECHV)/Maternal and Child Health Section (MCH)
  - 2.1.1.1. In consultation with MIECHV/MCH staff, facilitate a training needs assessment for eleven (11) MIECHV contracted home visiting sites.

#### 2.1.2. Infections Disease Prevention, Investigation & Care

- 2.1.2.1. The Contractor shall conduct a needs assessment to determine service needs among affected populations. The Contractor shall:
  - 2.1.2.1.1. Gather information from People Living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHA) as well as from their families and caregivers in order to identify common themes and trends through qualitative data gathering



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processes that will yield:

- 2.1.2.1.1.1. Qualitative feedback for the needs assessment.
- 2.1.2.1.1.2. Survey questions to be utilized in a questionnaire that will be conducted to targeted statewide populations including, but not limited to individuals who:

  - 2.1.2.1.1.2.2. Have comorbidities that may include but are not limited to Tuberculosis, Sexually Transmitted Diseases, Hepatitis C, Mental Illness, and/or substance use disorders.
- 2.1.2.1.2. Create statistical reports that reflect results of the survey.
- 2.1.2.1.3. Analyze the data to obtain information to generate recommendations.
- 2.1.2.1.4. Share preliminary results with the Bureau of Infectious Disease Prevention, Investigation and Care Services (ID-PICS) Section in order to obtain input for final recommendations that will be submitted to the Department.
- 2.1.2.1.5. Ensure that priority PLWHA populations are included in the Needs Assessment.
- 2.1.2.2. The Contractor shall identify the extent to which services identified in the inventory of resources are accessible, available, appropriate, affordable and acceptable to PLWHA. The Contractor shall:
  - 2.1.2.2.1. Estimate capacity of how much of each service can be provided.
  - 2.1.2.2.2. Assess capability of how well providers provide services, including expertise of agency staff and its accessibility.

- 2.1.2.4. The Contractor shall conduct a thorough assessment of unmet needs for PLWHA who know their status but are not enrolled in primary care services.

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2.1.2.5. The Contractor shall make recommendations to the Department based on quantitative and qualitative data on service needs, resources and barriers to assist with setting priorities and allocating resources.

#### 2.1.3. HIV Comprehensive Needs Assessment (HIV-CAN)

- 2.1.3.1. The Contractor shall conduct an HIV Comprehensive Needs Assessment (HIV-CAN) that is in compliance with the rules, regulations and policies outlined by U.S. Health Resources Services Administration (HRSA, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Department.
- 2.1.3.2. The Contractor shall comply with all applicable responsibilities outlined in the HRSA National Monitoring Standards, as instructed by the Department.
- 2.1.3.3. The Contractor shall ensure the HIV-CAN process is compliant with needs assessment principles and strategies outlined in the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Part B Manual and by the Department.
- 2.1.3.4. The Contract shall ensure the HIV-CAN includes all specific components as outlined and detailed by HRSA, CDC and the Department including but not limited to:
  - 2.1.3.4.1. Epidemiologic Overview.
  - 2.1,3.4.2. HIV Care Continuum.
  - 2.1.3.4.3. Financial and Human Resources Inventory.
  - 2.1.3.4.4. Assessment of Needs, Gaps and Barriers.
  - 2.1.3.4.5. Data Access, Sources and Systems.
- 2.1.3.5. The Contractor shall produce a document that includes all five (5) components outlined above.

#### 2.1.4. Epidemiological Profile

- 2.1.4.1. The Contractor shall maintain regular contact with the Department throughout the life of the contract through:
  - 2.1.4.1.1. Quarterly in-person meetings with Department staff;
  - 2.1.4.1.2. Weekly emails and/or telephone calls.
- 2.1.4.2. The Contractor shall review HIV surveillance data, as provided by the BIDC, and create an epidemiological profile report for Department review.
- 2.1.4.3. The Contractor shall ensure the epidemiological profile report:
  - 2.1.4.3.1. Summarizes pertinent information including but not limited to prevalence, incidence, and unmet need data by:
    - 2.1.4.3.1.1. Age.
    - 2.1.4.3.1.2. Gender.
    - 2.1.4.3.1.3. Race/ethnicity.
    - 2.1.4.3.1.4: Transmission mode.

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- 2.1.4.3.1.5. Geographic area.
- 2.1.4.3.2. Identifies descriptive trends in HIV and associated comorbidities since case reporting by name began in 2005.
- 2.1.4.4. The Contractor shall create a profile that projects the status of the HIV epidemic, statewide, over the next three (3) to five (5) years, and includes and comorbidities, which may include, but is not limited to:
  - 2.1.4.4.1. Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STDs).
  - 2.1.4.4.2.: Tuberculosis (TB).
  - 2.1.4.4.3. Hepatitis associated with the HIV/AID epidemic in NH.
- 2.1.4.5. The Contractor shall provide community population estimates, in writing, to the Department that include, but are not limited to:
  - 2.1.4.5.1. The number of individuals diagnosed and living with HIV/AIDS within each Public Health Region.
  - 2.1.4.5.2. A comparison of the rates and percentages for the state.

- 2.1.4.7. The Contractor shall publish the epidemiological profile in compliance with state and federal security and confidentiality guidelines and DPHS Data Release Policy, ensuring clients cannot be identified as a result of the published data.



#### REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, to enter into an amendment to an existing Sole Source contract with JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc., d/b/a Community Health Institute (VC#161611-B001), Bow, NH to continue providing a broad range of support services across a number of public health programs, by increasing the price limitation by \$323,546 from \$5,193,959 to \$5,517,505 with no change to the contract completion date of June 30, 2021 effective upon Governor and Council approval. 95% Federal Funds, 5% Other Funds (Radiological Health Fees).

The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on June 21, 2017, Item #51. It was subsequently amended with Governor and Council approval on February 21, 2018, Item #8; April 17, 2019, Item #19; October 2, 2019, Item #14; and June 24, 2020, Item #43. It was amended with Governor approval on May 29, 2020, as presented to the Executive Council on June 24, 2020, as Informational Item #F; and amended with Governor approval on July 31, 2020, as presented to the Executive Council on August 26, 2020, as Informational Item #N.

Funds are available in the following accounts for State Fiscal Year 2021, with the authority to adjust budget line items within the price limitation and encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

#### EXPLANATION

This request is **Sole Source** because Amendment #2 increased the total price limitation by more than ten percent (10%) of the original contract value.

The purpose of this request is to support the Radon Program in the development and delivery of stakeholder engagement; public outreach and education; and an inventory of existing municipal policies and ordinances. The Contractor will help coordinate and support the delivery of two radon prevention trainings sessions that will focus on outreach and education for real estate professionals. In addition, the Contractor will conduct an inventory of existing policies and ordinances at the municipal level for radon in new construction, mitigation and testing of public buildings.

The Healthy Homes and Lead Poisoning Prevention Program (HHLPPP) is requesting the Contractor to provide continued support with:





Pursuant to RSA 4:45, RSA 21-P:43, and Section 4 of Executive Order 2020-04, as extended by Executive Orders 2020-05, 2020-08, 2020-09, 2020-10, 2020-14, and 2020-15, Governor Sununu authorized the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services to enter into a Retroactive, Sole Source amendment to an existing contract with JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. (d/b/a Community Health Institute) (VC#161611-8001), Bow, NH, for the provision of public health emergency preparedness support services for the COVID-19 pandemic, by increasing the price limitation by \$725,000 from \$4;468,859 to \$5,193,959, effective retroactive to July 1, 2020, with no change to the contract completion date of June 30, 2021, 100% Federal Funds

The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on June 21, 2017, Item #51. It was then subsequently amended with Governor and Council approval on February 21, 2018, Item #8; April 17, 2019, Item #19; October 2, 2019, Item #14; and June 24, 2020, Item #43. It was amended with Governor approval on May 29, 2020, and was presented to the Governor and Council on June 24, 2020, as Informational Item #F.

Funds are available in the following accounts for State Fiscal Year 2021, with the authority to adjust budget line items within the price limitation and encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

#### **EXPLANATION**

This amendment is retroactive because this Contractor was able to immediately provide professional staff in March to begin work at the Department's Public Health COVID-19 Operations Center. Additional funding for services in July is needed because all budgeted funds have been expended. This amendment is Sole. Source because MOP 150 requires: (1) any subsequent amendment to a sole source contract be labeled as a sole source item; and (2) any amendment increasing the price limitation by more than 10 percent of the original price limitation be identified as sole source. The purpose of this amendment is to pay for the increased support that was provided to assist with the ongoing public health emergency response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Contractor has been providing the Department with public health nurses as well as other professionals trained in emergency preparedness and response, including disease investigations and contact tracing.

#### - REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, to enter into a Sole Source amendment to an existing contract with JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc., d/b/a Community Health Institute (VC#161611-B001), Bow, NH to continue providing a broad range of support services across a number of public health programs, by increasing the price limitation by \$132,000 from \$4,336,959 to \$4,468,959 with no change to the contract completion date of June 30, 2021 effective upon Governor and Council approval. 49% Federal Funds. 51% Other Funds (Governor Commission Funds).

The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on June 21, 2017, Item #51 and was subsequently amended as approved by Governor and Council approval on February 21, 2018, Item #8, as amended and approved by Governor and Council on April 17, 2019, Item #19, as amended and approved by Governor and Council on October 2, 2019, Item #14 and most recently amended with Governor approval on May 29, 2020.

Funds are available in the following accounts for State Fiscal Years 2020 and 2021, with the authority to adjust budget line items within the price limitation and encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

See attached fiscal details.

#### **EXPLANATION**

This request is Sole Source because Amendment #2 increased the total price limitation by more than ten percent (10%) of the original contract value.

The purpose of this request is for the Contractor to evaluate the interventions undertaken by Regional Public Health Networks and assess how they are building community resilience to the health impacts from severe weather and climate change. Funding for the Home Visiting program has been modified across funding streams, in order to expand access for the program and also expand access to on-line developmental screening for children to support access to appropriate services. For the HIV Prevention program, the Contractor will procure, manage and self-testing HIV kits and other prevention supplies to individuals and develop and maintain an online ordering system to request these items. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention is encouraging states to pilot in-home, self-testing initiatives in response to COVID-19 and its impact on patient's ability to be seen in person for HIV testing.

The Contractor will providing increased services for the Maternal and Child Health, Climate and Health Adaptation, and HIV Prevention. For Maternal and Child Health, the Contractor will be providing technical assistance to agencies providing developmental screening to support access to online screening tools for families. In addition, the Contractor will provide logistical and planning support for a semi-annual conference for Department staff that will focus on children and families. For the Climate and Health Adaptation program, the Contract will be providing training for the Department and local partners on tick-safe practices. As a part of the training, materials and guides will be provided to the participants. For HIV Prevention, the Contractor will be developing and maintaining an online ordering system for NH residents to request prevention and self-testing supplies.

The Department will monitor contracted services using the following performance measures:

- A minimum of 85% of conference planning committee member's rate conference logistical support for conferences as not less than 'Very Good' in evaluation surveys.
- A minimum of 85% of conference participants rate the elements pertaining to conference logistics as not less than 'Very Good' in evaluation surveys.

Should the Governor and Council not authorize this request there will be reduced access to online developmental screening for young children. In addition, without access to HIV prevention there is a potential for increased rates of HIV due to a decrease in access prevention and testing.

Pursuant to RSA 4:45, RSA 21-P:43, and Section 4 of Executive Order 2020-04 as extended by Executive Orders 2020-05, 2020-08, and 2020-09, Governor Sununu has authorized the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, to enter into a Retroactive, Sole Source amendment to an existing contract with JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc. (d/b/a Community Health Institute) (VC#161611-8001), Bow, NH for the provision of public health emergency preparedness support services for the COVID-19 pandemic, by increasing the price limitation by \$150,000 from \$4,186,959 to \$4,336,959, effective retroactive to March 16, 2020, with no change to the contract completion date of June 30, 2021, 100% Federal Funds

The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on June 21, 2017, Item #51. It was then subsequently amended with Governor and Council approval on February 21, 2018, Item #8; on April 17, 2019, Item #19; and on October 2, 2019, Item #14.

Funds are available in the following accounts for State Fiscal Years 2020 and 2021, with the authority to adjust budget line items within the price limitation and encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

#### **EXPLANATION**

This Item is Retroactive and Sole Source because this Contractor was able to immediately provide professional staff in March to begin work at the Department's Public Health COVID-19 Operations Center. The purpose of this amendment is to pay for the increased support that was provided to assist with the ongoing public health emergency response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Contractor has been providing the Department with public health nurses as well as other professionals trained in emergency preparedness and response, including disease investigations and contact tracing. The Contractor is also responsible to submit an after-action review of the Division of Public Health Services' initial response to the COVID-19 pandemic from December 2019 through March 2020.

#### REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services. Division of Public Health Services. to retroactively exercise a renewal option to an existing sole source agreement with JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc., d/b/a Community Health Institute, (Vendor #161611-B001) 501 South Street, 2nd Floor, Bow, NH 03304 to continue providing a broad range of support services across a number of public health programs by increasing the price limitation by \$2,266,254 from \$1,920,705 to \$4,186,959 and by extending the contract completion date from June 30, 2019 to June 30, 2021 effective retroactive to June 30, 2019 upon Governor and Executive Council approval. 81.61% Federal Funds, 12.54% General Funds, and 5.85% Other Funds.

The original contract was approved by the Governor and Executive Council on June 21, 2017 (Item #51), as amended (Amendment #1) and approved by the Governor and Executive Council on February 21, 2018 (Item #8) and as amended (Amendment #2) and approved by the Governor and Executive Council on April 17, 2019 (Item #19)

Funds to support this request are anticipated to be available in the following accounts for State Fiscal Years 2020 and 2021 upon the availability and continued appropriation of funds in the future operating budget, with authority to adjust amounts within the price limitation and adjust encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

#### FISCAL DETAILS ATTACHED

#### **EXPLANATION**

This request is retroactive because the Department experienced delays in sending the amendment to the Contractor for execution due to the extensive updates in the scope of services that were needed to ensure comprehensive delivery of services.

This request is sole source because Amendment #1 increased the total price limitation by more than ten percent (10%) of the original contract value

As referenced in the Request for Proposals and in the Exhibit C-1 of this contract, the Department may extend contract services for up to two (2) years, contingent upon satisfactory delivery of services. available funding, agreement of the parties and approval of the Governor and Executive Council. The Department is in agreement with renewing contracted services for two (2) years at this time.

In State Fiscal Year 2019 the vendor received funding to conduct a data-driven vulnerability assessment to identify communities most vulnerable to an infectious disease outbreak due to injection drug use. The findings will be utilized to allocate tuture resources for the prevention of infectious diseases

related to injection drug use: These are one-time funds from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, which will end on November 30, 2019. This vulnerability assessment is a requirement of the federal Public Health Crisis Response grant.

The Contractor will implement a broad range of public health professional services to increase the capacity of local, regional, and state-level public health practitioners to provide high-quality public health services to NH citizens and ensure successful outcomes across nine (9) Division of Public Health programs and the Department's Emergency Services unit. These include transparent and informed community engagement and planning, needs assessments, and evaluation processes; supporting large conferences and training programs; and enhancing the knowledge and skills among community based agencies providing public health services.

The Contractor currently provides a broad range of public health professional support services including, but not limited to developing and implementing risk and needs assessments; training programs; developing educational materials; planning for large statewide conferences as well as smaller meetings and conferences; serving as a fiscal agent for the Department, including entering into subcontracts; providing technical assistance to local partners; and providing subject matter expertise.

Should the Governor and Executive Council not authorize this request, the Department may lack the ability to strategically direct infectious disease prevention services to communities; offer large conferences, trainings, and consultation services to community-based agencies providing public health services; and conduct a needs assessment and evaluation process to improve services. The Department may not meet the key deliverables of this award if these funds are not made available to complete this project.

#### REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, to enter into a sole source amendment to an existing agreement with JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc., d/b/a Community Health Institute, Vendor #161611-8001, 501 South Street, 2<sup>rd</sup> Floor, Bow, NH 03304 to provide a broad range of support services across a number of public health programs by increasing the price limitation by \$342,125 from \$1,578,580 to \$1,920,705, effective upon date of Governor and Council approval, with no change to the completion date of June 30, 2019, 81,61% Federal Funds, 12,54% General Funds, and 5.85% Other Funds.

The original contract was approved by the Governor and Executive Council on June 21, 2017 (Item #51), as amended (Amendment #1) and approved by the Governor and Executive Council on February 21, 2018 (Item #8).

Funds are available in the following accounts in State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2018 and 2019, with authority to adjust amounts within the price limitation and adjust encumbrances between State Fiscal Years through the Budget Office without approval from Governor and Executive Council, if needed and justified.

#### FISCAL DETAILS ATTACHED.

#### EXPLANATION

This request is sole source because the amount of additional funding exceeds ten percent (10%) of the original contract value and because the Department is adding to the current scope of work for the contract period. These additional services are required to effectively implement activities included in the Division's federal funding agreements for the current state fiscal year.

The funding contained in this Contract will pay for implementing a statewide opioid related vulnerability assessment as part of the Department's response to the opioid crisis; facilitate meetings of the Home Visiting Task Force and its workgroups; conduct 10 (ten) jurisdictional risk assessments addressing public health emergencies; procure and distribute additional HIV testing supplies based on an increase in need; distribute funding to support 13 (thirteen) regional

Medical Reserve Corps units and 2 (two) Regional Public Health Networks to regional priorities addressing environmental public health issues; and develop outreach materials to support the Regional Public Health Networks.

The Contractor currently provides a broad range of public health professional support services including, but not limited to developing and implementing risk and needs assessments; training programs; developing educational materials; planning for large statewide conferences as well as smaller meetings and conferences; serving as a fiscal agent for the Department, including entering into subcontracts; providing technical assistance to local partners; and providing subject matter expertise.

The funding provided through this amendment will be used to fund and expand the following support services:

- Opioid Assessment services: The contractor will conduct a statewide HIV and viral
  hepatitis community vulnerability assessment in order to identify areas of the state
  that can be targeted for services to prevent the transmission of these infections in
  people with substance use disorder. This activity is a requirement of federal opioid
  crisis funding.
- Public Health Emergency Preparedness services: The contractor will conduct
   Jurisdictional Risk Assessments in collaboration with at least 10 (ten) public health
   preparedness coordinators from the 13 (thirteen) organizations funded to provide
   Public Health Network services. These assessments will be used to identify the
   public health threats of greatest concern in each region and to develop strategies
   to mitigate them. This activity is a requirement of federal preparedness funding.
   The contractor will also increase the amount of funding in current subcontracts that
   support 13 (thirteen) regional Medical Reserve Corps units.
- HIV Prevention services: The contractor will purchase and distribute additional HIV testing supplies to community partners to meet an increase in need due to the opioid epidemic. Early diagnosis and treatment of people infected with HIV helps to prevent further transmission of this virus in the community and improves health outcomes for people living with HIV. In addition, funds will be utilized to bring together community stakeholders to address the goals of the NH HIV Integrated Plan to end HIV in NH and to support targeted media and marketing efforts to promote the prevention of HIV among those at highest risk of acquiring the infection.
- Environmental Public Health Tracking services: The contractor will increase the
  amount of funding in current subcontracts with 2 (two) Regional Public Health
  Networks to develop and distribute training materials related to reducing health
  risks from the environment and utilize these materials during in-person trainings
  and workshops with regional partners.
- Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting Grant Program services: The
  contractor will facilitate and provide logistical support to Home Visiting Task Force
  Meetings and participation in workgroup meetings, such as Data System, Strategic
  Planning, and Communications workgroups; conduct a strategic planning session

of the Parent Advisory Council; and increase the current technical assistance and accreditation support for Home Visiting Programs funded by the Department.

 Preventative Health and Services Block Grant programs: The contractor will develop outreach materials to increase the level of awareness of the Regional Public Health Networks.

As referenced in the Request for Proposals and in Exhibit C-1 of this contract, the Department may amend the current agreement, contingent upon satisfactory delivery of services, available funding, agreement of the parties and approval of the Governor and Executive Council.

Should the Governor and Executive Council not authorize this request, the Department will lack the ability to collect and analyze data necessary to conduct jurisdictional risk assessments in accordance with COC requirements, procure and distribute necessary additional HIV testing supplies, conduct a statewide opioid related vulnerability assessments in accordance with CDC requirements; support an increased level of activity in the 13 (thirteen) Medical Reserve Corps units and 3 (three) Regional Public Health Networks addressing environmental health problems; and support the Home Visiting Task Force and Parent Advisory Council.

Area served: Statewide.

Source of Funds: Funds being added are 81.61% Federal (the Public Health Emergency Preparedness Program, the Hospital Preparedness Program, the Environmental Public Health Tracking Program, the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting Grant Program, the Preventative Health and Services Block Grant Program, the HIV Integrated Prevention and Surveillance Program, and the Opioid Assessment Program), 12.54% General (the Public Health Emergency Preparedness Program), and 5.85% Other (Pharmaceutical Rebates).

- In the event that the Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program.



Should Governor and Executive Council not authorize this Request, there will be a reduced capacity to provide training to a range of public health partners on multiple health topics; host large scale conferences; develop plans to evaluate the effectiveness of services; develop and produce educational materials; and provide technical assistance to local and state partners.

JSI Research and Training Institute, Inc., dibla Community Health Institute was selected for this project through a competitive bid process. A Request for Proposals was posted on The Department of Health and Human Services' web site from March 10, 2017 through April 5, 2017. In addition, bidder's conference was held on March 20, 2017.

The Department received one proposal. The proposal was reviewed and scored by a team of individuals with program specific knowledge. The review included a thorough discussion of the strengths and weaknesses of the proposals/applications. The Bid Summary is attached.

As referenced in the Request for Proposals and in Exhibit C-1 of this contract, this Agreement has the option to extend for up to two (2) additional years, contingent upon satisfactory delivery of services, available funding, agreement of the parties and approval of the Governor and Council.

The performance measures/objectives that will be used to measure the effectiveness of the agreement are attached:

Area served: Statewide.
