REQUESTED ACTION

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of RSA 14:30-a, VI, Additional Revenues, authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, Bureau of Maternal and Child Health Services to accept and expend federal funds in the amount of \$143,198.00 from The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to fund the Opioid Surveillance program, effective the date of approval by the Fiscal Committee and the Governor and Council through June 30, 2017, and further authorize the funds to be allocated as follows. Grant funds awarded for periods after SFY 2017 will be included in the future operating budgets for SFY2018 and SFY 2019. 100% Federal Funds.
- 2. Pursuant to the provisions of NH RSA 124:15, Positions Restricted, and subject to the approval of item 1 above, authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, Maternal and Child Health Services, Opioid Surveillance program to establish an Opioid Overdose Surveillance Coordinator, utilizing funds from CDC, New Hampshire Enhanced State Surveillance of Opioid-Involved Morbidity and Mortality grant effective upon date of approval by the Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council, through June 30, 2017.

EXPLANATION

The federally funded *New Hampshire Enhanced State Surveillance of Opioid-Involved Morbidity and Mortality grant* (Opioid Surveillance Grant), will 1) support the development of quarterly reports on non-fatal opioid overdoses in the Emergency Department discharges (ED) or Emergency Medical Service (EMS) data using Automated Hospital Emergency Department Data (AHEDD) system and/or Trauma Emergency Medical Services Information System (TEMSIS) data; 2) enhance use of the New Hampshire National Violent Death Reporting Systems (NH-VDRS) to include accidental intent opioid overdose deaths (i.e. approximately 80 deaths in 2015) with annual aggregated reports available and ad-hoc queries available upon request; and 3) disseminate timely information to opioid overdose prevention partners to assist in informing and targeting program activities. Enhanced surveillance will assist key stakeholders in improving prevention and response efforts by providing more timely data on fatal and nonfatal opioid overdoses and more in-depth information on risk factors that can be targeted for intervention. The Division of Public Health Services, Injury Prevention Program staff are well positioned to coordinate the efforts across these systems because it has decades of working relationships with them on injury surveillance and prevention projects. For example, sharing data at annual state injury-related conferences, and assisting with urgent H1N1 flu epidemic data analysis.

Funds are budgeted as follows:

Class 020 - Current Expenses will be used to purchase general office supplies needed for the day to day work on this project.

Class 037 – PC Desktop Hardware - Replacement will be used to purchase a computer, if the laptop currently at the desk is not powerful enough to manage large data sets.

Class 038 - Desktop Software will be used to purchase basic and specialized software needed to facilitate data linkage.

Class 039 –Telecommunications will be used to provide telephone service to the Opioid Overdose Surveillance Coordinator.

Class 041 - Audit Fund Set Aside funds per state requirements

Class 042 -- Additional Fringe Benefits for post-retirement benefits per state requirements.

Class 059 -Temporary Full Time will fund 1.00 FTE The 1.00 FTE (Position # 9T2896), Planning Analyst/Data Systems/Opioid Overdose Surveillance Coordinator, working within the Maternal and Child Health Section, will serve as Principle Investigator on this grant ensuring that all grant objectives and reporting requirements are met, will be responsible for data access and analysis of statistical data and the methods of collection, processing and dissemination for opioid overdose surveillance requests and the development and release of overdose specific topic reports; will work in collaboration with the Bureau of Infectious Disease surveillance staff using the Automated Hospital Emergency Department Data Surveillance (AHEDD) and the Department of Justice, Office of Chief Medical Examiner New Hampshire (National) Violent Death Reporting System (NH-VDRS) Analyst providing vital records data on opioid-related deaths in New Hampshire; and will work with the New Hampshire Information and Analysis Center (NHIAC) providing surveillance data for reports. The NH Bureau of Drug and Alcohol excellent monthly Drug Monitoring Initiative already provides an (http://www.dhhs.nh.gov/dcbcs/bdas/data.htm) using some of these data. The new Opioid Overdose Surveillance Coordinator will assist in the enhancement of these reports according to the guidelines of this grant, and facilitate meetings between data partners and stakeholders who need to use these data.

Class 060 - Benefits for the position noted above.

Class 070 - In-State Travel Reimbursement funds will be used for travel by the Injury Prevention Program Manager, MCH/Injury Prevention Surveillance Analyst and Opioid Overdose Surveillance Coordinator for grant-related in-state meetings at Office of the Chief Medical Examiner for data quality assurance meetings, data dissemination meetings at the New Hampshire Information and Analysis Center (NHIAC), and to present data at injury prevention meetings state wide.

Class 080 - Out-Of-State Travel Reimbursement will be used by Injury Prevention Program Manager, MCH/Injury Prevention Surveillance Analyst and Opioid Overdose Surveillance Coordinator to attend: 1) CDC the required annual reverse site visit conference in Atlanta, GA; 2) The Annual International Society of Disease Surveillance Conference in Atlanta, GA; and 3) to send the Opioid Overdose Surveillance Coordinator to attend the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologist 2017 Annual Conference (CSTE) in Atlanta, GA.

Class 102 - Contracts for Program Services will be used for 2 contracts. The first contract will be with the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner (OCME) to enter accidental and undetermined manner opioid death cases into the National Violent Death Record System (NVDRS), which is already in place to track New Hampshire violent deaths. The Office of the Chief Medical Examiner will have the role of carrying out collection and abstraction of mortality data for this grant. The second contract will be with a vendor for short-term information Technology (IT) Service projects, to include, but not be limited to, the provision of application development, web services, infrastructure support, data center services, and other information technology services as required by the State

In brief the Opioid Overdose Surveillance Coordinator will serve as Principle Investigator on this grant ensuring that all grant objectives and reporting requirements are met, assist in the enhancement of the monthly Drug Monitoring Initiative reports according to CDC guidelines in this grant, and facilitate meetings between data partners and stakeholders who need to use these data.

3) Relationship to existing agency programs:

The activities will enhance collaboration between the Department of Health and Human Services, Maternal and Child Health, Injury Prevention Program and Infectious Disease Prevention, Syndromic Surveillance; the Department of State, NH Information & Analysis Center; and the Department of Justice, Office of Chief Medical Examiner, NH-VDRS program.

These funds were awarded August 24, 2016. It was not known that these funds would be available at the time the agency established its SFY 2016-2017 biennial budget.
