#### REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Office of the Commissioner, to enter into a **Sole Source** amendment to an existing contract with Deloitte Consulting, LLP (VC#174776), Concord, NH to complete additional enhanced data analytics for Opioid crisis response, pre-school development analytics and analysis impacting future community collaborations supporting children in New Hampshire, by increasing the price limitation by \$890,360 from \$9,440,150 to \$10,330,510 and by extending the contract completion date from June 30, 2022, to June 30, 2023, effective upon Governor and Council approval. 100% Federal Funds.

The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on May 1, 2019 (Item #18). It was amended with Governor and Council approval on December 18, 2019 (Item #14); amended with Governor approval on July 20, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on August 26, 2020 (Informational Item #A); amended with Governor approval on October 5, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on November 18, 2020 (Informational Item #L); amended with Governor approval on October 28, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on January 22, 2021 (Informational Item #A), amended with Governor approval on April 1, 2021, and presented to the Executive Council on May 19, 2021 (Informational Item #C), amended with Governor and Executive Council approval on September 15, 2021 (Item #16D-1), and amended with Governor and Executive Council approval on October 13, 2021 (Item #12A).

Funds are available in the following accounts for State Fiscal Year 2023, with the authority to adjust budget line items within the price limitation and encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

#### **EXPLANATION**

This amendment is **Sole Source** because the Department is requesting to extend the contract beyond the completion date and there are no renewal options available. The Department is seeking to extend the existing contract with Deloitte Consulting, LLP because the Contractor is uniquely positioned to immediately support the Department's efforts to integrate disparate data sets and improve data analytics, overall data quality, visualization, and reporting with existing data sources to support two (2) critical State initiatives that are designed to improve outcomes for individuals and families adversely impacted by the opioid crisis.

The Department is pursuing a new RFP to competitively bid future data analytics services in State Fiscal Year 2023 as an appropriation was made through the capital budget (House Bill

25 of the 2021 Regular Legislative Session). The current contract supports the State's strategic response to the Opioid crisis to proactively utilize data to guide the improvement of services and was originally competitively bid in the fall of 2018 (6 responses were received) and awarded in May 2019. When the contract was originally awarded, the Department could not foresee the COVID-19 pandemic and anticipate its negative exacerbating effects on the opioid crisis. Consequently, the needs for enhanced data functionality have increased rapidly throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.

Leveraging the foundation built through the use of Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) funding, the Department is looking to expand the understanding of the trends and metrics associated with the care coordination efforts achieved through the Doorway program and the Department's continuing partnership with Community Mental Health Centers (CMHCs) and federally qualified health centers (FQHCs). To accomplish this the Department will utilize existing subject matter experts within the Department to lead a professional services team comprised of specific skill sets and amend an existing contract with Deloitte Consulting, LLP.

The Contractor will provide the following work activities:

- Fully incorporate the Drug and Alcohol Services data sources (WITS) into the
  Enterprise Business Intelligence platform (EBI) by building the extracts,
  transformations, and loads of the data from their source systems into the target
  platform in accordance with the Department's data privacy and security policies
  and data governance processes;
- Integrate WITS data-with other data stored in EBI to support ongoing management of the substance use disorder system (e.g., Phoenix Mental Health System and Medicaid);
- Protect the records for non-state funded patients present in the data by excluding specific data from access and inclusion within data marts and/or reports that serve the Department's reporting on drug and alcohol services program participation;
- Build the data models, views, and dashboards to support both tabular-based dynamic reporting, published dynamic dashboards for both internal and external audiences that are searchable, as well as an ad hoc production environment for use by the Department to utilize the data models and views to slice and visualize information via standard tools (e.g., Excel, Tableau, and Web browser); and
- Identify and implement a strategy to deliver EBI data models to be accessed and utilized by Tableau report creators via the established internal data portal (available at https://ebi.nh.gov) utilizing existing the data governance model for access restrictions. The Contractor will provide the State with the necessary resources to bring solutions to integrate data from more than 25 program sources to establish an Early Childhood Integrated Data System (ECIDS) to collect, maintain, store and report information from early childhood programs across multiple agencies that serve families with children. Attachment #1 of this letter details the 18 different professional services areas that will be paid for through this amendment.

This data integration, data analytics, reporting, visualization work and continued expansion of the COVID-19 Response Management Business Intelligence components will allow for data driven decision-making assistance. As the utilization of the system has grown exponentially over the last two (2) years, and the ability to scale the architecture of the system

has been implemented, the Department is positioned to further capitalize on the reporting accuracy and efficiency of the system.

This letter represents formal notification that the Department of Information Technology (DoIT) has approved your agency's request to enter into a sole source contract amendment with Deloitte Consulting, of Concord, NH as described below and referenced as DoIT No. 2019-043H.

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Agreement approved by Governor and Council, as a result of RFP #2019-043, approved on May 1, 2019 (Item #18). It was amended with Governor and Council approval on December 18, 2019 (Item #14); amended with Governor approval on July 20, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on August 26, 2020 (Informational Item #A); amended with Governor approval on October 5, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on November 18, 2020 (Informational Item #L); amended with Governor approval on October 28, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on January 22, 2021 (Informational Item #A), amended with Governor approval on April 1, 2021, and presented to the Executive Council on May 19, 2021 (Informational Item #C), as amended with Governor and Executive Council approval on September 15, 2021 (Item #16D-1), and amended with Governor and Executive Council approval on October 13, 2021 Item #12A., (herein after referred to as the "Agreement"), Deloitte Consulting LLP (hereinafter referred to as "Contractor") agreed to provide certain services upon the terms and conditions specified in the Agreement and in consideration of payment by the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services (hereinafter referred to as the "Department"), certain sums as specified therein;

#### Scope of Work

The Contractor agrees to provide additional services and data totaling \$890,360 as set forth in Table 1.14 SFY 2023 Overdose Data to Action. For these services, the Contractor shall provide the identified staffing to support State-directed work. 



#### REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Office of the Commissioner, to enter into a **Sole Source** amendment to an existing contract with Deloitte Consulting, LLP (VC#174776), Concord, NH to complete additional enhanced data analytics for Opioid crisis response, pre-school development analytics and analysis impacting future community collaborations supporting children in New Hampshire, by increasing the price limitation by \$1,370,202 from \$8,069,948 to \$9,440,150 and by extending the contract completion date from November 29, 2021, to June 30, 2022, effective upon Governor and Council approval. 100% Other Funds.

The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on May 1, 2019 (Item #18). It was amended with Governor and Council approval on December 18, 2019 (Item #14); amended with Governor approval on July 20, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on August 26, 2020 (Informational Item #A); amended with Governor approval on October 5, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on November 18, 2020 (Informational Item #L); amended with Governor approval on October 28, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on January 22, 2021 (Informational Item #A), amended with Governor approval on April 1, 2021, and presented to the Executive Council on May 19, 2021 (Informational Item #C), and amended with Governor and Executive Council approval on September 15, 2021 (Item #16D-1).

Funds are available in the following accounts for State Fiscal Year 2022, with the authority to adjust budget line items within the price limitation and encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

See attached fiscal details.

#### **EXPLANATION**

This amendment is **Sole Source** because the Department is requesting to extend the contract beyond the completion date and there are no renewal options available. The Department is seeking to extend the existing contract with Deloitte Consulting, LLP because the Contractor is uniquely positioned to immediately support the Department's efforts to integrate disparate data sets and improve data analytics, overall data quality, visualization, and reporting with existing data sources to support three (3) critical State initiatives that are designed to improve outcomes for vulnerable young children, decrease opioid misuse and support opioid treatment, and reduce the number of children entering foster care.

The Department will be competitively bidding the services provided under this contract in Calendar Year 2022 as an appropriation was made through the capital budget (House Bill 25 of

response to the COVID-19 pandemic to address its effects on the opioid crisis and was originally competitively bid in the fall of 2018 (6 responses were received) and awarded in May 2019. When the contract was originally awarded, the Department could not foresee the COVID-19 pandemic and anticipate its negative exacerbating effects on the opioid crisis, vulnerable children, and the foster care system. Consequently, the needs for enhanced data functionality have increased rapidly through the COVID-19 pandemic.

The purpose of this amendment is to integrate new data sources and improve data analytics, overall data quality, visualization, and reporting with existing data sources to support three (3) efforts:

- Pre-school Development Grant Birth through age 8: This initiative seeks to better understand the current early childhood system and use the integrated data to strengthen the system, better address the needs of vulnerable young children and their families, and help build a solid foundation to improve outcomes for NH's children, families, schools, and communities. The Department, in collaboration with University of New Hampshire and Department of Education applied for and received an award for a grant to support a "data driven policy and program coordination team to work towards the vision of New Hampshire's families and young children having access to quality resources and supports within their communities to learn, grow and thrive." The Department is also collaborating with the Governor's early childhood council (NH Council for Thriving Children), and New Hampshire's early childhood advocates and practitioners on this initiative.
- Opioid Data to Action OD2A: Focuses on understanding and tracking the complex and changing nature of the drug overdose epidemic. Further, this effort highlights the need for the seamless integration of data into prevention strategies and enhancements to the State's Enterprise Business Intelligence (EBI) platform. Data integration and enhanced reporting will allow the Department to better address the goals of the OD2A program surrounding the opioid crisis. These enhancements will present new insights regarding the impact of opioids in New Hampshire and will allow the Department to monitor the effectiveness of State-led programs to decrease opioid misuse and support opioid treatment and recovery efforts.
- Community Collaborations to Strengthen and Preserve Families (CCSPF): This
  initiative is a grant in partnership with UNH goaled to establish an integrated continuum
  of family support, with community-based services such as mental health and
  substance misuse treatment, economic supports, home visiting, and educational
  programs, to prevent child abuse and neglect to ultimately reduce the number of
  children entering foster care. This effort is supported by funding provided by the United
  States Administration for Children and Families. The enhancements included in this
  amendment will support the strengthening of families through Community
  Collaborations to partner with UNH to analyze the de-identified data to address
  potential outcomes such as reduced child welfare referrals, reduced founded cases of
  child maltreatment and/or neglect, reduced out of home placement, and increased
  utilization of services designed to improve protective factors in families

The Department determined a sole source extension of the existing contract would be the most cost-effective and beneficial to support the aforementioned initiatives for the following reasons:

 Reduced time to delivery of data ingestion, data modeling and data visualization based on the teams integrated knowledge of the State of New Hampshire business processes, enterprise architecture and data integrations; His Excellency, Governor Christopher T. Sununu Page 3 of 5

- Reduced costs because the State leveraged the competitively bid rates included in Table 1.4 of the original contract (May 2019 G&C Agenda, Item #18, PDF page 54), and locked in at the rates negotiated in May 2019 – avoiding year-over-year increases per the original terms.
- Minimal startup costs as the data team is already working on existing projects and familiar with the data in question;
- Ability to achieve data driven results in a shorter period of time eliminating a competitive bidding process, which could delay the projects by at least six (6) months or longer depending on knowledge transfer and training needs for a new contractor;
- · Potential federal funding may be forfeited depending on length of delays; and
- Opportunity costs associated with not moving forward with a sole source are that more
  children will suffer maltreatment or neglect, additional home placement will be necessary
  and services will be increased due to lack of visibility to gaps that could have been
  addressed if the data was available sooner in the process as well as the reduced access
  for children to learn, grow and thrive as a result of not have access to the information
  associated with these federally funded activities to utilize data to drive changes in
  programs and services to improve outcomes.

The Contractor will provide the State with the necessary resources to bring solutions to integrate data from more than 25 program sources to establish an Early Childhood Integrated Data System (ECIDS) to collect, maintain, store and report information from early childhood programs across multiple agencies that serve families with children. Attachment #1 of this letter details the 18 different professional services areas that will be paid for through this amendment.

This data integration, data analytics, reporting, visualization work and continued expansion of the COVID-19 Response Management Business Intelligence components will allow for data driven decision-making assistance. As the utilization of the system has grown exponentially over the last two (2) years, and the ability to scale the architecture of the system has been implemented, the Department is positioned to further capitalize on the reporting accuracy and efficiency of the system.

New Hampshire's Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) and Department of Education (DOE) share in their mission to provide impactful supportive services across the state that improve outcomes for New Hampshire's youth, families, schools, and communities. Together, DHHS and DOE administer numerous programs that provide additional child development services for families of children with special needs, children at risk, or experiencing financial hardships.

New Hampshire is following a strategic plan to establish an early childhood integrated data system (ECIDS) to collect, integrate, maintain, store, and report information from early childhood programs across multiple agencies that serve families with children. The broad purpose of an ECIDS is to provide integrated, cross-program data that inform decisions about early childhood policies, services, and education.

The work activities described within this scope of services enables the State-owned EBI platform to become the central data repository to support analytics, dashboards, and reporting on early childhood programs. Through this amendment, the State seeks to integrate early childhood data from DHHS and DOE into the EBI environment to be able to answer questions about early childhood programs and participation across New Hampshire.

Examples of questions the State intends to answer and monitor from this initiative with dashboards include the following:

How many children are served ages 0-8 in public programs across the state?

- Goal: To know the number (and percent if denominator can be established) of children served:
  - o As a whole
  - o Count & population rate breakdowns by:
    - Age
    - Race or other demographic info
    - Geographic region (county, town, zip depending on availability)
    - Other child or family characteristics (ex: income/poverty, homelessness, health characteristics or social determinants of health, depending on what is available)
  - o Geographic mapping based on data availability

Concurrent and Subsequent Services and Enrollments

What combinations of services do children and families receive in a given time frame? What combinations of services do children and families receive as the child ages?

Goal: To know what services children and families most commonly receive at the same time, and to

know what common service paths children and families follow in order to provide coordinated care and transition services.

- Example data elements:
  - o Child identifying info name, DOB, other information (e.g., address, family info) as available: Note, identifying info shall only be used to establish links across programs, and find and merge duplicates. Identifiers would be secure and not accessible to anyone outside of designated staff. Person matching is a reliable, automated process. Any data that is brought into EBI follows the same security and governance policies as the original data source. Child attributes (i.e., race/ethnicity)
  - o County ID/Zip Code (or other geographic identifier)
  - o Program ID
  - o Program Name
  - o Participation (length of time in program)
  - Timeframe (years/date range included)

#### Scope of Work

The Contractor agrees to provide additional services and data totaling \$339,526 as set forth in Table 1.12, SFY 2022 Overdose Data to Action. For these services, the Contractor shall provide the identified staffing to support State-directed work. With Contractor PMO concurrence, the State will authorize Contractor activities for these Services on a weekly basis. These activities will be prioritized via Jira and Vendor will produce bi-weekly status reports, including hours incurred with resource burn down. The Contractor will invoice for actual hours incurred on a monthly basis, not to exceed \$339,526 without an approved change order for the services as set forth in Table 1.12, SFY 2022 Overdose Data to Action.

#### Specific Work Activities Provided by the Vendor shall include:

- Assisting DHHS with creating stimulants and poly drug use events codes with AHEDD ED visit data and incorporating into the Opioid Crisis dashboard.
- Implementing ETL process for monthly State Unintentional Drug Overdose Reporting System (SUDORS)
  data file.
- Further enhancing the EBI data model to better support analytics on members receiving assessments (GPRA) through the NH Doorway programs.
- Ingesting additional tables/views as needed from the WITS recurring database extract to improve reporting on patient residence and incorporate into opioid dashboards.
- Incorporating additional visualizations of the impact of poly drug use/stimulants into the existing
   Opioid Crisis dashboards (e.g., ED use, deaths)
- Developing download tables of each visualization in the existing Opioid Crisis dashboards
- Making corrections, as needed, in Opioid Crisis dashboards and dashboards data sources to improve quality of the data presented
- Assisting DHHS with building internal dashboards to help monitor and evaluate the NH Doorway programs.
- Developing a replacement dashboard for current public static reporting on NH Doorway metrics (https://www.thedoorway.nh.gov/node/8156)
- Building an internal dashboard to allow staff to easily see trends and patterns in SUDORS data.

#### Summary of Need

Overdose Data to Action (ODZA) supports jurisdictions in collecting high quality, comprehensive, and timely data on nonfatal and fatal overdoses and in using those data to inform prevention and response efforts. ODZA focuses on understanding and tracking the complex and changing nature of the drug overdose epidemic and highlights the need for seamless integration of data into prevention strategies. These enhancements to the State's EBI platform implement the goals of the ODZA program with additional data integration, reporting, and automation services to present new insights regarding the impact of opioids in New Hampshire and monitor the effectiveness of State-led programs to decrease opioid misuse and support opioid treatment and recovery efforts.

7.17 Community Collaborations to Strengthen and Preserve Families

#### Scope of Work

The Contractor agrees to provide additional services and data totaling \$93,051 as set forth in Table 1.13 SFY 2022 Community Collaborations to Strengthen and Preserve Families. For these services, the Contractor shall provide the identified staffing to support State-directed work. With Contractor PMO concurrence, the State shall authorize Contractor activities for Services on a weekly basis. Activities shall be prioritized via Jira and Contractor shall produce bi-weekly status reports, including hours incurred with resource burn down. The Contractor shall invoice for actual hours incurred on a monthly basis, not to exceed \$93,051 without an approved change order for the services as set forth in Table 1.13 SFY 2022 Community Collaborations to Strengthen and Preserve Families.

#### Specific Work Activities Provided by the Contractor shall Include:

- Collaborating with DHHS to determine how to extend the State's Enterprise Business Intelligence
  (EBI) Platform to integrate data from the Family Strengthening Data System (FSDS) (a QuickBase
  solution) used by the Family Resource Centers (FRCs) to assess local family needs, develop service
  plans, make service referrals, and capture family encounters.
- Developing and operationalizing data integration procedures to retrieve data from the FSDS through available APIs and load data to the EBI Platform.
- Integrating data from the Protective Factor Survey Online Database System with family data received from the FSDS.
- Developing an ongoing process to continue to receive new survey responses available in the Protective Factor Survey Online Database System.
- Enhancing the EBI reporting model with information received from the FSDS.
- Enhancing the EBI person matching processes to match client data from the FSDS to known individuals in the EBI master person index.
- Supporting the delivery of a non-identifiable program services data extract to University of New Hampshire data researchers to carry out CCSPF data analysis responsibilities.
- Supporting the delivery of an extract of non-identifiable Medicaid enrollees that did not receive supplemental family services to serve as a comparison group for UNH research and evaluation.

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#### Summary of Need

Within the Bureau of Population Health and Community Services, the Community Collaborations to Strengthen and Preserve Families (CCSPF), program establishes an integrated continuum of family support, with community-based services such as mental health and substance misuse treatment, economic supports, home visiting, and educational programs, to prevent child abuse and neglect and ultimately reduce the number of children entering foster care.

#### The CCSPF program goals are to:

- Reduce children entering foster care, and reduce intake and referrals to child welfare;
- Increase collaboration across service systems to move towards integration and collective planning; and
- Drive future service innovations in prevention programing for children and families using data that is unique to each community.

In support of these goals, DHHS needs additional data analytics and reporting to develop a "holistic view" of NH families and children at risk. By integrating data about these services provided with socioeconomic and regional population demographics, DHHS looks to determine where new or additional services may be targeted to support New Hampshire families and prevent DCYF intervention.



#### REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Office of the Commissioner, to enter into a Retroactive amendment to an existing contract with Deloitte Consulting LLP (VC#174776), Concord, NH to complete additional enhanced data analytics for school dashboard, hospital bed tracking, and vaccine administration associated with the COVID-19 response, by increasing the price limitation by \$836,550 from \$7,233,398 to \$8,069,948 with no change to the contract completion date of November 29, 2021, effective retroactive to August 16, 2021 upon Governor and Council approval. 100% Other Funds.

The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on May 1, 2019 (Item #18). It was amended with Governor and Council approval on December 18, 2019 (Item #14); amended with Governor approval on July 20, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on August 26, 2020 (Informational Item #A); amended with Governor approval on October 5, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on November 18, 2020 (Informational Item #L); amended with Governor approval on October 28, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on January 22, 2021 (Informational Item #A), and amended with Governor approval on April 1, 2021, and presented to the Executive Council on May 19, 2021 (Informational Item #C).

Funds are available in the following accounts for State Fiscal Year 2022, with the authority to adjust budget line items within the price limitation and encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

See attached fiscal details.

#### **EXPLANATION**

This amendment is Retroactive because the Department did not have the fully executed contract documents in time for Governor and Executive Council approval to meet the COVID-19 response needs relative to data analytics. This contract was originally competitively bid with a time and materials option to identify hourly rates for specific business intelligence skill sets and roles allowing the department to expand and contract resources as needed to meet multiple projects needs and funding sources to include grant, federal and state general funds.

This amendment is part of the State's strategic response to the COVID-19 pandemic and its effects on the opioid crisis. The Department identified the need to further enhance data integration, data analytics and predictive analytics for the opioid crisis as it relates to COVID-19.

The purpose of this amendment is to improve overall data quality and work to achieve improved transparency and integration of various data sources that were in place for vaccine

administration. The Contractor will provide the State with the necessary resources to bring solutions to the State to move the data clean up and enhancements forward by expanding the integration processes, automating data cleansing, and refining the existing dashboards and complimentary reporting dashboards.

This amendment will provide the necessary professional services to assist in the following nine (9) areas:

- Utilize the State's Enterprise Business Intelligence (EBI) platform and integration tools to bring solutions to the State for moving the data clean up and enhancement of dashboards forward:...
- Configure systems to perform automated data cleansing activities through matching identifying information from the NH Immunization Information System (NHIIS) to other vaccine and vaccine administration data sources e.g. VAMS, VINI, Vital Records, DHHS Master Client Index to ensure the accuracy of vaccine administration information;
- 3) Perform automated data cleansing activities by identifying duplicate information based on the multiple data sources and vaccine administration systems.
- 4) Identify the components and data modeling changes necessary to depict the data properly and clearly for public dashboard use:
- Maintain and enhance existing suite of COVID-19 related dashboards and data transformation processes;
- 6) Establish corrective actions to address data quality problems;
- Acquire and integrate new data sources;
- 8) Define or enhance prediction model dashboards and bring to production; and
- 9) Optimize existing data integration and dashboard performance.

This data matching and visualization work and continued expansion of the COVID-19 Response Management Business Intelligence components and tools will allow for data driven decision-making assistance. As the utilization of the system has grown exponentially over the last two years, and the ability to scale the architecture of the system has been implemented, the Department is positioned to further capitalize on the reporting accuracy and efficiency of the system.

Pursuant to RSA 4:45, RSA 21-P:43, and Section 4 of Executive Order 2020-04 as extended by Executive Orders 2020-05, 2020-08, 2020-09, 2020-10, 2020-14, 2020-15, 2020-16, 2020-17, 2020-18, 2020-20, 2020-21, 2020-23, and 2020-24, Governor Sununu has authorized the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS). Office of the Commissioner, to enter into a Retroactive, Sole Source amendment to an existing contract with Deloitte Consulting LLP (VC#174776). Concord, NH, to complete additional enhanced data analytics for school dashboard, hospital bed tracking, and vaccine administration associated with the COVID-19 response, by increasing the price limitation by \$1,812,350 from \$4,007,463 to \$5,819,813 with no change to the completion date of November 29, 2021, effective retroactive to November 2, 2020, 100% Federal Funds.

The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on May 1, 2019 (Item #18). It was amended with Governor and Council approval on December 18, 2019 (Item #14); amended with Governor approval on July 20, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on August 28, 2020 (Informational Item #A); and amended with Governor approval on October 5, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on November 18, 2020 (Informational Item #L).

Funds are available in the following accounts for State Fiscal Year. 2021, with the authority to adjust budget line items within the price limitation and encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

### See Attached Fiscal Potelle Short EXPLANATION

This amendment is Retroscrive because DHHS did not have the fully executed contract documents in time for Governor approval to meet the COVID-19 response needs surrounding school re-opening efforts and associated results and trends. This amendment is Sole Source because DHHS is adding additional scope beyond that which was contemplated in the original Request for Proposal.

This amandment is part of the State's strategic response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Department Identified the need for additional enhanced data analytics for school dashboards, hospital bed tracking, and vaccine administration associated with the COVID-19 response, as well as support for the continued expansion of the infrastructure supporting the dashboards to increase the speed and accuracy of the data being collected and published regarding COVID-19 cases,

dusters, and outbreaks within New Hampshire schools. The current system does not Include school level information. The Contractor will provide the State the necessary resources to design and implement a school deshboard as well as trend-based analytics based on other states teaming models, infection rates, and overall transmission of COVID-19.

The purpose of this amendment is to continue the development of a software system and associated services required for DHHS to implement a scalable COVID-19 Response Management Business Intelligence dashboard that Is Integrated with and expands upon DHHS' existing enterprise-wide data warehousing and business intelligence infrastructure. As the utilization of the system has grown exponentially over the last several months, the need to scale the prohitecture of the system has become apparent. This amendment will provide the necessary professional services to assist in the following five (5) areas: 1) continued COVID-19 Data Integration and Visualization to include additional achool COVID related dashboards, hospital bed tracking and vaccine dashboards, 2) public migration to cloud systems for scalable architecture. 3) implementation of an internal-facing portal to provide easy access to internal reports and dashboards, 4) Implementation of metadata management tool to further ensure compliance with data management, accuracy and security of the data, and 5) Oracle performance tuning to ensure optimal performance of current and future dashboards. In an effort to provide as much transparency to the public as possible, DHHS has been creating and distributing COVID-19 related statistics in chart and table format. The current reporting does not provide hospital bed tracking or vaccine administration dashboards to address the anticipated surge of the COVID-19 virus and the need to track vaccinations throughout New Hartpshire. To address this, DHHS and the Department of Information Technology (DoIT) are working to automate reporting by pulling source data into our Enterprise Business Intelligence (EBI) platform.

This ongoing effort will be accelerated and erhanced through the professional services provided through this amendment. The continued expansion of the platform from Opiold data analytics is a realization of the original plan and architectural strategy for using the platform for any data analytics needs in the State. While the expanded development of the data integration and dashboard system will be focused on COVID-19, the infrastructure developed and the data integrated will be fully leveraged to support all the analytical challenges OHHS faces: For example, key elements of the New Hampshire Immunization Information System, Vaccine Management System, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevalon's Vaccine Administration-Management System (VAMS), New Hampshire Electronic Disease Surveillance System (NHEDSS), Juvare Emergency Preparedness System, Laboratory Management System (LIMS), Granite Trace (Contact Tracing SalesForce application), national data sets for predictive modeling, and Vital Records information are needed for analysis of the impacts and overall State response to the COVID-19 pandemic. By integrating this data into the DHHS business intelligence infrastructure, the data will then be positioned to meet other analytic needs of the program. Beyond data Integration, the Contractor will continue to essist DHHS with implementing high-level analytic tools and continue to leverage the toolsets needed to reinforce agile project management. DHHS maintains, or has access to, multiple systems that compile data on the contact tracing. testing, registration, asset inventory, and a variety of health and social issues that correlate with risk, impact, and trends surrounding COVID-19. These systems organize and support various functional areas in delivering services to the citizens, as well as systems that capture information about the health and well-being of the general public. Additionally, other New Hampshire state agencies and federal partners capture important data related to the COVID-19 pandemic. In aggregate, these systems maintain a large wealth of data.

This amendment is part of the State's strategic response to the COVID-19 pandemic. On July 31, 2020, the need for enhanced data analytics for the school re-opening associated with the COVID-19 response was identified to increase the speed and accuracy of the data being collected and published regarding COVID-19 cases, clusters, and outbreaks within New Hampshire schools. The current system in place does not include school tevel information. The Contractor will provide the State the necessary resources to design and implement a school's dashboard as 'well as trend-based analytics based on other states' learning models, infection rates, and overall transmission of COVID-19.

The purpose of this amendment is to expand professional services to continue the development of a software system and associated services required for DHHS to implement a scalable COVID-19 Response Management Business Intelligence dashboard that is integrated with and expands upon DHHS' existing enterprise wide data warehousing and business intelligence infrestructure. Separate dashboards will be available to the public and authorized state staff to assure privacy of released date and maximize utility for internal management. Additional federal funding provided by the Emerging Issues (E) Project of CK19-1904, henceforth 'ELC CARES' for the COVID-19 response will enable the State to complete the dashboard reporting needed to address the COVID-19 pandemic. DHHS has been working to manage the response effort for COVID-19 for the State of New Hampshire, In an effort to provide as much transparency to the public as possible, OHHS has been creating and distributing COVID-19 related statistics in chart and table formst. To address this, DHHS and the Department of Information Technology (DoIT) are working to automate reporting by pulling source data into our Enterprise Business Intelligence (EBI) platform.

The ongoing effort will be accelerated and anhanced through the professional services provided through this amendment. The continued expansion of the platform from Oploid date enalytics is a realization of the original plan and architectural strategy for using the platform for any data analytics needs in the State. While the expanded development of the data integration and dashboard system will be focused on COVID-19; the Infrastructure developed and the data integrated will be fully leveraged to support all the analytical challenges DHHS faces. For example, key elemento of the New Hampshiro Electronic Disease Surveillance System (NHEDSS), Juvare Emergency Preparedness System, Laboratory Management System (LIMS). Granite Trace (Contact Tracing SalesForce application), national data sate for predictive modeling, and Vital Records Information are needed for analysis of the Impacts and overall State response to the COVID-19 pendemic. By Integrating this data into the DHHS' business intelligence infrastructure, the data will then be positioned to meet other analytic needs of the program. Beyond data integration, the Contractor will continue to assist DHHS with Implementing high-level analytic tools and continue to leverage the toolsets needed to reinforce agile project management. 

## **EXPLANATION**

The request is retroactive because the Department did not have the fully executed contract documents in time for Governor and Executive Council approval to prevent the current contract from expiring. On November 4, 2019 the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (COC), notified the Department of an extension opportunity from the original deadline of November 29, 2020 to expond the funds to March 29, 2020. Que to the compressed timelrame we were unable to meet the deadline for the November meeting.

The purpose of this request is to expand the professional services to continue the development of a software system and associated services that are required for the Department to implement a scalable Opioid Crisis Response Management Business Intelligence dashboard that is integrated with and expands upon the Department's existing enterprise-wide data warehousing and business intelligence infrastructure. Additional federal funding provided by the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) for Opioid Crisis Response the Contractor will be able to complete the transition of maintenance and support to the Department of Information Technology. Additionally this amendment will allow for the completion of technical architecture and final implementation of a public facing Opioid Information Dashboard.
