Said road is laid out THREE RODS WIDE and the marks are on the east side of said road.

Agreeable to a vote of the town of Hollis passed at their annual meeting in March 1805., we have laid out a road THREE RODS WIDE, from the south west Bridge to Pepperill line, bounded on the easterly side by a straight line from the south easterly corner of said Bridge to the north easterly boundary of a road lately laid out by said Pepperill to the State Line.


