REQUESTED ACTION

1. 2. Pursuant to the provisions of RSA 124:15, Positions Restricted, and subject to the approval of item 1 above, authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, to continue one Full Time position at the following level: Systems Development Specialist III utilizing funds from the Health Resources and Services Administration Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting grant effective retroactive to July 1, 2017 upon date of approval by the Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council, through June 30, 2019. The attached letter from Division of Personnel approved the establishment of this position.

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EXPLANATION

Requested Action #2 is **retroactive**. Although the position is vacant, the request is retroactive to July 1, 2017 to ensure continuity of position 9T2851 that was effective through June 30, 2017 only.

The funding was approved by Fiscal (FIS 17-002) on February 17, 2017 and the position was approved by Fiscal (FIS 17-067) Committee on April 14, 2017. Governor and Council approved the funding (including the position-item #11) on May 3, 2017. These approvals were received after the Agency phase of the budget and as a result were not included in the budget. The department submitted a budget errata during the Senate phase of the Budget process, but, it was not approved in the final budget. This is the first opportunity to present this request to the Fiscal Committee and the Governor and Council for consideration.

As noted in previous Fiscal Committee meetings, the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program is a federally-funded initiative that uses evidence-based, voluntary home visiting services in communities across New Hampshire. The purpose of the grant is to promote healthy childhood growth and development, strong parent-child relationships and safe, secure family environments amongst New Hampshire's most vulnerable families. These are protective factors which have been shown to increase health outcomes for parents and children, school readiness and achievement, family economic self-sufficiency, and coordination of community resources and supports. Home visits have also been shown to reduce child abuse and neglect, as well as domestic violence.

The requested Systems Development Specialist III position is critical to measuring the effectiveness of these services. This role serves as the critical link between the data system used by the program, the DHHS DPHS Home Visiting Manager, Coordinator and Evaluator who manage the statewide program and community-based agencies that input data on a daily basis. The Department of Information Technology (DoIT) and DHHS have both determined that this position is best located within the Division of Public Health Services where it can be closely aligned with programmatic technical assistance to community-based agencies (see attached letter from DoIT Commissioner Denis Goulet). Without this position, the MIECHV Program is significantly limited in its ability to provide quality service to contracted vendors and its ability to provide accurate and timely information about the health and social outcomes of participants in this home visiting program.

Local community-based agencies utilize funds to provide home visits to families that are based on need, beginning during pregnancy or within the postpartum period and continue through the first three years of life. Home visitors use an evidence based curriculum, *Healthy Families America*, to facilitate health and development screenings, assess status and discuss life goals as well as connecting families to community resources if necessary. The performance of community agencies is measured against targets using a comprehensive continuous quality improvement and data collection plan.

When the MIECHV program initially began, it anticipated a 12 month award as most grants follow. However, MIECHV functions on multiple year, overlapping awards.. Because the grant years overlap dates of services, the oldest grant year is spent first. The slower than expected start up combined with a multi-year overlapping award led to challenges with determining the accurate appropriation within each state fiscal year. With the acceptance of this latest fiscal item, the MIECHV program will have all the funds needed to maintain the program and contract out based on the plan determined with the Health Resources and Services Administration.

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Funds are budgeted for Temp full time (class 059) if approved in item 2, to continue a Systems Development Specialist III (Home Visiting Data Specialist) who will serve as the primary user and contact between the data systems contractor and the program itself. This staff member will develop expertise in the data system, *Efforts to Outcomes*, managing its system configuration and reporting specifications of the home visiting program. The position will also support the end users (home visiting agencies, evaluation contractors and other MIECHV staff) in training, malfunction resolution, configuration, data analysis and interpretation and data reporting activities required by the HRSA grant.

Funds are budgeted for Benefits (Class 060) to fund required benefits for the position funded in Class 059.

- 2) Nature, need and duration:

The Systems Development Specialist III will be responsible for oversight and the implementation of the data component of the MIECHV program. The activities to ensue will enhance the current and future home visiting related endeavors within the Division of Public Health Services and the Department of Health and Human Services as a whole.

Without these funds and the ensuing activities, the State will not be able to administer all the responsibilities of the HRSA grant. DPHS cannot provide technical support to community based vendors and cannot develop timely and accurate reports about the social and health outcomes of participants in home visiting programs.

3) Relationship to existing agency programs:

The Systems Development Specialist III will be part of the Maternal, Infant, Early Childhood Home Visiting Program in the Maternal and Child Health Section, Bureau of Population Health and Community Services, part of the Division of Public Health Services in the Department of Health and Human Services.

- 4) Has similar program been requested of the Legislature and denied?No.
- 5) Why wasn't funding included in the agency's budget request?

The previous fiscal item FIS 17-067 approved on April 14, 2017 and Governor and Council item #10 approved on May 3, 2017 approved the position through June 30, 2017. We were not able to get this position included in the Budget during the Legislative phase of the Budget for SFY 2018-SFY2019.

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6) Can portions of the grant funds be utilized for other purposes?
Federal funds allocated to the State cannot be used for other purposes.

7) Estimate the funds required to continue this position:

In response to the anticipated two-part question, "Can these funds be used to offset General Funds?" and "What is the compelling reason for not offsetting General Funds?" the Division offers the following information: These funds may not be used to offset General Funds as they are specifically granted to the State for the purpose of providing the services described above.

These funds will not change the program eligibility levels.

Source of funds: These funds are 100% from the Health Resources and Services Administration. Attached are the Division of Personnel authorization, Notice of Grant Award and Award History.

In the event that these Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program.


