REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to the provisions of RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, to accept and expend federal funds in the amount of \$3,323,142 from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to fund Data Modernization as mandated by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act of 2020 effective upon approval by the Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council through June 30, 2023 and further authorize the funds to be allocated as follows. 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

This request is being made to accept additional grant funds available for Data Modernization (CDC). The intention of this funding is to accelerate the Department's implementation of data modernization efforts, including core data modernization infrastructure, implementation of electronic case reporting (CSR) and modernization of the National Vital Statistics System (NVSS) to move towards faster, more automated sharing of vital statistics between the state and national levels. Monitoring the indicators associated with these activities is intended to assist State, local and territorial governments in efforts to achieve data modernization goals, assuring faster and more complete data sharing across the public health ecosystem.

The funds are to be budgeted as follows:

Class 020 - The funds will be used to pay for current expenses such as shipping and program consumable supplies.

Class 026 – The funds will be used to pay two years of an organizational membership to Health Level Seven International (HL7). This organization is a not-for-profit, ANSI-accredited standards developing organization dedicated to providing a comprehensive framework and related standards for the exchange, integration, sharing, and retrieval of electronic health information that supports clinical practice and the management, delivery and evaluation of health services. The membership will allow us to access trainings and get the HL7 standard documents and guidance to revise electronic reporting implementation guide. CDC is promoting the HL7 FHIR—Fast Healthcare Interoperability Resources standard. With this membership, we will get the most updated information.

Class 038 – The funds will be used to pay for RingCentral Licenses. The NH COVID Response team uses RingCentral for receiving and sending case report faxes electronically. The budget request is to renew the existing RingCentral licenses (25 licenses) used by the COVID case investigation team and infectious disease surveillance team for case reporting on COVID-19 and other reportable conditions.

Class 041 - The funds will be used to pay for audit fund set aside per State requirement.

Class 080 – The funds will be used to pay for the Public Health Informatics Conference. Travel funds are requested for the Business Analyst and DPHS IT Lead (TBD) working on data exchange and IT systems to attend the annual Public Health Informatics conference in 2022. The funds will also be used to pay for the CSTE 2022 Conference. Travel funds are requested for the DPHS Informatics Lead and the DPHS IT Lead to attend the annual CSTE conference on June 17 through June 22, 2022 in Louisville, KY. The CSTE Conference provides opportunities for public health specialists to share new methods, key findings, and best practices for Informatics and Surveillance. Both attendees support Informatics activities in NH DHHS and are part of the Data Modernization Team in NH.

Class 085- The funds will be used to pay for a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with NH Division of Vital Records Administration (NHDVRA), the agency that collects, validates, maintains and administers the NH Vital Statistics System.

Class 102 - The funds will be used to contract for several data specific positions to include: Data Modernization Initiative (DMI) IT Specialist, Electronic Case Reporting (eCR) Coordinator, Health Level Seven International/Fast Healthcare Interoperability Resources (HL7/FHIR) Expert, Electronic Disease Surveillance System Information Technology (EDSSIT) Specialist, and Rhapsody Developer as well as a Data Modernization contract.

• The DMI Specialist will lead health informatics data modernization efforts and supplement existing staff working on cross-cutting initiatives. This position will provide a gap analysis, needs assessment, and workforce development plan. Focus will include, but not limited to, NH's Health Data Integration Engine Assessment Initiative and enhancement, NHEDSS System evaluation for replacement, LIMS move to cloud-based from in-house, as well as other health data systems.

- The eCR Coordinator will participate with healthcare facilities, providers and the stakeholders. Activities include assessment of capacity to improve data sharing with a focus on eCR processes within the Bureau of Infectious Disease Control, workplace staff and trainings needed to improve NH's capability to use shared services and other in data modernization activities. This position will validate and implement data quality related to completeness and timeliness of heath data received. This position will be a key member for communicating with healthcare facilities and providers to ensure awareness and compliance with case reporting for all conditions, including COVID-19.
- The HL7/FHIR expert will provide technical assistance to the healthcare facilities, providers and the State.
 This position will assist health informatics on converting and validating the electronic case reporting message submitted to the state in HL7 and FHIR standards. This position will work with IT staff from Association of Public Health Laboratories (APHL) on the messages coming from the healthcare facilities.
- The EDSS IT specialist will participate in activities with healthcare facilities and IT staff. This position
 will validate and implement data quality related to completeness and timeliness of heath data received. This
 position will be a key member with validating the NH EDSS data and messages to ensure case reporting
 quality for all conditions, including COVID-19.
- The Rhapsody Developer collaborates with IT resources, Infectious Disease Programs, Informatics and on delivering eCR solutions on time. This position will contribute to completion of all eCR-related work assigned, adhering to the current SDLC process, as well as design and review detailed functional specifications, system specifications, and program specific actions to be taken by the software to meet requirements and business needs. This position will work with the HL7/FHIR Expert and APHL Informatics Messaging Services (AIMS) on electronic case reporting integration. The person is also expected to prepare estimates for maintenance and enhancement of existing applications and development of new applications.
- The Data Modernization Training contract will be to support workforce enhancement in Informatics and health system workforce, establishing a contract with a training provider focusing on data modernization courses or lessons. The vendor is expected to provide a quarterly training for 4 sessions.

In response to the anticipated two-part question, "Can these funds be used to offset General Funds?" and "What is the compelling reason for not offsetting General Funds?" the Division offers the following information: The funds are provided for a specified purpose by the CDC as defined in the Notice of Grant Award and cannot be used to offset general funds.

Area Served: Statewide

Source of funds: 100% Federal from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to fund Data Modernization as mandated by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act of 2020

Attached is the Notice of Grant Award, dated August 5, 2021. These funds were not added to the FY22-FY23 operating budget because these are new funds recently granted to the State to assist in the public health Coronavirus response and were not anticipated at the time the budget was developed.

In the event that these Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program.
