Requested Action

1. Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the Insurance Department to accept and expend federal grant funds in the amount of \$536,561 for FY 2018 and FY2019 from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (“USDHHS”) for the purpose of enhancing the States’ ability to effectively enforce the consumer protections under Part A of title XXVII of the PHS Act. The primary focus of the Department’s efforts will be to expand its review of parity in mental health and substance use disorder benefits, as well as some work to ensure that health insurance issuers do not include discriminatory benefit designs that discourage people with potentially high-cost medical conditions from enrolling in those plans and to enhance review of issuer form filings to ensure coverage of preventive health services without cost sharing. This action is to be effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Executive Council approval through October 30, 2018.

Source of Funds is 100% Federal Funds.

2. Pursuant to RSA 124:15 authorize the Insurance Department to establish a Class 046 (Consultants) to enter into contracts for consulting services with various vendors in Account Number 02-24-24-240010-12120000 for the period of Fiscal Committee and Governor and Executive Council approval through October 30, 2018.

Funds will be budgeted as set forth in the table below. Source of funds: 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

The New Hampshire Insurance Department has received a federal grant for the purpose of enhancing the States' ability to effectively enforce consumer protections under Part A of title XXVII of the PHS Act. The purpose of the grant program is to help States expand their review for parity in mental health and substance use disorder benefits, to enhance existing policy filing review processes to ensure health insurance issuers do not include discriminatory benefit designs that discourage people with potentially high-cost medical conditions from enrolling in those plans, and to enhance review of issuer form filings to ensure coverage of the required preventive health services without cost sharing. We are requesting the acceptance of this grant in the amount of \$536,561 to allow for the continuation of the State's efforts to effectively enforce the consumer protections during FY2018/2019.

The following appropriation authority is being requested for Fiscal Year 2018 and 2019:

1. Class 020 – Current Expenses – FY18 - \$3,000; FY19 - \$750. These funds are required in order to provide general supplies to the part-time employee.
2. Class 041 – Audit set aside – FY18 - \$560; FY19 - \$140. These funds are required in order to meet audit costs associated with the grant program.
3. Class 046 – Consultants – FY18 - \$475,382; FY19 - \$29,000. These funds are required to review for parity in mental health and substance use disorder benefits, enhance existing policy filing review processes to ensure health insurance issuers do not include discriminatory benefit designs that discourage people with potentially high-cost medical conditions from enrolling in those plans and enhance review of issuer form filings to ensure coverage of the required preventive health services without cost sharing.
4. Class 050 – Personal Services – PT Temp – FY18 - \$20,606; FY19 - \$5,152. These funds are set aside in order to pay the part time employee to administer the grant program.
5. Class 060 – Benefits – FY18 - \$1,577; FY19 - \$394. These funds are necessary for the payroll contributions for the part-time employee.

The following information is provided in accordance with the Comptroller's instructional memorandum dated September 21, 1981:

1. List of personnel involved: This federal grant will continue to fund a part time temporary position of Grants and Contracts Technician (Labor Grade 15). We are using the Supplemental Job Description that was approved by the Director of Personnel on October 5, 2011. This position is currently funded by the "Grant to Support States in Health Insurance Rate Review Grant Cycle III which ends 09/30/2017 and the Health Insurance Rate Review Grant Cycle IV which end 09/18/2017. A copy of the director's approval is attached. Upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Executive Council approval, the Insurance Department will award contracts to various vendors and pay them from the Consultants line item.
2. Nature, need, and duration: The position of Grants and Contracts Technician will be serving as the financial records assistant, maintaining all financial records and creating requisite financial reports for the grant. Department will also employ various contractors to work on this project. Funding for this position and various consultant contracts will be good through October 30, 2018.
3. Relationship to existing agency program: The funds from this federal grant will be used for the purpose of enhancing the States' ability to effectively enforce the consumer protections.

4. Has a similar program been requested of the legislature and denied? The nature of the work to be completed under the grant has never been requested and denied by the General Court.

5. Why wasn't funding included in the agency's budget request? The agency was not 100% confident in budgeting the second half of the grant due to the timing of the FY18-19 Biennium budget.

6. Can portions of the grant funds be utilized? One hundred percent federal grant funds can be used to fund the personnel costs and all program costs associated with this request.

7. Estimate the funds required to continue this position(s): There will be no cost to the State of New Hampshire associated with this position or any consultants as all will terminate at the end of the grant period.

Provide fiscal management, budget development, account monitoring, analysis, and reporting; maintain financial data and personnel data entry relative to grant funded activities. 100% of this position's 20 hour work week is devoted to the implementation of the Federal Affordable Care Act.
