

Joelle Martin to Represent NH at State Legislative Leaders Foundation Program

Every July the State Legislative Leaders Foundation hosts up to 50 of the “best and brightest state legislators from across the nation” to participate in their Emerging Leaders Program. Milford’s State Representative, Joelle Martin, has been selected to represent New Hampshire at the Foundation’s Emerging Leaders Program this year.

The State Legislative Leaders Foundation relies on the recommendations of each state’s leadership – House Speaker, Senate President, and House and Senate Minority Leader – to nominate first- and second-term legislators to apply for the program. The selection committee makes their final decision based on a candidate’s demonstrated capacity as a state legislator, dedication to public service, and potential to serve as a next generation legislative leader.

NH House Minority Leader Steve Shurtleff nominated Rep. Martin to represent New Hampshire at the event. “I am very pleased and proud that Representative Joelle Martin has been selected to attend the prestigious Emerging Leaders Program to be held this summer at the University of Virginia,” stated Representative Shurtleff. “Her selection is partly in recognition of her hard work as a State Representative, as well as her ability to work across party lines for the common good.”

Held on the campus of the University of Virginia, in partnership with the distinguished Darden School of Business, the Emerging Leaders Program provides legislators from across the country with the opportunity to share their experience with a politically, socially and culturally diverse group of peers. The Foundation recognizes the importance of legislators as consensus builders and facilitators of compromise and aims to develop the leadership potential of emerging policy leaders for the challenges of the 21st century.

Martin looks forward to participating in the program and working with fellow legislators from across the country. “In this time of political divide, it is critical that legislators work together to solve problems and create policies that provide real solutions,” Martin said. “After completing the Emerging Leaders Program, I plan to bring back to NH the skills I acquire to help me be a better legislator and to represent my constituents more effectively.”

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
