REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Safety, Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM), to retroactively amend an existing grant agreement (PO#1082294) with the Town of Meredith (VC#159903-B001), 41 Main Street Meredith NII, 03253 to purchase and install a generator in the community's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) by extending the completion date from August 31, 2022 to August 31, 2023 effective upon the Governor and Council approval. The grant was initially approved by the Governor and Executive Council on April 7 2021, Item #65 and Amended on September 15, 2021, Item #74C. 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

This is retroactive due to Division level staffing challenges that caused internal processing delays. This request for an extension is necessary due to delays in shipping and supply chain shortages that are affecting suppliers. It was agreed that an extension to August 31, 2023 approved by Governor and Council, would provide the Town of Meredith ample time to complete the aforementioned tasks. HSEM has reviewed this request with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and it was determined that the date extension will not affect Federal funding.

In the event that Federal Funds are no longer available, General Funds and/or Highway Funds will not be requested to support this program.




