

## Haverhill.

Haverhill was originally a favorite Indian resort, known as "Lower Poods". It was granted in 1763 to John Hazzan and 74 other residents of Haverhill, Mass., and the name was changed on that account. Hazzan had begun a settlement two years previous on a promise of a charter, xxx.

Haverhill was divided into two parishes in 1815.  
Grafton county.



EXTRACT

The petition of Henry Towle and others represents that it is necessary for the due accommodation of the public, and of public travel, that a new public highway should be laid out and built, from the Towle Tavern, so called, in Haverhill, in said County, at what is called Haverhills Corner, to the easterly termination of Coos Turnpike in Warren in said County, which said highway it is desired by the subscribers, may be laid from said <sup>Haverhill</sup> Tavern easterly, through said town of Haverhill, a part of Piermont, and said town of Warren all in said county, better than any other route etc ~

and have laid out the same over and upon the Coos Turnpike, so called as follows, taking all the rights of the said Coos Turnpike Corporation to the road.


It was the intention of  
the Commission in laying out the the  
aforesaid highway to take all the ground  
occupied by said Turnpike for said  
road, but as the line above marked out  
was run as near as practicable in  
the middle of the traveled part of said  
turnpike, the road above laid out  
probably embraces some land that did  
not belong to said turnpike, but the  
Commissioners are of the opinion that  
no damage was done the owners of such  
land by laying out said road, & no person  
appeared to claim damages therefor.

EXTRACT

The subscribers being appointed a Committee by the proprietors of Haverhill at their meeting held on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of April last to lay out & ascertain the roads & mill yards on that part of the lot called Mill privilege which lays on the south side of Oliverian Brook & on the east side of the old great road, and see what may be left for Capt. Jonathan Ring & return a survey of the same. Have attended that business so far as to make the following report to m:-

Laid out a road from said great old road a little south of the southerly end of Oliverian Bridge, so called to the southerly side line of said Mill privilege lot.

Beginning at bound No 1 on the plan herewith returned, which is a stake and stones at the north westerly corner of Capt John Montgomerie's store which is supposed to stand considerably in upon said old road. Thence running S 62° E 7 rods & 8 links to a stake & stones No 2 at the easterly end of a piece of stone wall, thence S 24° E 6 rods to a stake & stones No 3 at the north easterly corner of the Yankee House so called. thence S 2° W 6 rods to stake & stones No 4, thence S 27 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E 27 rods to a small pine tree bound No 5 & to continue on the same course a small distance till through said mill privilege lot.

This line is to form the southerly side of said road which leads toward Coventry. Then beginning again for the northerly side of said new road on the easterly side of said old road allowing it to be 4 rods wide from the lower edge of the abutment at a stake & stones No 6 near Capt Joseph Pearson's tenter bars which stake is on a line from the south easterly corner of the Corn Mill to the north westerly corner of the Oyl-Mill or corner next to the water & is 6 rods & 25 links from said corner of said Corn Mill. on the

Moses Dow Petitioner humbly that the Selectmen of Haverhill in said County in the month of June last laid out a certain road or highway for public use in said town four rods wide in the words and figures following:

Beginning at a willow tree marked and standing on the east side of the Causway near Toddy Brook, so-called; thence South 24° West 30 rods to the top of the first hill; thence south 49 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° west 14 rods to the top of the plain; thence South 26° West 136 rods to a hemlock tree, the same running through land belonging to General Moses Dow; thence South 61° West 61 rods to an elm tree marked by the east side of the dug way at Ayer's Hill, so-called. *The same highway to be four rods wide and to be laid one rod east and three rods west of said line through the whole distance therof.*


This was the path along which the settlers had built their houses, and was described as running "from the Bath south line, southwesterly to Lieut. Hayward's, thence south to north side of Ministerial house (Horse Meadow), thence southeasterly to Capt. Hazen's, thence southeasterly a little over Mill brook (Poole), thence in a general southwesterly line to Piermont." In turning this road over to the town "as now trode," the settlers provided that their houses should not be left off the road. From the Bath line to Woodsville, it ran as now east of Woodsville--there was no Woodsville--and was the original of the present state road through the town. The course of the road from Colonel Bedel's on Ladd Street was down the hill crossing the Oliverian below the present grist-mill, and along the west side of Powder House Hill, passing the log cabin where John Page lived and thence to the Colonel Johnston house where Jesse R. Squires now lives. The change to the present road from the lower end of Ladd Street to the Corner was made in 1795.

John Page lived at the Corner, approx .2 miles south of the intersection of Route 25

## EXTRACT

A return of a highway laid out the 9<sup>th</sup> day of January 1790 in the northerly part of Harwhill from the road on the plain in said town to Connecticut River. Beginning at said highway a little south of Capt Timothy Barnard's house & to continue on down the hill as the way is now laid to the line of the Meadow lots in Horse meadow then to continue on southerly as that line runs by the end of said Meadow lots to a northwesterly corner of a log shed being the northwesterly line of the improvements of Asa Porter Esq thence running westerly & to continue on by the northerly side of said Porter's Barn & Garden fence to a bank which decends into the low interval being the place where an highway was formerly laid out by the Selectmen of said town on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of March 1777. The road now laid to this place is to be 3 rods in breadth thence to continue on westerly by the fence between the improvements of said Porter & Col. Thomas Johnson on the northerly side thereof about 40 rods to another bank then to cross over by a gentle slant as it decends the bank to the southerly side of said fence then to continue on the same point as before on a straight line to the River aforesaid & to be 1 1/2 rods in breadth from the place where the breadth was before ascertained to the river and the Owner or Owners of the lands thereon the highway of 1 1/2 rods in breadth last described are allowed to keep Gates thereon and the exclusive right of improving said way by Pasturing or feeding Cattle thereon.

Henry and others represents that for the accommodation of the public there is occasion for a new highway in the town of Haverhill beginning at a stake set in the ground about 26 feet southeasterly from the southeast corner of B. F.
