## **EXPLANATION**

The Department requests authorization to transfer between classes within Consolidated Federal Aid the amount of \$4,457,573 for monitoring and maintaining the existing New England Compass Advanced Transportation Management System (ATMS), comprised of a central ATMS system software, a regional Advanced Traveler Information System and a Data Fusion Hub. The Contractor shall perform all major enhancements to the ATMS, including developing mockups for individual enhancements, providing progress builds for review by the States, and testing enhancements prior to implementation within the ATMS. The Contractor shall be responsible for hosting the ATMS and ATMS facilities. This agreement includes participation by both Maine and Vermont at approximately 1/3 for each State. Sufficient revenue is budgeted within Private Local Funds, therefore, an Accept & Expend request is not necessary. Specific explanations relating to the Department's spending requests are as follows:

## Consolidated Federal Aid (3054)

- Class 038 Increase Technology-Software by \$4,457,573 for monitoring and maintaining the Advanced Transportation Management System.
- Class 400 Decrease Construction Repair Material by \$4,457,573. Additional funds are available due to the timing of construction projects. This transfer will not impact the construction of any projects identified in the Ten-Year Plan.

The following is provided in accordance with the Budget Officer's instructional memorandum dated April 17, 1985 to support the above requested actions:

- 1. Does transfer involve continuing programs or one-time projects? This transfer is for continuing programs (not one-time).
- 2. Is this transfer required to maintain existing program level or will it increase program level? This transfer is to maintain existing program levels to provide relevant traffic and weather information to the traveling public in the Tri-State region. (no increase in program level).
- 3. Cite any requirements, which make this program necessary.
  RSA 21-L:2, in part, establishes that the Department will be responsible for planning, developing, and maintaining a state transportation network. This transfer will facilitate the accomplishment of this responsibility.

- 4. Identify the source of funds on all accounts listed on this transfer.

  The source of funds are Federal Funds and Other Funds.
- 5. Will there be any effect on revenue if this transfer is approved or disapproved? This transfer will have no effect on revenue.
- 6. Are funds expected to lapse if this transfer is not approved?

  No, Federal program funding is brought forward for use in future fiscal years as it is available for obligation from FHWA for four years from apportionment.
- 7. Are personal services involved?

  This transfer does not result in any new positions.
