REQUESTED ACTION

1. Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a,VI, authorize the Office of the Governor to accept and expend grant funds in the amount of \$112,500 from the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation, Oliver J. and Dorothy Penniman Hubbard New Futures Fund, for the continued support of a Senior Behavioral Health Coordinator, effective from the date of Fiscal Committee of the General Court and Governor and Executive Council approval, for the period **retroactive** from July 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015.

2. Pursuant to RSA 124:15, and contingent upon Item #1 above, authorize the Office of the Governor to amend Fiscal Item #FIS14-196 approved on November 24, 2014, and Item #39A approved by Governor and Council on December 3, 2014, by changing the end date, **retroactive** from June 30, 2015 to a new end date of December 31, 2015, for the purpose of continuing a non-classified position, Senior Behavioral Health Coordinator, within budget class 016, (Personal Services Non -classified) as established for the purpose of improving coordination of New Hampshire's substance use and other behavioral health policies to better combat substance misuse and to reduce long-term costs to the state, counties, local communities and business, effective upon the approval of the Fiscal Committee of the General Court and Governor and Council through December 31, 2015.

Funds are to be budgeted in FY 2016 in the accounting unit entitled 'Alcohol and Drug Abuse Grant' as follows:

EXPLANATION

This request is for the acceptance of available grant funding to support the continuation of a Senior Behavioral Health position originally established by authorization of Fiscal committee (Fiscal Item #FIS14-196 approved on November 24, 2014, and Governor and Council on December 3, 2014, Item 39A), for the period effective **retroactive** from July 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015. The grant funds were included in the Committee of Conference budget. The retroactive nature of this request, both for funding and extension of the position, is required to continue the program by its reauthorization at the first scheduled Fiscal Committee and then the following Governor and Council meeting of FY 2016.

Mental Health and Substance Abuse are frequently co-occurring disorders, which if left untreated carry heavy societal and governmental costs. New Hampshire has recognized the need to address these challenges, and is making unprecedented public and private investments in improving behavioral health and substance abuse treatment.

Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment is a major focus of the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation. In addition, the Governor's Commission on Innovation, Efficiency and Transparency has identified improving the coordination of substance abuse treatment for people with co-occurring mental health disorders is a significant opportunity to improve state government efficiency and reduce the growth in future costs for state government, counties and local communities.

This grant is helping New Hampshire make the most of these opportunities by putting in place a public-private partnership to improve New Hampshire's efforts to prevent substance abuse, and improve treatment for people with substance abuse disorders and people with co-occurring mental health disorders. This partnership includes a Governor's policy director for behavioral health who is working with state agencies and stakeholders to better coordinate the state's substance abuse disorder and other behavioral health efforts. This liaison is working directly with, and advised by, the Governor's Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention, Intervention and Treatment. Individual agencies and divisions maintain their responsibilities to implement and oversee programs addressing mental health and substance use.

In addition to state officials and the members of the Governor's commission, in his first 100 days, the Director's has met with more than 100 stakeholders representing local providers, hospitals, law enforcement, pharmacies, and business leaders. He will shortly be recommending an action plan to the Governor based on his outreach efforts. The Governor's director for behavioral health is charged, in coordination with the Governor's Commission, with:

- Coordinating of state resources, and to the extent possible local government and community partners -- to help treat mental health and substance abuse, and prevent substance abuse.
- Reducing unnecessary duplication of state efforts and resources.
- Coordinating state agency spending and budget proposals in the areas of mental health and substance abuse treatment and prevention.
- Identifying and spreading evidence-based treatment practices, and working with state agencies -- and to the extent possible local government and community partners -- to ensure quality delivery of such services.
- Identifying barriers -- and helping coordinate efforts to remove such barriers -- to success for people with mental illness or substance abuse disorders, including access to housing, employment or treatment.
- Identifying gaps in New Hampshire's systems of care, and recommending strategies to address those gaps.
- Helping develop a seamless and effective continuum of care for people of all ages suffering from mental illnesses or substance abuse disorders.
- Recommending changes in public policy to improve the treatment of people with mental illnesses and substance abuse disorders, and to prevent substance abuse.
- Leading efforts to apply for grants that may assist the state's efforts in treating mental health and substance abuse disorders.

REQUESTED ACTION

1. Pursuant to RSA 124:15, authorize the Office of the Governor to create a new non-classified position, Senior Behavioral Health Coordinator, within budget class 016, (Personal Services Non – classified) for the purpose of improving coordination of New Hampshire's substance use and other behavioral health policies to better combat substance misuse and to reduce long-term costs to the state, counties, local communities and business, effective upon the approvals of the Fiscal Committee of the General Court and Governor and Council through June 30, 2015.
2. Authorize the Office of the Governor to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$91,057 from the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation, Oliver J. and Dorothy Penniman Hubbard New Futures Fund, to support a Senior Behavioral Health Coordinator to be effective from the date of Governor and Executive Council approval through June 30, 2015.

Funds are to be budgeted in FY 2015 in the accounting unit entitled "Alcohol and Drug Abuse Grant" as follows:

EXPLANATION



The awarding of this grant was not anticipated at the time that the FY 2014-2015 Budget was being crafted necessitating this request for funding for the balance of FY 2015. Nor has a similar program of this type, and the position being considered to coordinate this program, been previously requested of the legislature. If the position of Senior Behavioral Health Coordinator meets the goals of better coordinating state efforts to improve efficiency and services, we anticipate seeking its continuance in the FY 2016-2017 budget with an estimated program cost of approximately \$150,000 in Fiscal Year 2016 and \$153,000 in FY 2017.
