#### **REQUESTED ACTION**

The Department of Cultural Resources, Division of the Arts, requests permission, to award a General Project Grant in the amount of \$2,250.00 to The Fells, Newbury, (vendor code 162231) effective upon Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2013. Federal funds are available in 01-34-341010-1255000-500575

#### **EXPLANATION**

At a recent meeting, the Arts Council Board unanimously voted to accept the Arts Division's review panel's recommendations for the General Project grants based on its funding priority ranking within a competitive review. The five-member peer panel, facilitated by an Arts Councilor, considered fourteen criteria to arrive at a consensus ranking for each application. Each panelist is advised, both individually and collectively, of their obligation to disclose any conflict of interest and themselves from assessment if a conflict is present. The evaluative criteria range from the quality of the programming and administrative capacity to the public value/community support of the project.

The General Project Grants category provides grants and services that are designed to help Main Street Programs, municipalities, not-for-profit organizations and schools bring arts presentations and activities into communities to enhance the quality of life for citizens, attract visitors and help stimulate local economies through the arts.

The Fells has received \$3,364.00 during fiscal year 2013.

The Fells is supported in part by a grant from the New Hampshire State Council on the Arts & the National Endowment for the Arts.

GRANTEE SIGNATURE

- The Grantee agrees to provide up to two (2) complimentary tickets/admissions as requested for site visits by appropriate Council staff/evaluators.
- The Grantee agrees to abide by the limitations, conditions and procedure outlined herein and in the attached appendices. If appropriated funds for this grants program are reduced or terminated, all payments under this grant may cease. That determination rests within the sole discretion of the Council.
- 3. **PAYMENT** will be made following the receipt and execution of all required documents and approval of the Governor and Executive Council
- 4. FINAL REPORT: The Grantee agrees to submit a final financial and narrative report on a form provided by the Council no more than 30 days after the end of the grant period. Failure to submit the final report will render the Grantee ineligible for Council funding for two years.
- 5. **SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY**: No provision of this contract is to be deemed a waiver of sovereign immunity by the State of New Hampshire.
