REQUESTED ACTION

That approval be and hereby is given to the Attorney General to grant a salary increase to Matthew G. Mavrogeorge, Assistant Attorney General Position #9U543 (Appropriation #02-20-20-200510-2611-013-500132) from a current salary of \$75,870.60 to a salary level of \$82,000 effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval or June 21, 2019, whichever is the latter.

EXPLANATION

Mr. Mavrogeorge is a resident of Manchester, New Hampshire and a member of the New Hampshire Bar. He received his law degree from Franklin Pierce Law Center in 2006. Mr. Mavrogeorge joined the Department of Justice in 2010 as an Attorney in the Civil Bureau. In January 2011, Mr. Mavrogeorge was appointed as an Assistant Attorney General. Mr. Mavrogeorge was reappointed as an Assistant Attorney General and was transferred to the Consumer Protection Bureau, Administrative Prosecutions Unit, where his skills and experience have been used as an administrative prosecutor for the State's professional licensing boards. In 2018, Mr. Mavrogeorge assumed the position of Director of the Administrative Prosecutions Unit. In light of his supervisory responsibilities and administrative duties, I am requesting that his salary increase by \$6,129.40 from \$75,870.60 to \$82,000.

RSA 94:1-a(I)(c)(3) provides that designation of positions, salary levels, and salary increases for attorneys at the Department of Justice shall be determined by the Attorney General, subject to approval of the Governor and Council, within appropriations made to the Department of Justice.
