EXPLANATION

The Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Community Based Care Services seeks approval to accept and expend Title IIID Preventive Health Grant funds in the amount of \$19,374 from the Administration On for Community Living. Aging. This request represents the first installment of the Federal Fiscal Year 2015 grant. A copy of the grant award is attached.

This funding from The Administration for Community Living supports a community-based dental program for adults ages 60 and older who are in significant need of dental care and do not have insurance coverage or resources to pay for it. BEAS and the Division of Public Health (DPHS) Oral Health Program have worked collaboratively to develop this program since 2012. DPHS has leveraged federal and other funding to support data collection on the oral health status of older adults, and a portion of BEAS' federal funding has supported the provision of dental services for individuals identified as being in significant need through DPHS data collection processes.

In the current biennium, DPHS has been collecting comprehensive data on the oral health status of older adults who participated in open mouth surveys at 25 senior center or congregate meal sites. Public Health dental hygienists, working under the auspices of the Oral Health Program, have used a specific assessment tool to identify individuals in highest need of urgent or imminent dental care. As individuals have been screened, those determined to be in highest need are being referred to one of the five participating dental clinics/practices contracted with BEAS to receive needed care and treatment.

The data that is being collected, followed by the treatment being rendered will further inform DPHS, BEAS, the NH Oral Health Coalition and dentists regarding the unmet oral health needs of older adults.

Class 041 The funds will be used to pay audit fund set aside expense.

Class 102 The funds will be used for provider contracts meeting the goals and objectives of the grant.

Should Governor and Executive Council determine not to approve this request, some individuals in significant need of dental care, without insurance coverage or the resources to pay for it, may either go without it, or may go to hospital emergency rooms, which treat pain and infection only and not the underlying causes.


