# REQUESTED ACTION

That approval be and hereby is given to the Attorney General to appoint Daniel E. Will, Position # 9U260, Appropriation # 02-20-200510-2610-013-500132 as an Assistant Attorney at a salary level of \$108,981.87 effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval or August 20, 2018, whichever is the latter.

## **EXPLANATION**

Earlier this year, the Legislature approved SB 390 which created the position of Solicitor General within the Attorney General's Office. This is a significant new role within our Office. The Solicitor General will serve as the Chief Legal Officer for the Department of Justice, and will oversee and coordinate appellate advocacy, a function that is now dispersed throughout the Office. The vast majority of Attorney General Offices have Solicitor Generals.

If this request is approved, I intend to designate Attorney Will as New Hampshire's first Solicitor General. He is exceptionally well qualified. Attorney Will is a resident of Loudon, and a member of the New Hampshire and Massachusetts Bars. He received his law degree from the Boston College Law School, summa cum laude in 1995, and his undergraduate degree from University of Pennsylvania, cum laude in 1989. He served as Editor-in-Chief for the Boston College Law Review, and is a member of the Order of the Coif, an academic honor based on exemplary achievement. He served as a judicial law clerk to the Honorable Morton A. Brody of the U.S. District Court for the District of Maine, and to the Honorable Norman H. Stahl of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the First Circuit.

Attorney Will is one of New Hampshire's most distinguished practitioners. He has worked at Devine Millimet & Branch of Manchester since 1997. He became a shareholder in 2003, and has been a hiring partner since 2006. He also has an exemplary record of service to the community and to the Bar.

In view of Attorney Will's experience, I am requesting he be appointed as an Assistant Attorney at a salary of \$108,981.87. A copy of his resume is attached.

2001 Laws of NH Chapter 158 amended RSA 94:1-a(I)(c)(3) to provide that designation of positions, salary levels, and salary increases for attorneys at the Department of Justice shall be determined by the Attorney General, subject to approval of the Governor and Council, within appropriations made to the Department of Justice.


