REQUESTED ACTION

That approval be and hereby is given to the Attorney General to appoint Jon-Daniel Lavallee (Position No. 9U225, Appropriation No. 02-20-20-200510-2613-013-500132) to a position where he will remain as an Assistant Attorney General at a salary of \$76,000.00, for a term ending August 31, 2025, upon Governor and Executive Council approval or September 11, 2020, whichever is later.

EXPLANATION

Mr. Lavallee is a resident of Henniker. He received his law degree from the University of Colorado Law School in May 2013. From January 2012 through July 2013, Mr. Lavallee worked as a student attorney there in the Getches-Green Natural Resources and Environmental Law Clinic. He was also a legislative aide to Senator Mike Johnston of Denver, Colorado, from January through April 2013. From January through June 2014, Mr. Lavallee worked as an energy policy intern at the New Hampshire Nature Conservancy. He was commissioned as a Lieutenant in the United States Coast Guard in July 2014, served on active duty until September 2018, and currently serves in the Coast Guard Reserve. Mr. Lavallee joined the Department of Justice in December 2018 as a client counselor in the Civil Bureau and was appointed as an Assistant Attorney General in December 2019. I will be assigning him to the Environmental Protection Bureau. His salary will not change. A copy of his resume is attached.

RSA 94:1-a(I)(c)(3) provides that designation of positions, salary levels, and salary increases for attorneys at the Department of Justice shall be determined by the Attorney General, subject to approval of the Governor and Council, within appropriations made to the Department of Justice.
