Requested Action

- 1. Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a VI, the Department of Safety, Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, requests authorization to accept and expend Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) funds in the amount of \$103,750.00 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for DR-4355 October Severe Storms and Flooding and DR-4371 March 2018 Severe Winter Storms for the implementation of cost effective mitigation projects. Effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approvals through June 30, 2021. Funding Source: 100% Federal Funds.
- 2. Pursuant to RSA 124:15, and contingent upon approval of Requested Action #1, authorize the Department of Safety, Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, to establish one (1) class 59 position temporary full-time Program Assistant I (Labor Grade 12) to assist with Hazard Mitigation Grant Program administration. Effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2021. Funding source: 100% Federal Funds.

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Explanation

This item funds a temporary full-time Program Assistant I position to assist HSEM with administering the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program to effectively aid communities through the funding and approval process for their mitigation projects in a timely manner. During the last three years, New Hampshire has had six declared disasters. This large number of disasters in such a short timeframe has greatly stressed HSEM's ability to administer the disaster grant programs. In addition, this position will assist with administering to New Hampshire communities FEMA's new pre-disaster mitigation grant program, Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC). This new nationwide federal program will focus on reducing the each state's risk during disasters by funding proactive public infrastructure projects that increase a community's resilience before a disaster affects an area.

FEMA provides HMGP funds to states following presidentially declared disasters where the FEMA Public Assistance Program is employed that, in turn, provide sub-grants or contracts for a variety of mitigation activities, such as planning and the implementation of projects identified through the evaluation of natural hazards. Mitigation projects may include, but are not limited to, property acquisitions, property elevations, localized flood risk reduction, and generators. The cost share is 75% Federal funds and a 25% applicant soft-match. The sub-grantee will provide and document the program match requirements. The management costs associated with the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program are 100% federal funds and do not require a matching percentage. The total amount of \$103,750.00 from FEMA consists of \$40,000.00 from DR-4355 October Severe Storms and Flooding and \$63,750.00 from and DR-4371 March 2018 Severe Winter Storms and provides funding to states and communities (sub-recipients) for cost-effective hazard mitigation activities.

The State of New Hampshire solicits applications statewide. Notification of the availability of HMGP funds is made to every community by e-mail and by letters sent to the chief elected official of each community. The State of New Hampshire submit all applications received for program funding to the Federal Emergency Management Agency for their final approval Applications that are determined to be cost effective and program eligible are then funded 75% by FEMA; not every application submitted is determined to be program eligible. However, all applications that are determined to be eligible are funded at the requested dollar amount listed in their application, pending availability of adequate program funding.

Funds will be budgeted as follows:

The funds in class 020, Current Expenses, will be used for supplies, materials, and operating expenses associated with administering disaster mitigation projects.

The funds in class 030, Equipment, will be used to purchase office equipment for the newly established position.

The funds in class 037, Technology-Hardware, will be used to purchase computer equipment for the new position.

The funds in class 038, Technology-Software, will be used to purchase software for the new position.

The funds in class 040, Indirect Costs, will be used to pay state indirect costs.

The funds class 041, Audit Set Aside, will be used to pay audit fund set aside expense.

The funds in class 050, Personal Service Temp, will be used to pay the salaries for existing temporary part-time positions.

The funds in class 059, Temp Full-Time, will be used to pay the salaries for one new full-time temp position.

The funds in class 060, Benefits, will be used to pay benefits costs associated with temporary personnel.

The funds in class 080, Out of State Travel, will be used to cover travel expenses associated with administering the program.

The following information is provided in accordance with the comptroller's instructional memorandum dated September 21, 1981.

- 1) List of personnel involved: one (1) new full-time temporary position titled Program Assistant I (Labor Grade 12).
- 2) Nature, Need, and Duration: This position is needed to assist the Department of Safety HSEM with Public Assistance grant administration. The proposed federal grant funding for this position expires on February 11, 2023.

- 3) Relationship to existing agency programs: This position will provide support to the Dept. of Safety HSEM with grant administration.
- 4) Has a similar program been requested of the legislature and denicd? No.
- 5) Why wasn't funding included in the agency's budget request? These funds were unanticipated at the time the budget was created.
- 6) Can portions of the grant funds be utilized? Grant funds are being utilized for the hiring of the Full-Time Temporary Program Assistant I position to assist the Department of Safety HSEM with grant administration.
- 7) Estimate the funds required to continue this position: Funds for this position are estimated at approximately \$68,000.00 through June 30, 2021.

There are no General funds required with this request. In the event that Federal funds are no longer available, General funds and/or Highway funds will not be requested to support this program.

The purpose of this letter is to provide you with the initial <u>30-day estimate</u> for the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program ("<u>HMGP</u>") funding ceiling and HMGP management cost funding ceiling for major disaster declaration FEMA-4457-DR-NH.

The Homeland Security and Emergency Management, New Hampshire Department of Public Safety ("Recipient") must meet the following requirements in order to receive an award for HMGP management costs. The Recipient, after meeting these requirements, may request up to 25% of the management cost estimate available for the Recipient, which is \$10,809.43.

(1) Administrative Plan. The Recipient must have an HMGP Administrative Plan approved by FEMA pursuant to 44 C.F.R. § 206.437 and FEMA Policy #104-11-1, Hazard Mitigation Grant Program Management Costs (Interim) (Nov. 14, 2018). If the Recipient has a HMGP Administrative Plan previously approved by FEMA under a prior declaration, it must revise its plan to incorporate updates in order to meet current policy

guidance or changes in administration of the HMGP and submit that revised plan to FEMA for approval.

- (2) <u>Application</u>. The Recipient must meet the application and submission requirements for management costs found in HMA Guidance (2015) Part JV.H.2. FEMA will not award any management costs unless the project or planning subapplication is approved.
- (3) <u>Costs.</u> All costs must be reasonable, allowable, allocable, and necessary as required by 2 C.F.R. Part 200 Subpart E, applicable program regulations, and the *Hazard Mitigation Assistance Guidance* (2015).

The Office of Chief Financial Officer will establish the HMGP funding ceiling for FEMA-4457-DR-NH at 12 months after the disaster declaration. Both the HMGP funding ceiling and HMGP management cost estimates provided before the 12-month lock-in are for planning purposes only and do not represent a minimum or floor amount. FEMA recommends, notwithstanding, that applicants develop and submit projects early in the application period. FEMA will review submitted projects and may award up to 75 percent of the HMGP estimate for approved projects before issuance of the 12-month lock-in.

After issuing the final 12-month HMGP lock-in, FEMA will withhold 3 percent of the Recipient management costs pending the Recipient's closeout of the last HMGP mitigation or planning project. Subrecipient management cost awards will be available to the Recipient at the time FEMA awards the project based on the mitigation or planning project amount; however, the subrecipient must apply for management costs and meet the application requirements found in the *Hazard Mitigation Assistance Guidance*, Part IV.H.2. For both Recipients and subrecipient management costs, FEMA will award funding in increments sufficient to cover documented eligible management costs for no more than one year unless contractual agreements require funding beyond the 1-year timeframe.

Under Section 404 of the Stafford Act, as amended, 75% Federal funding is authorized for hazard mitigation measures. As a condition of receiving Federal disaster assistance, measures must be cost-effective, environmentally acceptable and be consistent with the strategies and recommendations identified in your State Hazard Mitigation Plan. Funding for mitigation projects under the HMGP is based on 15% of the estimated aggregate amount of grants made under the Stafford Act. The 12-month final lock-in of \$1,056,081 in Federal funding is available for the HMGP under FEMA-4139-DR-NH. A breakdown of funding is listed below:
