REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 94:6, the Commissioner of the Department of Revenue Administration (DRA) respectfully requests to place Attorney Carollynn Ward at the maximum step for the position of Tax Policy Analyst, position # 9U609, unclassified salary grade FF, earning \$90,832.56, effective upon Governor & Council approval. Funding is 100% general funds.

EXPLANATION

On July 13, 2015, Governor Hassan signed into law SB 192 (Chapter 254, Laws of 2015) establishing RSA 21-J:6-d, creating the unclassified position of Tax Policy Analyst within the Department. Pursuant to SB 192, the existing unclassified tax policy analyst position (#9U431) is abolished, with the incumbent in the abolished position being offered the opportunity to seek the Commissioner's nomination for the newly created position.

The Department requests, pursuant to RSA 94:6, that the Governor and Council approve an entrance salary higher than the minimum salary within the established range for the unclassified position of Tax Policy Analyst, position # 9U609, within the Administration Unit, for Attorney Carollynn Ward. Attorney Ward was appointed to the position now being abolished on June 24th, 2015 (Item #106B).

Attorney Ward possesses a Juris Doctor from Roger Williams University School of Law and an LL.M. in Taxation from the Boston University School of Law. A Master of Laws in Taxation (LL.M. in Taxation) from BU Law reflects a mastery of the practice, ethics and subtleties of tax law. Since appointment as Tax Policy Analyst, Attorney Ward has coordinated all matters of legislative and tax policy assigned to the Department, advised the Department on matters relevant to state and federal tax statutes, rules, and administrative policies and procedures, and represented the Department before the General Court. Prior to appointment as Tax Policy Analyst, Attorney Ward held the position of Assistant Revenue Counsel at the Department. In that role she advised the Department on the potential legal impact of proposed changes to statutes and rules, actively participated in the Department's rulemaking process, and provided legal counsel for the Department before courts and administrative tribunals. Attorney Ward's work experience is a combination of tax, legal and legislative expertise has made her on of the Department's strongest assets. The highest classified subordinate employee under Attorney Ward earns \$86,365 annually.

Based upon Attorney Ward's education and experience, the Department believes that she should be placed into the Tax Policy Analyst position established in RSA 21-J:6-d by SB 192 (Chapter 254, Laws of 2015), unclassified grade FF at the maximum step, \$90,832.56.
