### **REQUESTED ACTION**

Authorize the Department of Information Technology, on behalf of the Department of Corrections (DOC), to enter into a sole source contract amendment (Contract #100842) with Kalos, Inc. (Vendor #170048), of Topeka, Kansas for the purpose of continuing to provide pharmacy software services within the NH Prison System by increasing the price limitation by \$127,896.21, from \$221,588.24 to \$349,484.45 and extending the completion date of the contract from June 30, 2020 to June 30, 2025 effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval. The original contract was approved by the Governor and Executive Council on November 15, 2006, Item # 10A, and most recently amended by the Governor and Executive Council on January 10, 2018, Item #29.

100% Other (Agency Class 27) funds: the Agency Class 027 used by the Department of Corrections to reimburse DolT is 100% General Funds. Funds are available as follows for State Fiscal Year 2021, and are anticipated to be available in State Fiscal Years 2022, 2023, 2024, and 2025, upon the continued appropriation of funds in future operating budgets with the authority to adjust encumbrances between fiscal years within the price limitation through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

### **EXPLANATION**

His Excellency, Governor Christopher T. Sununu and the Honorable Council Page 2

This amendment is sole source because the contractor has provided ongoing software support and maintenance for their proprietary software since procured through a competitive RFP process in November of 2006. No other company would be able to support this software application. This pharmacy software, CIPS™ (Correctional Pharmacy Software), is used to fill prescriptions, customize drug formularies, track controlled substances, monitor perpetual inventory, order history and costs, notify the DOC of patient-specific allergies and drug interactions and the integration of the DOC's electronic medical record system as required by generally accepted pharmaceutical practices and accreditation agencies.

As previously stated, the original contract was approved by the Governor and Executive Council on November 15, 2006, Item # 10A and subsequently amended on April 1, 2009, Item # 7, June 8, 2011, Item # 8, June 24, 2015, Item # 104, May 4, 2016, Item # 30, and on January 10, 2018, Item # 29.

The Division of Medical and Forensic Services is seeking an additional five (5) year amendment. Since the implementation of our electronic health care record, the Department has had discussions with potential vendors to provide an alternative pharmacy software system solution. At this time, the NHDOC has determined that the software development to interface between a new pharmacy software system and the Department's current EHR system would be cost prohibitive. Additionally, the Department is considering the purchase of new pharmacy workflow equipment that will further automate the Department's pharmacy services and is compatible with CIPS™ and TechCare™. From a cost-savings perspective, due to software development costs, potential errors and delays resulting in changing systems, the continuation of the Kalos contract is the Departments' most favorable option and ensures the continuity of patient care and avoidance of potential litigation regarding disruptions in the medication delivery process.

The Department of Information Technology respectfully requests approval of this contract.

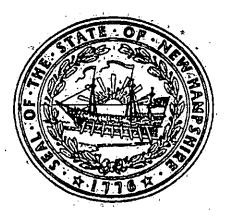

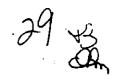

- 1) Authorize the Department of Information Technology, on behalf of the Department of Corrections (DOC), to enter into a sole source contract amendment (Encumbrance #100842) with Kalos, Inc. (Vendor #170048), of Topeka, Kansas, originally approved on November 15, 2006, Item # 10A and subsequently amended on April 1, 2009, Item # 7, and on June 8, 2011, Item # 8, and on June 24, 2015, Item # 104, and on May 4, 2016, Item # 30, increasing the contract amount by \$23,952.26, from \$197,635.98 to \$221,588.24, for the purpose of continuing to provide pharmacy software services within the NH Prison System.

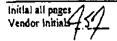

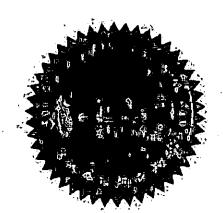

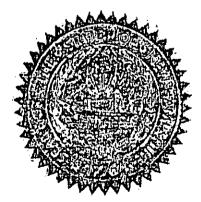

#### **EXPLANATION**

The amendment is sole source because there is no other vendor able to maintain this proprietary software. The State does not have funding to replace this system at this time and to do so would be premature since the current system is operating well and meeting the Department's business needs.

This amendment is to provide ongoing software support and maintenance for the Kalos pharmacy software system called "CIPS" (Correctional Institution Pharmacy System), procured through a competitive RFP process in November of 2006. The New Hampshire Department of Corrections fills approximately 17,000 prescriptions monthly, servicing 1,700 inmates from a central pharmacy. The inmates are housed in four facilities across the state, including outpatient and inpatient services, as well as a psychiatric unit. Pharmacy software is used to fill prescriptions, keep a record/history of those prescriptions, track controlled substances, monitor costs, screen for drug interactions and allergies, and provide the records and histories as required by generally accepted pharmaceutical practices and accreditation agencies. The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on November 15, 2006, Item Number 10A, and subsequently amended on April 1, 2009, Item Number 7 and on June 8, 2011, Item Number 8.

It is critical that the State maintain a functional pharmacy management system supporting the prison system. The consequences of not maintaining this system could result in the violation of the Laaman Decree and the Holliday Decision, which demands the timely delivery of the appropriate medications. The Department of Corrections is required by law to provide correct medication to inmates in an appropriate timeframe. Failure to comply will result in wasted medications through expiration and untimely delivery. Examples of critical medications include illness involving heart and seizure conditions. The impact of missing these medications could lead to hospitalization and a reluctance of contracted licensed medical practitioners to work with DOC because of fear of malpractice.

The Department of Information Technology respectfully requests approval of this contract.

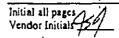

### **EXPLANATION**

This amendment is to provide ongoing software support and maintenance for the Kalos pharmacy software system, procured through a competitive RFP process in November of 2006. The New Hampshire Department of Corrections fills approximately 550 prescriptions daily, servicing 2,700 inmates from a central pharmacy. The inmates are housed in four facilities across the state, including outpatient and inpatient services, as well as a psychiatric unit. Pharmacy software is used to fill prescriptions, keep a record/history of those prescriptions, track controlled substances, monitor costs, screen for drug interactions and altergies, and provide the records and histories as required by generally accepted pharmaceutical practices and accreditation agencies.

The amendment is sole source because there is no other vendor able to maintain this proprietary software. The State does not have funding to replace this system at this time and to do so would be premature since the current system is operating well and meeting the Department's business needs.

It is critical that the State maintain a functional pharmacy management system supporting the prison system. The consequences of not maintaining this system could result in the violation of the Laaman Decree and the Holliday Decision, which demands the timely delivery of the appropriate medications. The Department of Corrections is required by law to provide correct medication to inmates in an appropriate timeframe. Failure to comply will result in wasted medications through expiration and untimely delivery. Examples of critical medications include illness involving heart and seizure conditions. The impact of missing these medications could lead to hospitalization and a reluctance of contracted licensed medical practitioners to work with DOC because of fear of malpractice.

The Department of Information Technology respectfully requests approval of this contract.

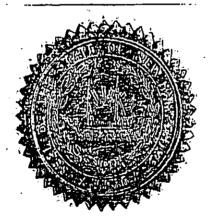

## **EXPLANATION**

This amendment is to provide funding for the required unanticipated software changes required for the Kalos pharmacy software system. During the June 2008 computer conversion from the Automated Prison System (APS) to the Corrections Information Management System (CORIS), it was discovered that inmate demographic data, required by the Kalos pharmaceutical software system, could not be obtained electronically from the CORIS software system unless the Kalos system was modified.

The vendor (Kalos) completed the work which was identified as critical. An error occurred in authorizing the work to Kalos. Due to the oversight, the billing invoice was not expected. Additionally, the invoice did not follow the established payment authorization procedure. The invoice was received after the start of FY 2009, preventing the State from utilizing FY 2008 funds. The error has been addressed and will not be repeated.

The consequences of not completing this work could have resulted in the violation of the Laaman Decree and the Holliday Decision which demand the timely delivery of the appropriate medications. The Department of Corrections is required by law to provide correct medication to inmates in an appropriate timeframe. Failure to comply will result in wasted medications through expiration and untimely delivery. Examples of critical medications include illness involving heart and seizure conditions. The impact of missing these medications could lead to hospitalization and a reluctance of contracted licensed medical practitioners to work with DOC because of fear of malpractice.

The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on November 15, 2006, item 10A.

The Department of Information Technology has reviewed and approved the request for this contract amendment and we respectfully request your approval.

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### Explanation

The New Hampshire Department of Corrections fills approximately 422 prescriptions daily, servicing 2,500 immates from a central pharmacy. The inmates are housed in four facilities across the state, including outpatient and inpatient services, as well as a psychiatric unit. The pharmacy distribution system consists of a combination of keep-on-person, bubble packed (meds that are officer stored and/or self administered), and nurse administered medications.

Pharmacy software is used to fill prescriptions, keep a record/history of those prescriptions, track controlled substances, monitor costs, screen for drug interactions and allergies, and provide the records and histories as required by accreditation agencies. Without computer applications, a pharmacy cannot efficiently function within legal and safety parameters. Different types of pharmacies (retail, hospital, nursing home and prison) have different legal and facility-specific software requirements. Accordingly, a prison pharmacy has its own unique set of requirements.

The Department of Corrections Men's Pharmacy purchased ScriptMaster, a pharmaceutical software, which was developed in 1983, from Viking Computer Services, St. Louis, MO. Subsequently, Viking became a wholly owned subsidiary of D&K Healthcare Resources Inc., Broomfield, Colorado. In July 2005, D&K signed a definitive agreement to be acquired by McKesson Corporation, Livonia, MI. D&K is now a part of McKesson's U.S. Pharmaceutical business. McKesson has provided DOC with maintenance on the ScriptMaster system. McKesson will no longer provide maintenance after December 31, 2006. Without application support, the State pharmacist will not have access to an accurate drug database from which to process prescriptions.

In December 2006, the pharmacy staff reviewed the Internet and the "Computertalk for the Pharmacist" annual buyers' guide. This guide provides pharmacists with information on computer systems and other products for health care markets. This search resulted in the state contacting forty-two (42) potential software providers. Twenty-four (24) companies responded to our inquiry regarding the procurement of a pharmacy system. Eleven (11) respondents were pharmacy software vendors. Of the eleven (11), the state reviewed nine (9) systems via the computer or via teleconference and two (2) vendors provided onsite presentations. Of the eleven potential vendors, four (4) applications utilized Microsoft SQL, which is the current platform, utilized at the DOC prison environment; and nine (9) vendors had their application running in either a prison or nursing home/long-term care environment.

In June 2006, RFP 2006-113 NH Men's Pharmacy System was released. An email with the RFP's URL was sent to the eleven (11) pharmacy software vendors. The State Pharmacist telephoned and e-mailed each company seeking proposals. The RFP was posted on the Purchase and Property's web site and advertised in the newspaper. One company attended the vendor conference for an explanation of the RFP. Kalos Inc. was the only company that submitted a proposal. Based upon an objective evaluation team, it was determined that Kalos offers a software solution per the RFP specifications.
