### **Requested Action**

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, the Department of Safety, Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM), requests authorization to accept and expend major Disaster Assistance funds in the amount of \$2,057.00 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). These funds are related to Tropical Storm Irene. Effective upon Governor and Council approvals through September 15, 2018. Funding source: 100% Federal Funds.

Funds will be budgeted in an account titled Tropical Storm Irene DR-4026:

### Explanation

This request is to accept and expend \$2,057.00 in major disaster funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency. These funds are related to Tropical Storm Irene and represent the federal share of the public assistance and administrative cost allowances for the grantee and sub-grantees. This amount will allow HSEM to close out this disaster.

On September 2, 2011, Governor Lynch submitted a request to the President for a major disaster declaration in Carroll, Coos, Grafton, and Merrimack counties due to a severe weather event, with an incident period from August 26, 2011 to September 6, 2011, which involved flooding and flash flooding. The President declared the State of New Hampshire a major disaster area on September 3, 2011 and designated Carroll, Coos, Grafton, and Merrimack counties eligible to receive public assistance.

The funding mechanism is 75% Federal/25% State/Local share. The 25% required match for State Agency projects will be paid from existing budgeted appropriations or an additional request for these funds will be made through the State Legislature. The local share is the responsibility of the local applicant. The administrative cost allowance is 100% federally funded and is

awarded as a percentage of the public assistance project awards, if requested. Indirect costs are budgeted based only on the Grantee Administration portion of the funds, as all other funds are considered pass-through funds and are not subject to indirect costs.

The funds will be budgeted as follows:

| Class 040 | The funds will be used to pay state indirect costs.                                      |

There are no General funds required with this request. In the event that Federal funds are no longer available, General funds and/or Highway funds will not be requested to support this program.

Dear Ms. Tessier:

This letter responds to the March 28, 2018 email request from the New Hampshire Department of Safety Homeland Security and Emergency Management ("Grantee"), for the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") to extend the liquidation period for the Public Assistance grant under major disaster declaration FEMA-4026-DR-NH. The Grantee failed to liquidate all obligations under the grant and submit its Final Federal Financial Report ("FFR") by the deadline of March 27, 2018 in violation of 44 C.F.R. §§ 13.23, 13.50 and the FEMA-State Agreement. In its extension request the Grantee informed FEMA that nine payments had inadvertently not been disbursed to applicants and the return of excess funds disbursed has been requested of two applicants. NH discovered these oversights during the reconciliation of the Smart Link account. The Grantee has requested an extension until September 15, 2018.

I am approving a new deadline of September 15, 2018, for the Grantee to liquidate all obligations and also to submit the final FFR for the Public Assistance grant for FEMA-4026-DR. If the Grantee fails to take these actions by that date, FEMA may pursue an enforcement remedy pursuant to 44 C.F.R. § 13.43, which could include termination of the grant award and disallowance of costs.
