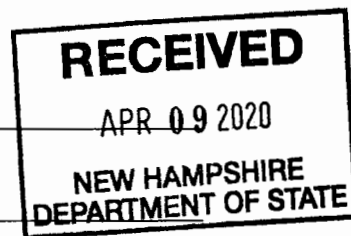

As a State Delegate for the Symposium 6 Conference, I am writing today to give you some direction on how to go about arranging your transportation and to outline what Vision 20/20 will pay for.

Direct Travel (DT) is the agency we use to arrange air travel. I have given them your contact information. Please call, **781-326-7800, choose option 2**. They will ask you to complete a reservation request form in order to proceed with your arrangements. Here are some parameters to follow:

- Participants need to arrive in Murfreesboro, TN on the February 17, 2020 (anytime) and book a flight to depart from Nashville any time after 3 pm on February 20, 2020. *(If you plan to arrive early or depart later than the conference, at your own expense, you must check with the hotel for availability prior to booking your ticket.)*
- Flights are to be booked in and out of Nashville, TN, airport code BNA.
- If you need to leave early, before the symposium ends at 1 pm, please get clearance from me before you make your reservations.
- DT will work with you to find the most direct, cost effective route. They will send you an itinerary to review and approve prior to issuing your tickets. You **must** give approval of your itinerary in order for them to issue the ticket, which **must be purchased no later than JANUARY 15, 2020, and cannot be changed once ticketed**.

VISION 20/20 will pay for:

- Airport parking
- Ground Transportation to get to and from the airport.
- Airfare (or mileage reimbursement if you are driving to the conference and that amount is less than airfare)
- Lodging for the days of the conference
- Meals at the symposium only - (Breakfast included at hotel, lunches at symposium) No meals in transit or dinners
- You will need to save your receipts and submit them to Vision 20/20, for reimbursement, on a form that I will send to you at the conclusion of the conference.

GROUND TRANSPORTATION – Nashville Airport to Embassy Suites, 1200 Conference Center Blvd, Murfreesboro, TN 37129

To date I have only been able to find UBER AND LYFT as transportation options to and from the hotel. If you don't already have the apps on your phone, they are easy to download. If you need more information about this mode of transportation and these companies go to www.uber.com and www.lyft.com .
